The construction industry is inherently dangerous. Heavy machinery and equipment, moving objects, and working at height, all pose potential risks and hazards for construction workers. However, advancements in technology help reduce the threat of incidents on the jobsite and improve overall construction safety.

At the helm of safety innovation are female-led and inspired initiatives, applications, and programs. And while women represent only 10% of the total construction workforce and a minuscule 1.2% of the trade force, they have contributed significantly to advancing the construction industry — specifically around safety.

Here are four trends that women are driving forward with initiatives, applications, and programs that impact construction safety.

4 Trends Impacting Construction Safety

1. Machine Learning & Artificial Intelligence

Founded in 2016, Versatile, Inc. (Formerly Versatile Natures) is a startup that leverages ma-

chine learning and artificial intelligence (AI) to optimize construction processes by capturing jobsite performance data.

Co-founder and CEO, Meirav Oren, is passionate about challenging the status quo to improve the lives of others. Noticing a gap in construction technology that helps teams safely accelerate project schedules, Versatile was born. Versatile’s technology seamlessly integrates into existing processes by mounting IoT sensors under the hook of a crane to capture and analyze project data to drive more informed decision-making. The application also improves site safety by providing more visibility into what’s happening on the jobsite at all times.

2. Virtual Reality

Virtual Reality (VR) is gaining traction in construction as a training tool due to its ability to create realistic simulations without putting workers in danger. By navigating potential jobsite hazards in a virtual environment, teams can gain hands-on experience. And according to research from PwC, VR increases retention and drives positive outcomes. The report shows that those taught in VR demonstrated 340% more

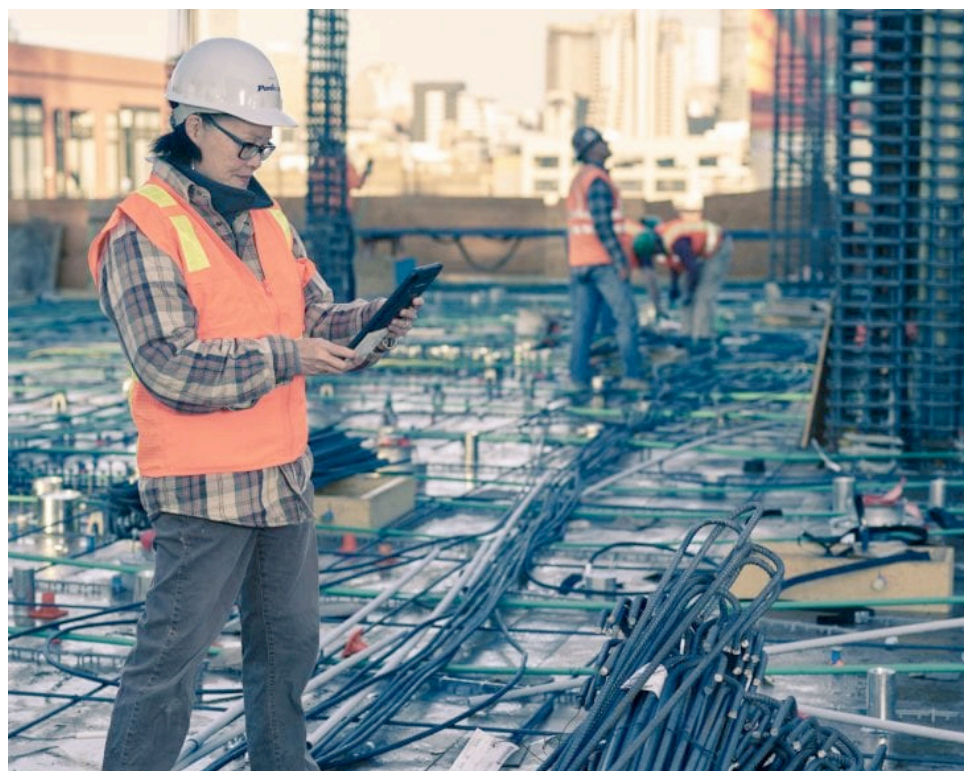

We also celebrate and honor the invaluable contributions the AANHPI communities have made to our Nation’s culture and the arts, law, science and technology, sports and public service — including the courageous AANHPIs who have served on the front lines of the COVID-19 pandemic as health care providers, first responders, teachers, and other essential workers.

During this year’s Asian American and Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander Heritage Month, our Nation celebrates the achievements of Vice President Harris, the first person of South Asian descent to hold the Office of the Vice President. Vice President Harris has blazed a trail and set an example for young people across the country to aspire to follow, including members of AANHPI

communities and AANHPI women in particular.

In spite of the strength shown and successes achieved, the American dream remains out of reach for far too many AANHPI families. AANHPI communities face systemic barriers to economic justice, health equity, educational attainment, and personal safety. These challenges are compounded by stark gaps in Federal data, which too often fails to reflect the diversity of AANHPI communities and the particular barriers that Native Hawaiian, Pacific Islander, Southeast Asian, and South Asian communities in the United States continue to face.

My Administration also recognizes the heightened fear felt by many Asian American communities in the wake of increasing rates of anti-Asian harassment and violence during the COVID-19 pandemic, and the increasingly observable layers of hate now directed toward women and elders of Asian descent in particu-

CA Assembly Resolution Would Encourage Equity Analysis of Bills

Assemblymember Mike A. Gipson (D-Carson), joined by Assemblymembers Adrin Nazarian, Mark Stone, Luz Rivas and Cristina Garcia, has introduced HR 39, designed to address a major gap in the analysis of new legislation proposed

in Sacramento. HR 39 would encourage the California Assembly to explore methods to integrate equity more formally into its daily activities, including the potential adoption of equity impact analysis into the existing committee and floor bill analysis processes.

“Communities of color and other marginalized populations have been disproportionately harmed by poor government decisions, even if unintentional,” said Assemblymember Mike A. Gipson (D-Carson). “I can think of no better time to reflect and make sure we don’t repeat those mistakes and to guarantee that we bring a new level of transparency and analysis

to the legislative process. We must ensure that all Californians have an equal opportunity to benefit from policies that profoundly impact them, such as education, housing, employment, health care, etc. Right now, each new bill gets an analysis examining things like related legislation

The structural inequalities in public and private institutions have exacerbated the American crisis in healthcare, income distribution, food insecurity and homelessness—just to name a few.

Oakland citizens are becoming more actively engaged in construction projects being proposed in their community, which impact their quality of life and contribute to the public good.

One such construction project is the new Bay Area Rapid Transit District (BART) Headquarters to be located in downtown Oakland. Taking steps toward greater operational efficiency, BART, is in the process of a \$58 million renovation of an existing building that will become their new home in the summer of 2021.

“This is a historic opportunity for small businesses to be part of a construction project that reaffirms our organization’s connection with the East Bay,” stated Maceo Wiggins, Director of the BART Office of Civil Rights. “We’ve been headquartered in Oakland for many years and with the acquisition of this new building we’re going to remain headquartered in Oakland and we’re making sure small businesses are a key part of this project.”

BART and the HQ project participants solicited proposals from three different General Contractors. Turner Construction Company, a global building contractor with a 50-year presence in the Bay Area, was awarded a contract to design & build the project in less than a year. They met all technical requirements and proposed a diverse project team, but this was not enough – specifically with respect to local

Black/African American businesses and contractors.

After engaging a number of business associations and trade groups representing Black/African American business owners and BART leadership, Turner Construction Company committed to achieving a 10% goal for Black/African American owned businesses. Merrill Bowers, Vice President and General Manager of Turner Construction stated, “We are dedicated to our community and all communities that BART serves. Proposition 209 certainly does not limit the outreach and engagement efforts of Turner, nor does the lack of state or city mandated goals for the project limit us from establishing and meeting our own”. He further stated that because the project delivery method is Design-Build, Turner has more flexibility to open up opportunities for smaller contractors.

This inclusion represents an enormous opportunity for the Oakland based, black-owned construction firms and the black workers they employ. Ensuring a diverse workforce behind this publicly funded project represents a win-win for all the parties involved and demonstrates that inclusion, diversity and equity are elements that enhance the quality of life in our communities.

Red Dipper Electric, a DBE, MBE, LBE, SLEB, LIABE and SBE, was one of the local black-owned contractors selected for the project. Doug Parrish, CEO of Red Dipper Electric, recognized the importance of these inclusion efforts and how it will positively impact more than just his firm. “We are elated to be included on a project that will have an enormous impact in Oakland by bringing jobs and contracts,” said Parrish, “BART ensured community engagement and Turner Construction worked collaboratively with

the African American Chamber’s to increase minority participation, which will certainly improve the health and welfare of this community.”

Another black-owned contractor on the project is Metro Contract Group, a DBE, MBE and SBE full-service contract furniture dealership based in Oakland. Dwight Jackson, President and CEO of Metro Contract Group, reflects on his experience. “It’s our pleasure to work with BART and Turner Construction on this important and exciting project for our local region. We look forward to working with Turner and contributing to the future of our local transit district. We also appreciate Turner Construction and BART’s outreach and inclusion to small, diverse vendors – initiatives that Metro supports.”

Furthermore, three of these black-owned firms on the BART HQ project have also enrolled and successfully graduated from the Spring 2021 Turner School of Construction Management Program (TSCM). The TSCM program is a free, 7-week program, designed to prepare diverse, women-owned, veteran/disabled, LGBTQ, and small business contractors for future business opportunities. This program, delivered by Turner Construction management staff, is designed to help firms improve their economic viability by enhancing managerial, technical and administrative skills while promoting dialogue, access & connection. TSCM, generously sponsored by Union Bank, will be offered again in the Fall of 2021.

and fiscal impact, but nothing about its impact on low-income Californians or historically marginalized communities. The equity impact assessment would update the existing government process and identify gaps in our policy-making decisions.

All levels of government have begun to embrace the need for such analysis. President Biden recently issued an executive order requiring all federal departments and agencies to “recognize and work to redress inequities in their policies and programs that serve as barriers to equal opportunity.” Five states — Connecticut, Florida, Iowa, Oregon, and New Jersey — have adopted

and implemented policies requiring racial equity impact statements for certain types of proposals.

“As the Biden administration works to build a serious federal approach to racial equity, it’s already receiving hostile responses claiming that equity must mean racial quotas and is bad for America,” said Debra Gore-Mann, president and CEO of The Greenlining Institute, which sponsored the resolution. “California must not be intimidated, but instead must help lead the effort to commit to equity. We cannot capitulate to white grievance that is rooted in white privilege and a false sense of superiority. It is time to be bold, proactive and center racial equity to build an inclusive country, and HR 39 will help get us there.”

Sammy Nunez, executive director of Fathers & Families of San Joaquin said, “As the most diverse city in America, Stockton’s 2020 election served as a barometer to measure and forecast the socio-political realities of people of color across the United States. The political landscape is indicative of racial injustice, and the overt oppressive forces that have permeated every aspect of our country since its inception. However, this also presents an opportunity for investments that can transform our struggles into solutions to transcend and heal the racial divide that has kept us from meeting our full potential as a state and nation.”

The Greenlining Institute believes that applying racial and social equity analytics to understand

the complexities and harsh realities imposed on people of color represents the minimum California must do to ensure a future devoid of neglect and abandonment and undo the social, political, and institutional traumas perpetuated by the state. This resolution would illuminate the benefits for all Californians of legislating through an equity-based lens that builds opportunities for all Californians.

lar. Our Nation continues to grieve the senseless killings of six women of Asian descent in Atlanta, and the unconscionable acts of violence victimizing our beloved Asian American seniors in cities across the country.

Acts of anti-Asian bias are wrong, they are un-American, and they must stop. My Administration will continue to stand shoulder to shoulder with AANHPI communities in condemning, denouncing, and preventing these acts of violence. We will continue to look for opportunities to heal together and fight against the racism and xenophobia that still exists in this country.

Present-day inequities faced by AANHPI communities are rooted in our Nation’s history of exclusion, discrimination, racism, and xenophobia against Asian Americans. Asian Americans, Native Hawaiians, and Pacific Islanders have endured a long history of injustice — including the Page Act of 1875, the Chinese Exclusion Act of 1882, the incarceration of Japanese American citizens during World War II, the murder of Vincent Chin, the mass shooting of Southeast Asian refugee children in 1989, and the targeting of South Asian Americans, especially those who are Muslim, Hindu, or Sikh, after the national tragedy of 9/11. It is long past time for Federal leadership to advance inclusion, belonging, and

acceptance for all AANHPI communities. My Administration is committed to a whole-of-government effort to advance equity, root out racial injustices in our Federal institutions, and finally deliver the promise of America for all Americans.

Vice President Harris and I affirm that Asian Americans, Native Hawaiians, and Pacific Islanders make our Nation stronger. I urge my fellow Americans to join us this month in celebrating AANHPI history, people, and cultures.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOSEPH R. BIDEN JR., President of the United States of America, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the

Constitution and the laws of the United States, do hereby proclaim May 2021 as Asian American and Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander Heritage Month. confidence to employ what they learned versus traditional e-learning methods at 10%.

Pepper Construction is one company leading the way in creating a safer jobsite by using VR for safety training. Jen Suerth, Vice President of Technical Services at Pepper Construction, and her safety team decided to use VR to improve safety, an area that has been stagnant across the industry.

Using its site statistics, Pepper Construction created customized training modules to coach workers by “doing” on its top safety trends observed on the jobsite. Based on the training, Pepper Construction saw a reduction in safety incidents on-site. For their approach to using VR to positively impact safety on the jobsite, Pepper Construction was the recipient of a 2021 AGC Construction Innovation Award.

3. Safety Applications

There are many safety applications geared towards the construction industry, but few are designed specifically for the field.

eMOD, a construction safety app “built for the field, by the field” aggregates and tracks checklists, incident reports, toolbox talks, safety audits, crew profiles, and more on one dashboard. Co-founded by Kaitlin Frank, a superintendent at Dome Construction and ConstructionDive 2021 construction champion, eMOD drives accountability and creates transparency between the job-



site and the office, ensuring safety is the number one priority. With safety documents tracked in one location, teams can confidently and quickly find information to meet OSHA compliance.

Currently, eMOD has more than 10,000 users and 500 companies using the application equaling more than 18.5 hours saved between safety officers, superintendents, and forepersons.

4. Better-fitting PPE

There is no one-size-fits-all approach to personal protective equipment (PPE). Poorly fitting PPE is a safety hazard. Too loose, and it can get caught in

machinery, too tight, and it can be uncomfortable to wear. The dangers of ill-fitting PPE outweigh the protection it provides when used.

Proper fitting PPE – for all bodies (harnesses, gloves, etc.) – is a must to create a safe and inclusive environment. Skanska, Plaza Construction, and McCarthy Building Companies, Inc. are three leading examples of firms already taking strides to provide proper fitting PPE for women.

And in March 2020, Autodesk and the Associated General Contractors of America (AGC) partnered to drive this movement forward by

funding a grant program to supply 21 construction firms with more than 300 fall protection safety harnesses designed for women who work at height. The applicant pool represented general contractors, specialty contractors, and specialty providers representing approximately 22,000 employees.

On May 5, 2021, OSHA and AGC highlighted the importance of preventing falls in construction, acknowledging the contractor members who were recipients of the 2020 AGC/Autodesk Safety Harness Grant. Here is a link to the webinar if you missed it.

Developing a Strong Construction Safety Culture

Technology has spurred many innovations in construction that improve safety, but safety is personal and starts with people. Trust is a critical component in creating a successful construction safety culture.

Building a construction safety culture begins with changing how safety is discussed and encouraging transparency and consistency across your organization. By emphasizing the importance of safety, you will inherently create safety champions supported by technology to feel confident and safe about the work they’re doing.
