

We All Have A Role to Play in Bridging the Digital Divide

The pandemic put a spotlight on the digital divide in our nation. The divide between the “haves” and “have nots” of technology (access, tools, and training) wasn’t new, but the contrast was suddenly stark when education, healthcare, and jobs quickly moved online.

The digital divide is often considered to be a matter of connectivity but the issue is much broader. There needs to be equal access to broadband connectivity and education to know why it matters and the hardware and skills to make leveraging online resources a reality. This inequality in digital content requires people and companies across sectors to be aware and engaged in solutions.

Beyond those larger issues, digital content is not easily accessible to everyone. For starters, 60% of content is in English despite only 17% of the world’s population speaking English. Many cultures don’t allow women access to education; they’re certainly not accessing all the tools and content available online. Specialized training is needed for those with disabilities to access online resources, and it’s hard to come by.

Lack of access to broadband internet and devices and insufficient training and education, has created a divide that isolates broad swaths of the population. This has pressing social and economic consequences.

Education precedes access

According to Census Bureau data, about 81% of rural households are plugged into broadband, compared with about 86% in urban areas. Interestingly, the number of urban households without a connection (13.6 million) is almost three times as many as the 4.6 million rural households that don’t have high-speed connectivity. In other words, for every rural household that is not connected, three urban households do not connect to high-speed data networks, despite availability.

Extending high-speed networks into the rural reaches of the nation is a common topic of discussion. While it’s an important and laudable goal with a lot of support behind it, the issue of connectivity is more complex than availability. Many non-subscribers don’t understand what they might gain from connecting to online resources or have the financial means to purchase the requisite hardware and pay for a broadband subscription.

San Francisco Awards First-Ever Climate Action Plan Community Grants

Mayor London N. Breed announced that the City will award over \$900,000 in grant funding to projects that support San Francisco’s Climate Action Plan and its goal of achieving net zero greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by 2040. The funding, the first coordinated package of climate grants from the San Francisco Environment Department (SF Environment), establishes the City as one of the first in the nation to offer a comprehensive plan that

increases community capacity and participation in building electrification, urban greening, composting, waste and toxics reduction, environmental justice, and youth development.

“In San Francisco, our work to address climate change and to create a healthier, low-carbon future requires partnerships with the community and the private sector,” says Mayor Breed. “These grants will help us move our Climate Action Plan forward while engaging our residents and local organizations to be part of the solution.”

Every year, SF Environment partners with more than a dozen local organizations that lead on zero waste and educational programs, including composting, recycling, and source reduction. With the City increasing focus on zero-emission buildings, climate grant projects dedicated to emissions reduction and building decarbonization were added to the grant collaborative this year.

The nine projects selected for funding in this first round and approved by the Commission on the Environment last week, emphasized meaningful community partnerships to mitigate and overcome sustainability challenges in our urban landscape. They also provide unique workforce and youth development opportunities that focus on climate action through an equity and environmental justice lens.

“The climate grants establish community partnerships to advance equitable climate initiatives throughout San Francisco’s diverse communities,” said Tyrone Jue, Acting Director for SF Environment. “Community climate action is an essential strategy required to unlock the positive

and equitable economic and health outcomes that will be realized through the implementation of our bold climate goals.”

“These are great community organizations doing great climate action work. It’s exciting to see them being recognized for that work and to see their projects elevated in this way,” said District 8 Supervisor Rafael Mandelman, who in 2019 authored the City’s Climate Emergency Declaration and has worked closely with environmental justice groups on implementing San Francisco’s Climate Action Plan.

The first round of awards covers five of the seven total grant categories first announced in October of 2022. The remaining grants are expected to be awarded in the coming months. Administered by SF Environment, the following organizations have been awarded grants that will advance the City’s climate action goals from 2023-2025

Building Towards Equity: Our 2023-24 California Legislative Agenda

From the worsening climate crisis, to the rise of AI-driven decision-making, California is at the forefront of some of the most pressing challenges the world faces today. As we enter the first year of a two year legislative cycle, we are ready to meet these challenges head-on.

Our legislative work in California and beyond is future-focused — the policies we pass are the building blocks of transformative changes that will ultimately lead us to a more equitable system.

Instead of focusing on how policy can inflict the least amount of harm, we demand policies that create tangible benefits for communities of color. We demand policies that acknowledge the legacies of harm in California and beyond, and intentionally seek to reverse that harm. We demand greenlined policies.

California consistently serves as a leading example of influential, progressive decision-making, setting an example for the rest of the nation on what equitable policy can look like. When it comes to Greenlining's state-level policy work, we take California's role as leader seriously. We invite legislators to join us in this work.

2023-24 Co-Sponsored Legislation

Each of our co-sponsored bills serve a critical purpose in ensuring California's systems and institutions offer transparency, accountability, commitment, and access to communities of color, low-income communities, and communities that have been historically ignored or marginalized by state policies. These bills are the building blocks for an abundant future and will move us towards more equitable solutions to the immense issues we face today, and beyond.

Assembly Bill 302 (Assemblymember Chris Ward) – State ADS Inventory Act

California's institutions increasingly rely on automated decision systems to make critical determinations that impact our day-to-day lives. This includes decisions – made by algorithms

and artificial intelligence – about who can access social safety net programs, who gets parole, and how to collect taxes.

This technology has the potential to improve efficiency, accuracy, and transparency. However, these systems are still new and evolving, and can have deficiencies that lead to unfair, biased, and inaccurate results, causing disproportionate harm to low-income families and communities of color while also undermining trust in the public sector.

AB 302 authorizes the California Department of Technology to conduct a comprehensive inventory of all high-risk Automated Decision Systems used by state agencies. The inventory will identify the decisions these systems make or support, the potential benefits of these systems and the measures taken to reduce the risk of inaccurate, unfairly discriminatory, or biased automated decisions. State agencies, elected officials, and Californians need this information to understand the benefits and risks of government ADS and to provide proper oversight over these critical systems.

Senate Bill 253 (Senator Scott Wiener) – Climate Corporate Data Accountability Act

Corporate emissions contribute to over-polluted communities and deadly climate outcomes from harsher wildfire seasons to historic storms and floods. The worst of these impacts disproportionately fall on communities of color and low-income communities.

SB 253, The Climate Corporate Data Accountability Act, requires US-based corporations with operations in California and annual gross revenue of \$1 billion USD or greater to disclose their full greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions footprint to the public. Research has found that corporations have an outsized impact on our climate due to excessive GHG emissions. The disclosure required by SB 253 allows the public to hold corporations accountable for their role in the climate crisis.

With The Climate Corporate Data Accountability Act, California would be the first state in the nation to demand climate pollution transparency, recognize the right of communities to know how and if corporations are working to reduce their

emissions, and address the importance of verifying corporate claims of sustainable leadership.

Assembly Bill 1525 (Assemblymember Mia Bonta) – Equity Carve Out for Transportation Funding

Communities of color disproportionately face exposure to transportation-related air pollution, longer commute times, and a lack of access to safe infrastructure and reliable mobility options due to decades of deliberate discrimination and systemic disinvestment. While the State's transportation agencies have put forth a range of equity initiatives, the persistence of harmful development and inadequate investment in California's low-income communities and communities of color signal a need for greater reform.

AB 1525, The Equity First Transportation Funding Act, requires that a minimum of 60 percent of all eligible transportation dollars be allocated to projects that are located in and provide benefits to "disadvantaged" communities, as defined by the State. The Act would also require that all proposed projects are evaluated to ensure they provide benefits and avoid harms in disadvantaged communities. This bill will help ensure that crucial investments flow to communities with the greatest needs, while the evaluation process is designed to protect communities from further harm.

California's existing climate programs, like the Active Transportation Program, demonstrate the power and potential of establishing equity targets and a project evaluation process, but the absence of a clear, uniform mandate across the transportation sector limits California's ability to meet our climate and equity goals. AB 1525 can help the state begin to repair the harms of our transportation system's impact on communities of color.

Assembly Bill 591 (Assemblymember Jesse Gabriel) – Electric Vehicle Charging for All Act

Communities of color and low-income communities disproportionately bear the consequences of climate change, yet have been the last to benefit from California's clean transportation transition. This is driven by deliberate disinvestment resulting in a lack of infrastructure in the areas they live and work. Not only are these com-

munities isolated from the health and economic benefits of clean transportation, but they also tend to live in the most polluted neighborhoods with the fewest mobility options leading to an overreliance on gas-powered vehicles and worse pollution-related health outcomes.

AB 591, The Electric Vehicle Charging for All Act, requires that all electric vehicle charging stations must be accessible to all electric vehicles. This bill ensures that California's charging infrastructure functions with all EV models, and not just luxury EVs that are out of reach of the majority of Californians. The Electric Vehicle Charging for All Act, is an opportunity for California to make electric mobility more accessible and ensure EV infrastructure is available to everyone in the state.

2023-24 California Budget Priorities

Governor Newsom's 2023-24 California January Budget proposal previewed a rocky road ahead due to lower-than-anticipated state revenues and ongoing economic uncertainty as the threat of a recession grows. California currently faces a \$22.5 billion deficit, in stark contrast to the state's historic \$100 billion surplus last year.

As we have for the past three decades, The Greenlining Institute will continue to fight for initiatives that build resilience through economic shortfalls and instability.

We All Have A Role to Play in Bridging the Digital Divide

Lack of digital literacy leaves people unsure of the value of digital access, the vast resources available online, and how to access them.

The divide in construction

As an industry, construction has work to do to close the digital divide within its ranks. While the pandemic helped usher in new tools and technologies for collaborating safely, despite social distancing requirements, construction is generally considered to be one of the least digitized industries in our economy, behind agriculture and hunting. This is likely a function of digital literacy among aging members of our industry.

According to Go Build America, the average age of a tradesman is 47. The more senior construction workers have managed projects without the benefit of technology and the internet, while younger employees have grown up using technology at home and in their education. This younger generation will likely turn the tide, bringing technology and digitization into every aspect of construction workflows.

Public-private partnership

Public-private partnerships are critical to bridging the divide. While the public sector works to remove barriers to network development and create policies that support enhanced digital literacy, the private sector works on the grassroots level to bring tools and education to underserved populations.



The Federal Communications Commission's Affordable Connectivity program is one of the largest public-private efforts to improve broadband access to rural and other high-cost-to-access areas. The long-standing Lifeline program, founded in 1985 to make sure American households had a landline phone for safety purposes, now works to provide discounted broadband service.

In November 2021, public sector efforts to invest in broadband networks got a big boost when President Biden signed the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) into law, a massive step toward more equitable internet access. The Broadband Equity, Access, and Development Program allocated \$42 billion for greater broadband deployment.

The first step in expanding broadband deployments using IIJA funding was the FCC's rescoping and release of a new National Broadband Map with detailed information about broadband availability throughout the country. That was released in November, and now a public com-

ment period is underway to determine specific, local-level needs and allocation of funds for the construction of additional broadband capacity.

Each state is allocated at least \$100 million, possibly more, depending on the outcome of the complete needs assessment for the construction, improvement, or acquisition of infrastructure in underserved areas. Building, connecting, and maintaining that infrastructure involves permitting and easements, networking and siting wireless facilities. It will no doubt be a long process.

As funding slowly flows from federal and local government coffers to support network development, the private sector has an important role to play in supporting the effort to shrink the divide through constructing new networks, educating employees, and getting involved at the grassroots level to help access and drive awareness of the issue.

or one, Infrastructure Masons, or iMasons as those of us in the digital infrastructure industry know it, is engaged in closing the digital

gap through its Digital Infrastructure Futures Foundation (DIFF), which works to accelerate the adoption and use of digital infrastructure by increasing education and access opportunities for underrepresented communities. As a 501c3, DIFF is eligible for employee giving programs and employer match for employee donations.

Impact of closing the divide

Bridging the digital divide is up to all of us, and we all benefit from equal access to online resources. Studies show that digitally equipped people contribute substantially to the economy. According to research from Broadband Now, providing technology and connectivity to 2 million people (of the 40-160 million who lack access) translates into a 1.2% bump in GDP, or a \$4.8 billion increase. Imagine the implications on a global scale!

We live in a technology-dependent world. The internet is no longer a "nice to have." It's a have-to-have.

Most of us regularly access and engage important services and content online, from library books to medical records. It's imperative for students, working adults, and even seniors to be connected in this day and age. Getting involved in closing the digital divide is one way to be a part of the discussion, demonstrate the high-tech nature of the construction industry, and ensure that all people, organizations, and groups have the access they need to thrive.

San Francisco Launches Free Tax Preparation Assistance and Local Tax Credit Program

Mayor London N. Breed and the San Francisco Human Services Agency (SFHSA) announced that assistance is available to help eligible San Franciscans with incomes of \$60,000 and below file their taxes and apply for the San Francisco Working Families Credit (WFC), as well as other tax credits that could help individuals receive hundreds, or even thousands of dollars, in tax credits and refunds.

San Francisco working families continue to face financial challenges due to the current economic climate and the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. The WFC offers low and moderate-income households with children a local tax credit of up to \$250 to help cover day-to-day expenses such as utilities, rent, food, and childcare.

"A lot of people that were impacted by the pandemic are still struggling to make ends meet because of rising costs of living and our economy," said Mayor London Breed. "San Francisco's free tax prep service not only helps eligible individuals file their taxes at no cost, but it also helps families apply for other refunds and tax credits, like the Working Families Credit, which can make a real difference for families trying to stretch their dollars to the end of the month."

Undocumented and mixed-status immigrant households who pay taxes but only have an Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) are encouraged to file taxes to get the refunds that are available to them. Importantly, the California Earned Income Tax Credit and the WFC are both available to taxpayers filing with an ITIN, providing sources of hard-earned financial assistance that often sits unclaimed.

Millions of Californians do not file their taxes, and therefore, do not get their tax credits and refunds each year, leaving billions of dollars unclaimed. However, tax credits and refunds can provide life-changing monetary resources: working families could get back as much as \$9,600 by applying for all credits available to them. Even individuals and families with no income are encouraged to file their taxes, because there are some financial assistance payments that can only be received through tax filing.

"These days, especially in this economic environment, every extra dollar helps," said Trent Rhorer, SFHSA Executive Director. "Our clients and many community members aren't required to file their taxes—but they have a great deal to gain if they do file. Tax credits are one of the largest and most effective anti-poverty programs in the nation. We're urging San Franciscans with incomes under \$60,000 to come to our offices or other free tax sites around the City for help with filing their taxes, to claim the refunds owed them."

Free Tax Assistance

To make it easier for San Franciscans to file their taxes, free tax assistance is available at dozens of San Francisco neighborhood locations in partnership with the United Way Bay Area, Mission Economic Development Association, Arriba Juntos, and several other local organizations.
