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## White House Announces National Building Code Initiative

The most reliable way to ensure our nation's infrastructure is resilient, and that we are truly building back better, is the widespread adoption and enforcement of modern, up to date building codes.

ASCE was pleased to see the White House recently announce the National Initiative to Advance Building Codes, an effort to help state and local governments be more resilient by adopting the most up to date building codes and standards. The Biden Administration intends to use the initiative to push recipients of federal funding to meet modernized building standards to the "greatest extent feasible" and will use \$225 million from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act to encourage local adoption of modernized energy codes. The initiative also directs Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to implement its new Building Codes Strategy, as well as update the Building Code Adoption Tracking portal to identify that status of building code adoption relative to climate hazards in a community. Finally, the initiative commits the federal government to expand its efforts to adopt above-code resilience and energy efficiency standards across federal buildings. The interagency initiative will be led by FEMA in conjunction with the Department of Energy, the Department of Housing and Urban Development and other relevant federal agencies.

ASCE is a long-time advocate for the widespread adoption and enforcement of modern, up to date building codes. Since the passage of the bipartisan Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, ASCE has strongly encouraged federal agencies to incentivize the use of up-todate codes and standards and the organization applauds the announcement of the National Initiative to Advance Building Codes.

Programs like FEMA's Building Resilience Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) grant program are already requiring the use of upto-date codes and standards and can serve as a model for other programs across the federal government. For example, the Department of Energy should require that any new projects dedicated to modernizing and hardening the electric grid follow ASCE 74, Guidelines for Electrical Transmission Line Structural Loading.

At the state and local level, we are already seeing localities adopt stronger building codes to combat the impacts of a changing climate. In the wake of Hurricane Harvey, the City of Houston voted to require all new construction in the city's floodplains be built two feet above the 500-year floodplain. Florida, meanwhile, has made a series of updates to their building codes over the past twenty years, including the mandated use of stronger nails, relocation of vents, and more thorough inspection processes. These are strong examples of how codes can be modernized and ASCE standards can be incorporated to strengthen a city or state's resilience.

Other ASCE documents and standards that the National Initiative to Advance Building Codes should urge states and localities to adopt to enhance resilience include:

- ASCE 7, Minimum Design Loads and Associated Criteria for Buildings and Other Structures (ASCE/SEI 7-22), currently an integral part of U.S. building codes, describes the means for determining soil, flood, tsunami, snow, rain, atmospheric ice, earthquake, and wind loads, and their combinations for resilient structural design;
- ASCE 24, Flood Resistant Design and Construction, prescribes a standard for cost effectively increasing resiliency by reducing and eliminating risks to property from flood hazards and their effects;
- ASCE 41, Seismic Evaluation and Retrofit of Existing Buildings, standardizes methods for the retrofit of existing buildings to increase resiliency in communities after a seismic event;

## A Guide To Small Business Loans For Minorities

There are more than 11 million minority-owned businesses in the U.S, and this figure has grown by more than 100% in the last decade. These businesses generate more than \$1.8 trillion in revenue and employ 6.3 million workers.

Despite this entrepreneurial boom, one factor continues to limit the establishment, expansion, and growth of minority-owned businesses: access to capital. Capital is what allows companies to stay competitive in the marketplace. It takes money to make money, but minority business owners have a hard time getting the cash they need.

On average, minorities are less likely to receive loans, and when they do, they receive lower dollar amounts and higher interest rates.

Yet, not all hope is lost. The Senate recently introduced a bipartisan committee aimed at closing the funding gap for minority-owned and women-owned businesses. It will take time to pass this type of legislation, but it's a small step in the right direction for fairer minority business loans

Although the small business financing landscape has a long way to go before the playing field is equal for minorities, there are a handful of small business loan programs designed specifically for minority business owners. In addition, there are certain resources and business grants available exclusively to minorities.

If you are a minority business owner and are interested in financing to help grow your business, take a look at the following funding options.

#### What are minority small business loans?

Minority small business loans are loans designed specifically to make capital more accessible for small businesses owned and operated by minorities

There isn't one singular type of small business loan designed for minority business owners. Business loans specifically for minorities can come from multiple loan providers, including the SBA, microlenders, or nonprofit organizations

And while financing options designed exclusively for minority business owners can be great op-

portunities to access growth capital, they should always be considered alongside all financing available options.

#### Who qualifies for minority small business loans?

Small business loans for minorities are typically allocated towards businesses in which a majority owner (often defined as at least 51% ownership) belongs to a specific minority group.

Requirements vary per lender, so it's important to check the fine print. While some minority business loan programs may also require all business members to be part of a minority group, most programs only require the owner(s) to belong to a specific minority group.

The goal of minority business loans is to level the playing field for minority-owned firms and improve their chances of accessing the necessary capital to start, operate and grow their businesses

#### Minority business funding: what are my options?

Let's take a closer look at loans available for minority business owners.

#### **Minority SBA loans**

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) offers several loan programs for various purposes, some of which are designed specifically for underserved communities.

#### Small Business Administration 8(a) Business **Development Program**

The 8(a) Business Development Program is designed specifically for disadvantaged small businesses. The SBA 8(a) program does not actually offer loans-rather, minority or disadvantaged business owners who participate in the SBA's 8(a) Business Development program have a better chance of qualifying for SBA loans.

So, then, what does the 8(a) Business Development program offer to minority business owners?

Each year, the government reserves a certain percentage of federal contracting dollars for businesses participating in the 8(a) program. This reservation means you:

Have access to contracts with limited competition

- . Get access to a specialist to help you navigate federal contracting
- Receive management and technical assistance

In addition to your business being at least 51% owned and controlled by U.S. citizens who are economically and socially disadvantaged, there are a few other requirements to qualify for the SBA 8(a) Business Development program:

- Have a personal net worth of 250,000 or less.
- Be involved in the management of day-today operations.
- Possess \$4 million or less in assets.

You'll also need to get certified as an 8(a) small business before you can participate in this program. You can learn more here.

#### **SBA Community Advantage Loans**

SBA Community Advantage loans fall under the 7(a) umbrella and are administered by community-based lenders. They are available to entrepreneurs in underserved markets who need anywhere between \$50,000 and \$250,000 in financing. Community Advantage loans for minority business owners are guaranteed up to 85% for a \$250,000 loan, with interest rates typically falling between 7% and 10%.

SBA Community Advantage Loans are structured as term loans. This means that they have a specified repayment schedule and either a fixed or variable interest rate.

Community Advantage (CA) Lenders must make at least 60% of their loans in underserved markets. Underserved markets include:

- Low-to-moderate income communities
- Businesses where more than 50% of the full-time workforce is low-income
- Veteran-owned businesses
- Rural areas

#### Microloans

Small businesses and nonprofit child care centers can borrow anywhere from \$500 to \$50,000 through the SBA Microloan program.

The average SBA microloan is \$14,434 with a 6.5% interest rate and a six-year repayment schedule. While anyone can apply, the Microloan program is designed to assist new and early-stage businesses, particularly those owned by women, low-income, veteran, and minority small business owners

Minority-owned businesses received 51.5% of the Microloans issued in 2020, while womenowned businesses received 46.6%.

#### **Union Bank's Business Diversity** Lending Program

Union Bank's Business Diversity Lending program is designed to provide loans to minority business owners of up to \$2.5 million. It requires minority or women entrepreneurs to "own and actively manage at least 51% of the business" seeking funding. The company also needs to have been open for at least two years and must have annual sales below \$20 million.

#### Accion

Accion's nonprofit community organization offers term loans for minorities ranging from \$300 to \$1,000,000 for both established and new businesses. While Accion doesn't exclusively fund minority-owned ventures, over 60% of their borrowers come from minority communities. Fixed rates range from 7% to 34% APR depending on vour credit score and other criteria.

#### The National Minority Supplier Development **Council Business Consortium Fund**

Certified by the U.S. Department of the Treasury as a Community Development Financial Institution, the Business Consortium Fund (BCF) works to make financing more accessible for minority business owners through various programs.

Minority business owners can borrow anywhere from \$75,000 to \$500,000 from the BCF through their Direct Lending Program (in the form of either a term loan or line of credit). To be eligible, you must certify your business as a minority business enterprise through the National Minority Supplier Development Council (NMSDC).

### Mayor London Breed Announces Groundbreaking of Critical Infrastructure at Sunnydale and Hunters View HOPE SF Sites

Mayor London N. Breed announced the City has made major progress on the effort to revitalize the Sunnydale and Hunters View public housing developments as part of HOPE SF, a community development initiative that will provide more than 5,000 new or rebuilt units across four public housing sites. Construction, funded by \$58.9 million in City funds, has begun on extensive infrastructure improvements across both sites to prepare for the construction of more than 280 new affordable units, a new park, 60,000 square feet of community-serving commercial space, as well as new roads, landscaping, sidewalks, and public utilities.

"As we continue to emerge from the pandemic, we need to ensure that we are delivering on our promise to provide high-quality, affordable housing for long-time San Franciscans," said Mayor Breed. "I am proud of the progress that has been made at each of our HOPE SF sites, but the work is not done. This critical infrastructure brings these projects one step closer to completion and that much closer to transforming these neighborhoods for both current and future residents."

San Francisco's HOPE SF initiative, established in 2007, is the nation's first large-scale community development and reparations initiative aimed at creating inclusive, mixed-income, and thriving communities without the mass displacement of existing residents. The goals for the four HOPE SF sites of Alice Griffith, Hunters View, Sunnydale-Velasco, and Potrero Annex-Terrace, include:

- Building racially and economically inclusive neighborhoods
- Recognizing the power of residents to lead their communities
- Increasing economic and educational advancement
- Promoting healthy communities

All HOPE SF projects aim to center residents first and change systems and shift power to ensure San Francisco is a racially and economically inclusive city.

"As we continue to revitalize our Hope SF properties and push for more affordable housing across San Francisco, these critical funds will help our city keep the promises made to this community," said Supervisor Shamann Walton.

The City's investment of \$58.9 million in the infrastructure improvements of Sunnydale HOPE SF Phase 1A3 and Hunters View HOPE SF Phase 3, of the multi-phased development, will help transform these sites into unified mixedincome communities. The scope of the infrastructure work includes the abatement of asbestos in the foundational piping of the previously

existing buildings, foundation demolition, rough grading of all parcels, including future park sites, as well as landscaping and furnishings for new parks and other outdoor community spaces. A number of major street improvements are also underway, including the realigning and widening of streets, the addition of bike paths, and the installation of new public utilities such as street lights, water supply, and waste drainage.

#### **Hunters View HOPE SF**

Hunters View was the first public housing project to be redeveloped in the HOPE SF program. Construction Phases 1 and 2, completed in 2013 and 2017, included the development of two new parks, new roads, sidewalks, and public utilities; dedicated social and supportive services offices, including a childcare center and wellness center; and 286 units of affordable housing, featuring 214 public housing replacement units and 69 additional affordable units, all of which have been fully occupied since 2018.

#### Sunnydale HOPE SF

The Sunnydale HOPE SF project includes the complete revitalization of the existing 50-acre Sunnydale-Velasco Housing Authority site. To date, 222 affordable units have been completed with 75% of them designated as public housing replacement units for Sunnydale residents. "These infrastructure improvements are the foundation of revitalization of our HOPE SF communities.

In partnership with San Francisco Office of Economic and Workforce Development (OEWD), the developers have set and exceeded goals to hire city and HOPE SF residents as well as locally owned small businesses as construction partners. To date, 740 San Francisco residents and 60 HOPE SF residents have been hired onto construction teams working on the revitalization projects.

The effort to secure the procedural approvals required for Sunnydale HOPE SF Phase 1A3 and Hunters View HOPE SF Phase 3 infrastructure to start construction was led by the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development (MOHCD) and the San Francisco Office of Economic and Workforce Development (OEWD), in collaboration with the San Francisco Housing Authority (SFHA), San Francisco Public Works, the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission, the San Francisco Fire Department, the San Francisco Planning Department, San Francisco Recreations and Parks, the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency and the Department of Building Inspection. This multi-agency partnership represents Mayor Breed's directive for City agencies to work collaboratively which is crucial for delivering high-quality affordable housing across all HOPE SF developments and speeding up the relocation of residents into desperately needed replacement housing.



ASCE Manual of Practice 140, Climate-Resilient Infrastructure: Adaptive Design and Risk Management, provides guidance for and contributes to infrastructure analysis/design in a world in which risk profiles are changing due to climate change per the Fourth National Climate Assessment.

Additionally, while ASCE will continue to work with the Administration and federal agencies to incentivize the use of up-to-date codes and standards. ASCE supports the development, adoption, and enforcement of a national model code as a key method of minimizing climate impact and creating disaster resilience in communities. Furthermore, ASCE urges Congress to provide robust funding to those federal agencies like National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), FEMA, and the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) whose mission includes both developing the data necessary for ensuring standards can address the impacts of climate change and preparing and implementing a national model code that considers increasingly strong storms.

ASCE will continue to work with the Administration, federal agencies, and state and local governments on the adoption of updated building codes and standards and applauds the White House for understanding the importance of updated codes to infrastructure resilience.
