

Business leaders urge legislators to pass \$180 billion infrastructure plan

California business leaders overwhelmingly support Gov. Gavin Newsom’s \$180 billion infrastructure proposal that would equip the state to build vital projects faster, while creating an estimated 400,000 construction-related jobs.

Nearly 90 nonpartisan business associations representing all sectors and regions of California signed a letter this week urging swift passage of all 10 bills in the governor’s plan. The association leaders, listed below, cited the urgent need for investments to upgrade the state’s aging infrastructure, spur creation of good-paying jobs and help meet ambitious climate goals.

The letter was delivered to all members of the California State Legislature by the New California Coalition (NCC), a nonpartisan civic movement that advocates for common-sense solutions to improve statewide livability.

The governor’s sweeping plan includes provisions that modernize a state environmental law long weaponized to sabotage essential infrastructure and housing projects. It caps certain lawsuits filed under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) to nine months, mirroring a “shot clock” solution advanced by NCC and its network of statewide partners.

The plan will also supercharge the creation of semiconductor manufacturing jobs in California. NCC was an early and vocal booster of efforts to improve California’s competitiveness for fund-

Building Environmental Resilience in Oakland: Strengthening the City's New Environmental Justice Element

While news cycles tend to focus exclusively on big stories out of Washington, D.C. or state capitols, local city governments play a significant role in our everyday lives. From broad decisions like where and what type of housing, parks and transportation systems we see in our neighborhoods to specific details like building permits and driveway construction approvals – city government impacts us more than we may think. This became much more apparent to me when I learned about the General Plan Update process, a local political process to create one of the key guiding documents that inform city government decisions about housing, transportation, safety, land use, parks, conservation and so much more.

What is a General Plan?

General Plans are planning documents that California's city and town governments are required to comprehensively update every 15 to 20 years. This planning document serves as a municipal "constitution" that sets ground rules for local government and guides future development

and conservation efforts. And when developed thoughtfully and in partnership with local communities, these plans can help create a blueprint for the future community members want to see.

Oakland has been my home for 27 years and, in that time, I've witnessed drastic changes that often felt out of my control. Motivated by a desire to understand more about how General Plans are developed and a curiosity about what that meant for the future of my hometown, I attended a Housing Element workshop hosted by the City in February 2022. These workshops are a space for the General Plan team and City staff to share more about the General Plan and gather community member feedback.

After attending the Housing Element workshop and hearing community members' voice their priorities around Housing First policies, social housing, and eliminating single family zoning, I realized that I had already read about the General Plan when I started my position as the Oakland Program Manager for Capacity Building at Greenlining six months prior. During my landscape analysis to learn more about past and present climate campaigns in Oakland, I came across an article about The Oakland People's

Plan (TOPP), a people's proposal for Oakland's General Plan Update.

This article and workshop catalyzed a year-long deep dive into General Plans, Oakland community plans and ultimately, Oakland's Environmental Justice Element.

What is an Environmental Justice Element?

Housing is just one element, or topic, of the City of Oakland's General Plan Update. Other topics include Land Use and Transportation; Safety; Open Space, Conservation and Recreation; Infrastructure and Facilities; and Noise. In March, the City released their Draft Environmental Justice Element, which focuses on strategies, policies, and actions to achieve a series of goals in Oakland's "Environmental Justice Communities," the neighborhoods most impacted by pollution and the harmful effects of climate change. Due to environmental racism, the racial wealth gap, and racist planning policies like redlining, these communities are most often communities of color and low-income communities.

To address these systemic barriers EJ communities in Oakland face, the goals in the City's EJ Element aim to alleviate the existing impacts

while building community resilience for the future. The guiding goals for Oakland's EJ Element include:

- Reducing Pollution Exposure and Improving Air Quality
- Promoting Safe, Healthy, and Affordable Homes
- Expanding Healthy Food Access
- Promoting Equitable Public Facilities
- Promoting Physical Activity
- Fostering Engaged Communities and Supporting Community Power and Capacity Building
- Expanding Economic Development, Income Equality, and Opportunity
- Prioritizing Improvements and Programs that Meet the Need of Environmental Justice Communities

To Be a Real Ally, You Need to Support Black Employees Beyond Juneteenth. Here's How.

For Black and brown folks, Juneteenth has long been of great significance and for many is considered the true day of emancipation of enslaved African Americans. Many have celebrated this holiday and honored the real racial history for some time. For white folks, this was something many likely learned in the summer of 2020 or are just now learning about as it hits the news cycle more and more.

Much like Earth Day, Black History Month, Women's History Month, Equal Pay Day and other similar holidays, many companies and entrepreneurs will acknowledge and celebrate Juneteenth but then forget about doing any work toward the same goals afterward. Especially as it's a relatively new holiday celebration, many may not even plan to acknowledge it to begin with. It is critical to implement a long-term commitment to elevating Black voices as an ally beyond just June 19th every year.

If you're one of the 9% of organizations that has Juneteenth as a paid holiday, this is the time to

reflect and take real action. This is how successful organizations have implemented programs that support Black communities year-round:

- Effective mentorship programs or accelerator programs for Black employees
- Paid leadership positions for Black Employee Resource Group (ERG) leaders with a budget for the ERG outside of Black History Month and Juneteenth
- Set measurable goals to boost Black leadership representation

Effective mentorship programs or accelerator programs for Black employees

A critical systemic issue facing Black employees is a lack of representation in leadership. When leaders that are majority white men make decisions about who to promote, they often don't have strong relationships with Black employees. This lack of exposure creates a self-fulfilling bias that Black employees don't want to be promoted or that they are not as talented. Skin color does not dictate motivation or talent, access to resources and support does.

- New Hire:** General contractor and/or its subcontractor must hire at least 1 New Hire Apprentice 2 (NHA) for the first \$1M of construction bid value. For each additional \$5M (beyond the first \$1M), at least 1 additional New Hire Apprentice shall be hired. Each NHA must work at least 500 hours, unless waived by Social Justice Committee.

Contractors can obtain up to half credit towards the above goals by utilizing LIA apprentices "off-site" (i.e., non-MAPLA projects). Contractors using lower tiered subcontractors are responsible for ensuring their compliance with the local workforce hiring goals. The goals apply to contractors at all tiers who work on MAPLA covered projects.

Social Justice Fund: The Port of Oakland Maritime and Aviation Project Labor Agreement (MAPLA) contains a provision (Section 6.4) that requires contractors to pay into the Social Justice Labor Management Cooperation Trust Fund. Contractors shall pay thirty cents (\$0.30) per hour worked or paid into the Social Justice Trust Fund established.

DoorDash's Elevate program is a career accelerator designed specifically for high-potential women of color. As a part of Elevate, they complete a six-month cohort experience, including:

- One-on-one coaching sessions with an external executive coach
- Executive sponsor meetings with company directors and C-suite members
- Career workshops
- Attendance at leadership team meetings

The results are impressive with 38% of leaders being promoted within six months of completion. What's interesting about this case study is that it includes coaching, mentorship, training and sponsorship. It's a holistic approach to developing talent — and quickly. This is important because when organizations create space for meaningful interaction

between senior leaders and aspiring high-potential talent, biases are negated and relationships flourish, leading to higher promotion rates of often overlooked top talent.

Paid leadership positions

McKinsey & Co. reported that 90% of Fortune 500 companies have ERGs. Most commonly for women and people of color, ERGs exist to create safe places for marginalized groups to connect, learn and grow. The challenge is that most ERG leaders also have day jobs, where they're doing the ERG work in their "free time." McKinsey further shows a 24% improvement in the perception of inclusion when they people are a part of an effective ERG.

ing unlocked by passage of the federal CHIPS and Science Act. A Dec. 2022 report published by NCC examined how California could address workforce and regulatory barriers — including project delays caused by CEQA lawsuits — to help the high-cost state leverage its many competitive advantages.

"We strongly support this plan that will speed up construction, expedite court review, smooth permitting and address the abuse of the CEQA process that has halted key projects," business leaders wrote in their letter.

"The 88 diverse signatories and logos on this letter represent only one pillar of the state-wide base standing up this historic proposal.

Business leaders are proud to stand with labor, environmental and community groups to support Gov. Newsom's plan because it will improve everyday access to water, transportation, clean energy and other vital infrastructure needs," said NCC Co-Leader Tracy Hernandez, who also serves as Founding CEO of the Los Angeles County Business Federation "BizFed."

"Our grassroots advocacy campaign isn't over until this proposal is signed into law. NCC leaders will testify at committee hearings every day this week to remind legislators how delaying approval of this package will disproportionately hurt Californians with the greatest need," said NCC Co-Leader Jim Wunderman, who also serves as President & CEO of the Bay Area Council.

These skills are essential in the construction business. To build a stable property, contractors need to be on the same page.
