#### Gov. Newsom Announces California Economic Recovery Task Force With Former Governors & Businesspeople

In Gov. Gavin Newsom's daily update on California's response to the coronavirus, he announced details about a new task force to help with the state's economic recovery (while noting that the state isn't yet ready to loosen restrictions). ### LATEST CALIFORNIA CORONAVIRUS NUMBERS

Since March 12, 3.1 million Californians have filed for unemployment insurance, Newsom said.

California had its highest daily death total due to coronavirus yet, with another 95 dead as of last night, according to Newsom. That brings the state's coronavirus deaths to 985. The number of coronavirus patients in ICUs went down 1.4% over the past day, but those hospitalized went up 1.2%.

The state is not yet ready to start loosening up on coronavirus restrictions and moving to the next phase he announced earlier this week, Newsom said. Updates on the criteria for when to reopen will come every Wednesday, he added.

The governor noted concerns about visitors from other states who are loosening their restrictions before California does, though all those visitors are under California's restrictions while in the state. Newsom said.

# **Contractors Converting Convention Centers Into Coronavirus Hospitals**

The coronavirus pandemic is putting a strain on the nation's healthcare system as hospitals try and keep pace with the growing number of confirmed cases of COVID-19. In order to treat the growing number of coronavirus patients, states and healthcare providers are looking for ways to add more hospitals beds in some unconventional ways. Everything from moving in naval ships to opening up recently shuttered hospitals to converting currently unused spaces like dormitories, hotels, and convention centers are being considered.

New Hospital Construction on Hold

While hospital beds are in high demand, especially states with larger numbers of coronavirus cases, some hospitals are choosing to put recently started and upcoming projects on hold. This is

being done to focus all efforts and resources on the current pandemic. While no two projects are the same, hospital construction can take a couple of years to complete using traditional construction methods.

In Wadena, Minnesota, a \$70 million, 123,000-square-foot replacement hospital for Tri-County Health Partners was expected to break ground in July and completed by Spring 2022. That project is being postponed by about a year at this point.

Altru Health System recently put a \$300 million hospital construction project in Grand Forks, North Dakota on hold. The project broke ground in June 2019 and was scheduled for completion in 2022.

ProHealth Care recently put a \$55 million hospital renovation and addition project in Mukwonago, Wisconsin that began in February on hold. The project was initially scheduled to be completed in the next three months but due to the delay they are optimistic that construction can resume soon enough to finish construction by the end of the year.

#### **China Built New Hospitals in Days**

In Wuhan, China, where the coronavirus outbreak started, the government was able to build two temporary hospitals in a matter of days to treat COVID-19 patients. The first one was completed in 10 days and 1,000 beds and the second was completed in 12 days with 1,600 beds.

The hospitals used prefabricated structures and crews of over 7,500 laborers working around the clock to get the hospitals completed and operational as quickly as possible. China used a similar technique during the SARS outbreak back in 2003 in Beijing

A similar approach to hospital construction is being approached by Plaza Construction and Central Consulting & Contracting. They have contracted with FullStack Modular to build and ship modular units that can be used to adapt existing space or added to create new wings or freestanding structures.

Both firms are waiving all management fees and only charging for materials and labor for any coronavirus-related healthcare construction project. They are currently offering these services to hospitals in Connecticut, Florida, New Jersey, and New York, as well as those located in the mid-Atlantic.

#### **Expediting Hospitals Nearing Completion**

While almost all construction sites sit dormant in Pennsylvania, the one exception has been for healthcare construction. To that end, Penn Medicine has had crews working three shifts, 24/7 to get 120 patient rooms, of the planned 500, completed by the middle of April, 15 months ahead of schedule to help treat coronavirus patients.

#### PLANS FOR CORONAVIRUS ECONOMIC **RECOVERY**

The governor said that he has tasked 80 leaders to help plan for the state's economic recovery, with an advisory council that includes all four of the state's living governors. That council includes both Republicans and Democrats from the state's Legislature, Newsom said, among other leaders

"Some of the great social justice warriors reside here in the state of California," Newsom said.

This task force will be divided into sub-groups covering areas like entertainment, hospitality, retail, manufacturing, and regional issues around

the state, Newsom said. It will be supplemental to the state's economic council of advisors, as well as the Future of Work Commission.

The task force will be working on actionable ideas in real time, not some future report, according to Newsom. They are looking at actions that can be taken in the weeks ahead, not just the months ahead. Going forward, labor, business, environmental, and social justice concerns will be part of this task force.

The chair of the council is businessman and former Democratic presidential candidate Tom Steyer, who joined Newsom in person.

"Health and safety have to be paramount here in California, but everyone is also hurting economically," Steyer said.

Steyer said that he hoped the task force could help with some of the societal injustice revealed by the coronavirus pandemic. Several business leaders who are on the task force spoke at the press conference, including Disney Chairman Bob Iger. He said that they will be sharing what they've learned at Disney, as well as looking to learn from others.

The governor's chief of staff Ann O'Leary is serving as co-chair of the task force.

Newsom said that 15% of the jobs created since the Great Recession were created in California. With March's coronavirus impact, 120 months of job creation ended.

California is aiming to be able to perform 25.000 coronavirus tests by the end of the month, with 95,000 as a goal in May as another benchmark,

Details on the state's coronavirus contact tracing plans will be announced next week, Newsom said.

# Can I Get a Business Startup Loan From the Government?

The Government, despite what the cool kids are saying, is there to help you. From Pell Grants for students to various incentives for first-time home buyers, there are options to help you out. But what about your small business? Starting your own venture is expensive, a Nav survey found that 62% of business owners used their personal savings to fund their business. To reduce the hurt and the impact on your own wallet and preserve or kick off your cash flow, it's wise to seek out grants or a business loan from the government for help.

So, then, are there options available from the government to help fund your startup? Let's take a look

#### The Short Answer

You're here for a simple answer, and that answer is: probably. If you're looking to the government for funding for your business, look no further (or anywhere else, really) than the Small Business Administration (SBA). There are a few loan products they offer, each with their own requirements, for which you may qualify.

#### **Government Business Loan Types**

The SBA offers three types of startup loans:

- 1. SBA Microloan,
- 2. SBA Community Advantage Loan, and
- 3. SBA 7(a) loan.

What sets these apart from most other business loans is the lack of a requirement for time in business. Most lenders will require that you have at least two years in business before they can approve you, but these three loan types omit the requirement, giving you an advantage.

#### SBA Microloan

The SBA Microloan is, as the name suggests, a smaller-than-normal loan. Where traditional loans have a limit of up to \$130,000, the SBA Microloan caps out at a \$50,000 limit. The low dollar amount and relatively higher-than-normal interest rate (8-13%) are because of the fewer requirements and the subsequently higher risk for the lender. While \$50,000 isn't going to last you decades, it's substantial for new entrepreneurs looking to get their operation off the ground.

You can use an SBA Microloan for working capital, buying inventory or machinery/equip-

ment, or adding furniture or fixtures. It can't be used for real estate or dealing with preexisting date. You must have a credit score of at least 640, some collateral, and there may be a personal guarantee involved.

#### SBA Community Advantage Loan

A branch of the SBA Microloan program, the Community Advantage Loan program is designed to provide loans to businesses in an underserved community. It has a higher loan limit of \$50,000-\$250,000, and a lower interest rate of 7-9%.

Unlike the Microloan, requirements will vary from lender to lender, to it's best to build a solid relationship with a lender who offers this product. Fulfilling the requirement of helping an underserved community is key, and your financial history and time in business likely won't be as important as it would be with other financial institutions.

#### SBA 7(a) Loan

The 7(a) Loan is the bread and butter of the SBA. It's easily the most popular SBA product among small businesses, but startups can qualify as well due to the lack of the time-inbusiness requirement. Still then, it's a tough loan to get.

You'll need a credit score of at least 680, no recent derogatories such as bankruptcies, and collateral for any loan amount over \$25,000. If you have a good credit score, the rest of the requirements aren't too complicated to check off.

#### How to Prepare to Apply for a Business Loan from the Government

Review your business plan. Without a solid, well-written and planned business plan, you'll have a hard time getting any loan, let alone an SBA loan. Keeping an eye on your personal and business credit scores will be key as well (you can do so for free with Nay).

Remember, the government has an interest in the success of your (tax-paying) business. Explore your options, get ready, and improve your chances of approval.

# Fourth COVID-19 Stimulus Package Must Promote **Racial Equity in Health Care**

#### [ Article was originally posted on greenlining.org ]

Our nation needs a fourth COVID-19 stimulus package. The Families First Act and CARES Act contained important early responses to the crisis, but these bills left out a lot that needs to be done. Today I want to focus on one aspect that needs much more attention: Congress needs to pass additional relief for health centers for our communities to withstand and recover from this public health emergency.

While the earlier stimulus package did allocate funds to health care systems, the initial \$150 billion for hospitals was not enough to last the duration of this crisis, and priority support must go to our safety net health systems and clinics that serve low-income and uninsured patients.

California's reported COVID-19 cases by race and ethnicity so far reveal that the death rate among African Americans is disproportionately high, and there is growing evidence from New York, Milwaukee and other locations that the spread and impact of the virus across the nation is disproportionately affecting communities of color and particularly Black, Latinx, and Native American folks. The virus exacerbates social determinants of health that already burden low-income communities of color. For folks experiencing homelessness, chronic disease, food insecurity, or unemployment for example, COVID 19 magnifies their vulnerabilities. People of color tend to be overrepresented in "essential worker" re-

tail and service industry jobs that often lack health benefits or paid sick leave, and which have been particularly at risk for exposure to

The Greenlining Institute urges Congress to 1) pass a fourth stimulus package with additional funding and resources for safety net hospitals and community health clinics that serve predominantly low-income and uninsured families and 2) provide guidance in the

use of funds to ensure that low income families of color are well supported and don't face disproportionate harm from the spread of CO-VID-19.

We recommend the following urgent health and racial equity policy priorities to ensure that health care systems receive relief funding to support low-income families of color:

# 1. Require Health Centers to Provide Free COVID-19 Testing and Treatment for Low-Income Families:

We must incentivize seeking medical care and also ensure that low-income families already suffering from this financial crisis are not also burdened with excessive medical fees and debt. In an emergency, a patient may unknowingly be taken to a hospital that is outside of their medical network for treatment and get stuck with an expensive "surprise" bill not covered by insurance. For low-income and uninsured families, they may forgo going to a hospital altogether because they cannot afford to pay. Some private health insurance companies and state Medicaid programs are leading the effort to waive copays for COVID-19 testing, evaluation, and treatment. Now it is time for hospitals to step up and stop "surprise" medical billing to patients seeking care, regardless of their immigration status, insurance status, or ability to pay. We urge Congress to require that hospitals use stimulus funds to provide free testing and treatment for low income families and the uninsured to encourage



more people to seek health care and stop the spread of the virus.

# 2. Require Health Centers to Collect & Report COVID-19 Demographic Data to State Public Health Departments:

Reports across the nation are showing that the spread of COVID-19 is disproportionately impacting communities of color. This stems from a number of systemic issues including lack of healthcare access, implicit bias of healthcare providers, and greater likelihood of exposure to the virus due to living conditions, unemployment, or "essential worker" status. Hospitals and medical centers need resources and funding to

collect data on important demographic indicators like race, ethnicity, gender identity, age, zip code, and socioeconomic status and report them to their respective State Department of Public Health for transparency. Data transparency is an important accountability measure to ensure that resources, support, and relief get prioritized to the communities most disproportionately affected by the pandemic.

# 3. Require Health Centers to Screen and Provide Referrals for Domestic & Intimate Partner Violence:

The compounding impacts of rising unemployment, stress, and trauma from COVID-19

are contributing to an alarming increase in reported domestic violence incidents. While this impacts everyone, low-income women, LGBTQ, and gender expressive folks in particular can be more prone to experiencing this kind of abuse. Hospitals and medical centers must continue to prioritize screening for domestic and intimate partner violence. A group of senators recently called for increased funding to connect patients with essential counseling, therapy, and support services, and the next stimulus package must provide such support.

As the health and economic impacts of the pandemic unfold, we need Congress to prioritize supporting the most vulnerable now more than ever. Health systems need funding as well as guidance to ensure that low-income families are supported by emergency response and relief efforts. Congress must prioritize free COVID-19 testing and treatment for low-income families and the uninsured, demographic data collection and reporting, and resources and support for domestic and intimate partner violence in a new stimulus package.

# **Contractors Converting Convention Centers Into Coronavirus Hospitals**

#### **Army Corps of Engineers Drafts Blueprints**

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) was deployed on March 19 and have scouted out over 1,000 locations across the country, including dormitories, hotels, arenas, closed hospitals, and convention centers, to identify viable spaces that can be quickly converted into makeshift hospitals to treat patients, both those who have COVID-19 and those who don't.

They've developed blueprints, including creating spaces with negative pressure spaces or rooms in order to treat patients require the use of ventilators for breathing, that can be easily deployed to convert college dormitories, hotels, sports arenas, and convention centers into Alternate Care Sites in as little as five days and at a maximum up to two weeks.

As of April 15, they've awarded 15 contracts, with 7 pending, for their Arena to Healthcare projects and 11 contracts awarded, with 5 pending, for their Hotels/Dorms to Healthcare projects. They've already completed three of the 26 projects awarded.

#### **Reopening Closed Hospitals**

Data from the American Hospital Association claims that hospitals have been closing at a rate of 30 per year. To combat the coronavirus, some of those recently closed hospitals and hospitals with unused wings are planning to do some turn-key renovations and open back up as quickly as possible.

The Inspira Medical Woodbury in New Jersey, which closed in 2019, is planning to reopen its doors and provide an additional 300 beds. In Chicago, Clark Construction in conjunction with the Army Corps of Engineers is working to retrofit and upgrade the MetroSouth Hospital in Blue Island to treat about 550 COVID-19 patients.

# Converting Convention Centers, Hotels, and Dorms to Hospitals

Completed projects include the Javits Center in New York City with 1,900 beds that completed by the NY Convention Center Operating Corp., the TCF Center in Detroit with 1,000 beds completed by Gilbane, and a Quality Inn hotel in Florissant, Missouri with 120 beds completed by Tarlton Corp.

Other projects that are expected to be completed in the next week or two include: Chicago's Mc-

Cormick Place Convention Center with 3,000 beds being done by Walsh Construction, SUNY Stony Brook with 1,038 beds by Turner Construction Co., SUNY Old Westbury with 1,022 beds by AECOM Technical Services, the Denver Convention Center with 2,000 beds being done by ECC Environmental, LLC, and Suburban Collection Showplace in Novi, Michigan with 1,100 beds being constructed by Gilbane Fedral

Here at ConstructConnect, we've seen a number of Sources Sought RFQs going out from the US-ACE in regards to these efforts as well as other healthcare construction projects related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

# Final Thoughts on Construction's Role During the Coronavirus Pandemic

For the most part, states that currently have shelter-in-place or stay-at-home orders have deemed construction, to some extent, as essential. In addition to healthcare and hospital construction projects, construction companies are working on repairing and installing vital infrastructure like roads, bridges, water and sewer projects, schools, electric power generation and distribution, and telecommunication projects. Keeping projects like these will be vital when things

slowly start getting back to whatever our new normal may be once this pandemic is over.

It's also important to remember that more projects may be put on hold or postponed due to the economic impact that the coronavirus pandemic is creating. Construction projects for things like restaurants, retail stores, hotels, and office buildings are going to take a hit and it will impact the entire industry from architect and engineers down to general contractors, building product manufacturers, trade contractors, and all the ancillary suppliers and service providers.

Safety and worker health should be the top priority and social distancing, personal protective equipment, and other prevention methods like handwashing and cleaning and disinfecting tools and equipment should continue to be practiced. Business owners of all sizes need to also be looking at how they can weather this storm and prevent their company from becoming a casualty of this pandemic.
