

New Poll Finds Strong Voter Support for High-Speed Rail in California

Fourteen years after California voters approved funding to begin building a statewide high-speed rail system, a clear majority of registered voters—and more than 70% of Democrats—still support the project, according to a new survey by UC Berkeley’s Institute of Governmental Studies and the Los Angeles Times.

The poll found that 56% of registered voters “support the state continuing to build the high-speed rail project, even if, as is currently planned, its operations only extend from Bakersfield to Merced in the Central Valley by the year 2030 and to the Bay Area by the year 2033.” Thirty-five percent of voters said they are opposed.

By a margin of 73% to 18% Democrats support the project, with 54% of independent voters in support and 37% opposed. Registered Republicans oppose the project—66% to 25%.

“This poll confirms what we’ve believed for a long-time – that the great majority of Californians want electrified high-speed rail to help

them alleviate congestion, avoid high gas prices, and address the climate crisis,” said Ray LaHood, former U.S. Transportation Secretary and co-chair of the U.S. High-Speed Rail Coalition, which is mobilizing leading unions, businesses, and public servants to advocate for investments that will finally make high-speed rail a reality in America.

High-speed rail will help break the state’s dependence on fossil fuels and is essential for California to achieve its ambitious clean air and carbon-free energy goals. At the same time, the project is creating thousands of good-paying union jobs.

Addressing voter worries over spiraling gas prices, the poll found that four in 10 voters said spiking gas prices are hurting them and their families, with low-income voters, especially, saying high gas prices are a serious problem.

The California project is at a critical juncture. Governor Newsom has submitted a \$4.2 billion budget request to fund construction work now underway in the Central Valley and to advance key contracts to continue progress on

Construction Employment in March Exceeds Pre-Pandemic Peak Level in 32 States as Record High Job Openings Hold Down Further Hiring

Construction employment exceeded pre-pandemic levels in 32 states in March, according to a new analysis of federal employment data released by the Associated General Contractors of America. Association officials said the government should support more career opportunities to enable people to work in the industry.

“Contractors have been adding workers as fast as they can find them,” said Ken Simonson, the association’s chief economist. “But there just aren’t enough qualified workers available in

many states, as shown by the record number of construction job openings at the February.”

Simonson noted that government data from the monthly Job Openings and Labor Turnover Survey show that there were 364,000 job openings in the construction at the end of February. That was the highest February total since the series began in 2001 and constituted a 52 percent jump in openings from one year earlier. Openings exceeded the 342,000 employees hired during that month, implying that construction firms would have added twice as many employees if they had been available, the economist asserted.

From February 2020—the month before the pandemic caused projects to be halted or canceled—to March 2022, construction employment increased in 32 states, declined in 16 states and the District of Columbia, and was unchanged in Nevada and Wyoming. Utah added the most construction jobs since February 2020 (15,000 jobs, 13.2 percent), followed by Tennessee (11,400 jobs, 8.6 percent) and Missouri (11,300 jobs, 8.8 percent). Utah also had the largest percentage gain, followed by South Dakota (12.1 percent, 2,900 jobs) and Idaho (12.0 percent, 6,600 jobs).

New York shed the most construction jobs over 25 months (-29,600 jobs, -7.2 percent), followed by Texas (-15,300 jobs, -2.0 percent) and Pennsylvania (-14,200 jobs, -5.3 percent). The largest percentage losses were in New York, Pennsylvania, and North Dakota (-5.0 percent, -1,400 jobs).

From February to March, construction employment increased in 35 states, decreased in 14 states and D.C., and was unchanged in Idaho. California added the most construction jobs over the month (8,900 jobs, 1.0 percent), followed by Texas (4,400 jobs, 0.6 percent) and North Carolina (4,200 jobs, 1.8 percent). South Dakota had the largest percentage gain (7.1 percent, 1,800

jobs), followed by New Mexico (3.3 percent, 1,700 jobs) and Connecticut (2.1 percent, 1,300 jobs).

New York lost the most construction jobs between February and March (-3,700 jobs, -1.0 percent), followed by Colorado (-2,300 jobs, -1.2 percent) and Mississippi (-1,600 jobs, -3.3 percent). Mississippi had the largest percentage loss, followed by West Virginia (-1.8 percent, -600 jobs), and Wyoming (-1.7 percent, -400 jobs).

Association officials said a lack of workers is delaying vitally needed projects. They urged officials in Washington to increase funding for career and technical education and allow more apprenticeship programs.

“Contractors are eager to hire more workers,” said Stephen E. Sandherr, the association’s chief executive officer. “The federal government must expand opportunities for appropriate education and training programs.”

City Announces Financial Recovery Grants For Small Businesses

The San Francisco Office of Economic and Workforce Development (OEWD), through its Office of Small Business and Invest in Neighborhoods division, announced a series of financial recovery grants for businesses to design storefront improvements and to assess their space for accessibility upgrades. The investments support small businesses with professional design services such as architects, engineers, and also provide reimbursements for Certified Access Specialists to assess the physical space of the storefront and help guide improvements.

With the City now fully reopened and recovering, San Francisco is offering grant funding to businesses wanting to ensure their storefronts are safe, accessible and visually appealing. In addition to these grants, San Francisco recognizes that many businesses are still struggling and need to apply for further capital to maintain their operations and accelerate their recovery.

“As San Francisco re-energizes, we recognize that small businesses are critical to our economy and the San Francisco civic fabric. After two years, we see how hard our small businesses fought to stay alive during the pandemic, and we hope these grants will help them turn the corner and recover,” said Kate Sofis, Executive Director of the Office of Economic and Workforce Development.

The series of financial relief will be rolled out in two phases. This first phase will provide grants to storefronts for technical design services. The

second phase will provide grants to those that have a plan in place to implement the improvements. Applications are available, and OEWD anticipates distribution of funds in Summer.

“Prior to the pandemic, most small businesses did not have the financial flexibility to make improvements and upgrades to their storefront spaces. These grant programs are designed to give small businesses the boost they need so they can better adapt to changing operational needs and be better suited to welcome all types of customers in this new era,” said Katy Tang, Executive Director of the Office of Small Business.

To date, San Francisco has allocated over than \$63 million in grants and loans to support over 3,300 small businesses. The grants and loans were designed to serve minority owned small businesses and complement state and federal financial relief.

The grants that are currently available include:

SF Shines Design Services Grant: OEWD will be providing access to professional design services to storefront businesses to help them with design, permits, and other technical services make improvements to their space. The goal is to ensure our small businesses continue to thrive and create vibrant and safe neighborhood commercial corridors.

Accessible Business Entrance Grant: The Office of Small Business will be providing grants to small businesses required by landlords to

comply with accessibility regulations. Small businesses that are approved for a grant under this program will receive a reimbursement of up to \$1,000 for an accessibility inspection of their front entrance or up to \$3,000 for an accessibility inspection of the entire storefront. This grant program is designed to assist small businesses required by their landlords to comply with the City’s Accessible Business Entrance (ABE) program, a local requirement to ensure San Francisco businesses welcome everybody. Under the ABE, commercial property owners of public-serving businesses must submit an accessibility checklist to the Department of Building Inspection by June 30, 2022 if they have not yet done so.

Shares Spaces Equity Grant: The Planning Department is offering reimbursements for up to \$2,500 for businesses that need to comply with requirements for a permanent shared space. The funds can be used toward services or materials.

Storefront Vandalism Relief Grant: OEWD provides financial relief to restore small businesses impacted by deliberate actions that result in the destruction or damages of storefronts. This program offers either \$1,000 or \$2,000, depending on the total cost incurred to repair physical damages.

Revolving Loan Fund: Through community partner, Main Street Launch, up to \$50,000 in zero to low-interest loans is available for eligible new and existing small businesses. Funds can be

used toward business acquisition, debt refinance, furniture, fixtures and equipment, inventory and supplies, tenant improvements, working capital, and for start-up expenses.

Emerging Business Loan Fund: Through community partner, Main Street Launch, up to \$250,000 in zero to low-interest loans are available for eligible new and existing small businesses. Funds can be used toward business acquisition, debt refinance, furniture, fixtures and equipment, inventory and supplies, tenant improvements, working capital, and for start-up expenses. **CA Rebuilding Loan Fund:** Through community partner, Main Street Launch, up to \$100,000 in COVID-19 recovery loans are available for eligible businesses in operation prior to June 2019.

In addition to these recovery funds, the City continues to provide one-on-one counseling and technical assistance and services to small businesses looking to open, operate, and expand in San Francisco. Information and services are also available for businesses who can’t pay back rent and looking for assistance to prevent a commercial eviction. Among the key elements of the SBA’s Equity Action Plan being announced today:

New Poll Finds Strong Voter Support for High-Speed Rail in California

the project. This bond appropriation is the remaining allocation from the original Proposition 1A bond approved by 6.6 million voters in 2008 to initiate construction on the California High-Speed Rail project.

The California High-Speed Rail Authority is competing for billions of dollars in competitive grant opportunities in the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, as well as billions more in the pending budget reconciliation bill, which includes \$10 billion in dedicated funding for high-speed rail projects.

Approval of the \$4.2 billion bond appropriation will signal continued support by the State

of California, creating the opportunity for significant federal investment. Together, these state and federal investments could help expedite the completion of an initial operating segment while advancing construction on the project's critical bookends in the Los Angeles Basin and the Bay Area.
