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Why Women in Construction Are Celebrating

Long viewed as a male-dominated field, the construction industry has slowly been adding more and more women to their offices and job-sites as they fill roles as varied as construction technologists to painters.

As a result, this year's Women in Construction Week (March 7-13th) offers lots of great things for the whole industry to celebrate—from more opportunities for women to a smaller gender pay gap.

While women make up only 10.3% of the construction workforce, the 1.1 million women employed in construction continue to gain ground every year, according to the National Association of Women in Construction (NAWIC).

As jobs and construction activity begin to slowly return to normal this year and into 2022, JLL is also forecasting the industry will add more than 2 million new jobs. This means more construction-related companies are expected to recruit more women than ever to the construction field.

Let's look at a few more reasons women are celebrating this week.

Security in a She-Cession

The COVID-19 pandemic has led to five million women losing or leaving their jobs with some dubbing this downturn the "She-Cession." In January alone, some 275,000 women vs. 71,000 men left the workforce, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Admittedly, the pandemic has put many women in a tough spot. They've had to choose between caring for children at home and staying in the workforce—as daycares shut down and schools went virtual. For some, they are having to rethink their career choices entirely.

For example, women working in the food and bar industry and retail have been particularly hard hit. In retail, where about half of the workers are women, 383,000 jobs have been lost since February 2020, according to McKinsey & Company,

There is probably no better time for women to consider a career in construction. Workforce shortages are a constant concern and new talent will be needed to rebuild the economy and the crumbling U.S. infrastructure.

For example, the Associated Builders and Contractors Illinois (ABCIL) notes that in Illinois alone there is a need for more than 200,000 skilled craft professionals. Worth noting – the annual salary for a craft laborer there is \$60,500 and \$66,720 for a carpenter.

Higher Paying Jobs

Average hourly earnings in construction first began to exceed \$30 an hour in 2019. Typically, wages and salaries in construction are 10% higher than private-sector wages, according to the Associated General Contractors of America (AGC). Wages in construction have a history of outpacing and rising faster than other sectors.

In fact, a recent Smart Asset study using data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics showed that the construction jobs popular with women have salaries ranging from \$68,000 for laborers and painters to \$156,000 for construction managers.

In 2015, only one in 15 workers held three of the top 10 fastest-growing jobs for women in construction. These occupations include construction managers, construction and maintenance painters, and construction laborers. All three roles saw increases of more than 50% in female workers from 2015 to 2019, even though they remain male-dominated.

Of those more than 1.1 million women in construction, here is a breakdown of the different career paths and roles women, according to the NAWIC:

- 28% - Sales and office roles
- 44% - Professional and management
- 1% - Natural resources, construction, and maintenance

- 21.1% - Service occupations
- 5.9% - Production, transportation, and material moving

More Opportunities for Advancement

When it comes to the front lines of the construction industry, only 1 in every 100 employees in the field are women. However, the Smart Asset study found that the number of women with the title construction manager increased by 101% between 2015 and 2019—growing to nearly 100,000. This makes it the third fastest-growing job for women overall.

There has also been a 64% increase in the number of women working as construction and maintenance painters, as well as a 50% increase in construction laborers.

Although men hold most leadership roles in the construction industry, there's evidence that having women in leadership roles can have a beneficial impact on any company. Though women own only around 13% of construction firms, 9% of those firms achieve revenues of over \$500,000 or more. Such statistics prove the point that women in leadership roles can have a significant impact on the profitability of any construction business. In fact, 4% of all new construction firms were female owned in 2018.

Smaller Gender Pay Gap

Interestingly, the construction industry supports gender equality more than most other industries. For example, women in the construction industry earn about 95 cents for every dollar a man earns when compared to the average 80 cents for every dollar a woman earns in other industries. Specifically, women in the construction industry make an average

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SB 17 Would Create The California Office of Racial Equity

In the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic bringing racial inequities in California and throughout the U.S. into sharp relief, the California Legislature is considering a systematic approach to curbing racial inequity via SB 17, introduced in the California Senate by Dr. Richard Pan (D-Sacramento). SB 17, which has now been referred to the Governmental Organization Committee and the Judiciary Committee, builds on the commitment Gov. Gavin Newsom made Tuesday night in his State of the State speech: “When this pandemic ends – and it will end soon – we’re not going back to normal. Normal was never good enough. Normal accepts inequity.”

SB 17 would declare racism a public health crisis and create a state Office of Racial Equity and a Racial Equity Advisory and Accountability Council. These new bodies would be tasked with developing a statewide racial equity framework and concrete strategies for addressing racial inequity across state government.

Data from Advancement Project California’s RACE COUNTS initiative shows that low-income and people of color are less likely to have access to early childhood education programs, have health insurance, own a home, vote, and feel safe in their neighborhood. According to state data, Latino, African American and Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander Californians have suffered disproportionately high rates of COVID-19 deaths. SB 17’s supporters believe the state can and must play a more active role in dismantling racial inequities, particularly those exacerbated by the coronavirus.

If SB 17 is enacted, the Office of Racial Equity and the Racial Equity Advisory and Accountability Council will:

- Identify existing policies and practices in the state that contribute to, uphold, or exacerbate racial disparities and develop proposals to address these disparities, to be recommended to the Governor’s Office and Legislature.
- Analyze, develop, evaluate, report on and recommend strategies for advancing racial equity across state agencies, departments and the Office of the Governor.
- Create and provide a Racial Equity Framework for the state and direct agency Secretaries to develop, adopt and implement Racial Equity Action Plans.



- Create a budget equity assessment tool to determine whether budget requests and annual allocations benefit or burden communities of color.

SB 17’s principal co-authors are Assemblymembers Joaquin Arambula (D-Fresno) and David Chiu (D-San Francisco). Additional co-authors are Senators Dave Cortese (D-San Jose), María Elena Durazo (D-Los Angeles) and Lena Gonzalez (D-Long Beach) and Assemblymember Robert Rivas (D-Hollister).

“Extensive research has identified racism as a public health crisis leading to significant health disparities, including infant and maternal mortality, chronic diseases prevalence, life expectancy and now COVID mortality,” said Dr. Richard Pan. “The state needs an independent body to hold us accountable by examining California’s policies and budget with the goal of achieving racial equity and ending systemic racism.”

“These inequities didn’t just happen by chance, they resulted from policy choices – some deliberate, some inadvertent – and they won’t fix themselves automatically,” said Alvaro Sanchez, Vice President of Policy at The Greenlining Institute. “To address structural racism, it has to be someone’s job to identify it and develop concrete strategies to change it.”

“All of the racial inequities we’ve seen in this pandemic have been decades in the making. We can no longer react to the symptoms of systematic racism or nibble around the policy edges,” said John Kim, Executive Director of Advancement Project California. “Passing SB 17 and establishing a State level Office of Racial Equity is crucial to excavating the intersectional nature of structural racism baked into this state’s public systems and policies. A fully resourced and appropriately authorized office is a powerful mechanism not only to stem the tide of bad, racist policies but also to generate new pathways to close the opportunity gap for communities of color throughout the state.”

“State government has a responsibility to address the systemic impacts of institutional racism on the people who call California home,” said Arnold Sowell Jr., Executive Director of NextGen California. “The COVID-19 pandemic has affected people of color at alarmingly high rates and brought to light decades of structural racism embedded in various policies and programs within the systems of government. SB 17 proposes an important and meaningful solution to address these inequities and will put California farther down the path towards an equitable California for all.”

DeAngelo Mack, Director of State Policy for Public Health Advocates said, “The disproportionate harms caused by racism are undeniable. Its negative effects permeate throughout all California systems. Intentional focus at every level of government is necessary to undo centuries of inequitable policies, practices, and treatment towards communities of color. We strongly support SB 17 and this historic opportunity to greatly improve the health and well-being of all Californians.”

SB 17 is co-sponsored by a combination of racial equity, public health, environmental, and power building organizations:

- NextGen Policy fights for progressive policies to address environmental, social, racial, and economic inequities in California through justice-centered legislative advocacy, grassroots partnerships, and democratic civic engagement.
- Public Health Advocates brings a public health lens to today’s most pressing problems, helping communities to pass laws, reform systems, and establish norms that foster justice, equity, and health.
- Advancement Project California is a multi-racial, multi-generational racial justice organization with expertise in research, advocacy, and policy. We work with partners and communities to expand educational opportunities for California’s children; create healthy and safe neighborhoods; ensure communities of color have a voice in our democracy; strengthen movement-building; and shift public investments toward programs that benefit all Californians—not just the privileged few.

8 Ways the American Rescue Plan Will Help Small Businesses

The American Rescue Plan Act has passed the House and Senate, and President Biden is expected to sign it this week. It includes a number of provisions that will help small business owners— including those who are self-employed or are independent contractors— in the form of grants, tax credits and forgivable loans.

Most of these are extensions of programs that were originally included in the CARES Act passed March 27, 2020 and the Economic Aid Act that was signed December 27, 2020. How-

ever there is a brand new grant program for restaurants and similar businesses.

Here's an overview of what's available to small businesses:

1. Targeted EIDL Advances

The legislation allocates \$15 billion for Targeted EIDL Advances to qualified small businesses. Targeted EIDL Advances are tax-free grants of up to \$10,000 to small businesses located in low-income areas that can demonstrate a 30% or greater economic impact. This package includes \$10 billion in additional funding for these grants as well as another \$5 billion to fund \$5000 supplemental grants for businesses with ten or fewer

employees that have suffered an economic impact of at least 50%.

2. Paycheck Protection Program (PPP)

An additional \$7.25 billion is provided to fund PPP loans. The legislation also expands eligibility to certain not-for-profit organizations and digital media organizations that may not have been eligible previously. It currently does not, however, extend the deadline for PPP loans past March 31, 2021, the deadline set in the Economic Aid Act.

3. Restaurant Grants

Restaurants and related businesses (including food stand, food truck, food cart, caterer, saloon,

inn, tavern, bar, lounge, brewpub, tasting room, taproom, and others) may qualify for grants of up to \$5 million per location (\$10 million total per business) under the newly created Restaurant Revitalization Fund. Grants will generally be equal to the pandemic-related revenue loss of the business. The SBA will administer these grants.

Funds may be used for expenses similar to PPP loans though the use of funds is somewhat broader than PPP. The legislation does not state that a certain percentage of funds must be used toward payroll, and since this is a grant rather than a forgivable loan, applicants will not have to apply for forgiveness.

4. Pandemic Unemployment

Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) may be available to self-employed workers, independent contractors, and gig workers who traditionally don't qualify for unemployment. PUA is extended through Sept. 6, 2021 and increases the total number of weeks of benefits that may be available to those who cannot return to work from 50 to 74 weeks. Other forms of unemployment are extended as well.

The first \$10,200 in 2020 unemployment benefits will not be taxed (at the federal level) for households with incomes of less than \$150,000 annually.

5. Employee Retention Credit

The Employee Retention Credit provides a credit for wages paid by businesses whose operations were fully or partially suspended due to a government order related to COVID-19 or that experienced a significant decline in receipts. This credit is extended through the end of 2021 and allows for a credit against Medicare tax. Startups may be eligible as well.

6. Shuttered Venue Operators Grants

Additional funding (\$1.25 billion) is appropriated for the Shuttered Venue Operators grants program administered by the SBA. This program provides grants of up to \$10 million to certain businesses, such as live venue operators, museums, theaters and more. While before these busi-

nesses had to choose between PPP and SVOG, now businesses may apply for both and subtract PPP funding from any SVOG grant received.

7. Paid Family and Sick Leave

This program extends the credit for employers providing paid sick and family leave under the Families First Coronavirus Response Act to September 30, 2021. Self-employed individuals may qualify, and their number of covered days are increased. The amount of covered wages is increased as well. It also expands covered time off to include time to get a COVID-19 vaccine or to recover from one.

8. Community Navigator Program

Funding is available for "Community Navigators," including CDFIs and other nonprofits community organizations as well as resource partners such as SBDCs to help small business owners access programs and resources made available due to the pandemic. The SBA will establish a hotline that will provide referrals to these organizations. While this funding doesn't go directly to small businesses, it should help more understand and qualify for assistance.

Many of these programs will be crucial to help businesses survive the pandemic crisis. Be sure to take advantage of those that apply to your small business.

of 95.7% of what a man would make doing the same job.

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, that's an 18% pay bump compared to other industries. For example, average weekly earnings in 2017 for women in construction were \$873 compared to \$841 for men.

Female construction managers earn \$1,423 weekly compared to the \$1,439 their male counterparts earned.

Technology Levels the Field

For many women, construction technology has brought with it greater opportunities for advancement. With emerging technology, women have stepped up to take positions where gender was not an issue.

A recent survey of 1,000 women in construction conducted by Levelset revealed that 81% say that having access to technology has enabled them to do their job, and 84% say their company supports professional training opportunities.

Today, new roles related to innovation and virtual design like chief technology officer, chief innovation officer, and construc-

tion technologist, are shattering gender stereotypes. With more and more niche technology-focused roles in the construction industry, more opportunities will become available for women.

Through all the obstacles women encounter breaking into the construction industry and the image of construction as a male-dominated field, women are finding the benefits like higher pay and opportunity for advancement outweigh any perceived negatives.

With construction jobs viewed as "essential" during the COVID-19 pandemic, more women are coming around to the stability and growth construction offers, said Brian Turmail, vice president of public affairs and strategic initiatives at the Associated General Contractors of America.

"We clearly have much more work to do as an industry to recruit, hire and retain a more diverse population of workers, particularly women. The good news is we are heading in the right direction," he said.
