CalOSBA Invests \$25 Million for Launch of Nation's First Statewide Program

The California Regional Initiative for Social Enterprises (CA RISE) program will build capacity and provide capital to businesses that hire, train, and support California workers facing barriers to employment.

CalOSBA has selected its partners to build a first-of-its-kind program designed to accelerate economic inclusion by investing in the power of employment social enterprises (ESEs). CARISE (California Regional Initiative for Social Enterprise) will help ESEs statewide improve their business stability and advance the economic mobility of their employees by pairing technical assistance and advisory support with grant funding for participating businesses.

CalOSBA has selected non-profit REDF to serve as program lead responsible for technical assistance and counseling to California's ESEs or businesses that want to become an ESE. CalOSBA has also selected financing minorityled small business lender Lendistry to serve as the fiscal agent for administration of grants to eligible ESEs that complete REDF's counseling program. Governor Gavin Newsom approved \$25,000,000funding for CA RISE as part of the 2022-2023 state budget. ESE businesses employ, train, and support talented Californians overcoming barriers to employment, including people often overlooked by employers because of their experiences of homelessness, incarceration, or mental health and substance use challenges; refugees; survivors of domestic violence and trafficking; and youth who have been in foster care.

ESEs participating in CA RISE will receive customized, in-depth technical assistance to ensure the sustainability and success of their businesses and become eligible to apply for grant funding through the program. REDF will also work with ESEs to connect them with local public partners, training providers, and private sector employers. Eligible businesses include non-profits and for-profits that are organized as social purpose or benefits corporations and with a demonstrated track record of achieving specific outcomes related to economic inclusion, stability, and mobility.

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Mayor Breed Signs Balanced Budget that Delivers Key City Priorities

Mayor London N. Breed signed San Francisco's \$14.6 billion Budget following final approval by the Board of Supervisors during Tuesday's meeting. Mayor Breed was joined by Budget Chair Supervisor Connie Chan, members of the Board of Supervisors, and other City officials at a signing ceremony on the Mayor's Balcony at City Hall.

"Our agreement with the Board of Supervisors delivers a budget that builds on the core priorities that San Francisco residents deserve, while closing a significant budget deficit. Specifically, it will deliver critical public safety support for our neighborhoods," said Mayor Breed. "It will drive our economic recovery and revitalize Downtown. It will confront the City's fentanyl crisis, provide support for those struggling with homelessness, and create opportunities for all San Franciscans to thrive. I want to thank the members of the Budget Committee, including Chair Connie Chan, for their work on this agreement."

"This has been a challenging budget year and the work is not done. But let's take this one step at a time, today we can celebrate this milestone," said Budget Chair and Supervisor Connie Chan. "Tomorrow, let's get back to work, we have a tough road ahead of us."

Mayor Breed's two-year Budget builds on these strategic plans in her work to deliver a clean and safe City, drive the City's economic recovery, confront the City's fentanyl crisis, create opportunities for all San Franciscans to thrive, and ensure people have a safe and affordable place to call home.

Key priorities funded in the Budget, include the following:

Delivering A Clean and Safe City

The Budget makes significant investments in supporting Mayor Breed's Roadmap to Downtown's Future, as well as broadly supporting San Francisco's economic recovery.

To strengthen the economy and fill vacancies in the City, the Budget is balanced assuming tax incentives to keep existing businesses stable and to recruit new businesses to fill empty offices Downtown.

The Budget funds key programs to help fill empty storefronts, including investments in the Powell Street Corridor, the new Vacant to Vibrant program, which matches pop-up activations with property owners, and First Year Free, which waives all City fees for new small businesses in the year they open.

Prison to Employment: How California workforce development boards help... and why it matters

When that long countdown to the end of a prison sentence reaches zero, the door swings open. It will mean little, however, if that's the last open door an inmate sees.

Unlocking the entrance to the job market is essential for the 35,000 or more individuals released from California prisons yearly. It's also essential for the economy and for communities who feel the impact when those who are released fail to find solid employment and reoffend.

The Mother Lode Workforce Development Board, serving four counties straddling Central and Northern California, has taken an aggressive and innovative approach in leading former prisoners to those open doors.

Inside, Mother Lode has facilitated training and certification programs, as well as counseling. In a significant advance, it has opened job centers in the two prisons within their area, linked online to the CalJOBS site.

Mother Lode WDB also provided a lifeline to those on the outside, using grant money to offer training and certification.

While jobs, sustainable incomes and lowering the recidivism rate are all vital, the results of these programs are larger than those elements.

"It's too simple to say we help them get a job," says Dave Thoeny, executive director of Mother Lode WDB. "When we hear from people who have gone through, it's never, 'Thanks for helping me get a job.' It's 'Thanks for changing my life, for giving me a reason to get up in the morning.'"

Eric Kile, one of the success stories of the postrelease grant program, can attest to the transformation he underwent.

Kile battled drug dependency before and after his incarceration. He also had to fight through the self-doubt and lack of direction that comes with being in prison.

"You know, I probably didn't have big plans to be a part of society," he says. "I just wanted to get on with my life." After a couple of failed attempts at drug rehab, "it just clicked" on the fourth try, putting Kile in a position to find some direction. His job at a restaurant fell victim to COVID, but through a friend, he connected with the P2E (Prison to Employment) program.

A long-standing interest in the water treatment field was a perfect match for one of the available programs. In completing the academic portion and moving to work in the field, Kile found the kind of stability and trust that had been lacking in his life.

Kile credits the Mother Lode staff with helping him build a resume, polish his interview skills and navigate the application process.

Ana Yessica Guerrero is a social entrepreneur who dedicates her life to empowering first-generation Latinx students to reach their full potential. She is a proud immigrant from Mexico City and grew up on a ranch in Goleta, Calif. As a first-generation student herself, she had numerous aspirations and goals. Ana was an eager and determined scholar, yet she received little academic guidance and a lack of resources. Although Ana encountered greater difficulties in higher education, she went on to earn a bachelor's degree in sociology from the University of California, Berkeley. Then she obtained a master's degree and doctorate from the department of education at the University of California, Santa Barbara.

A business born of her challenges

Ana realized the challenges she endured in her academic journey were not unique, but

Emerging Energy Technologies Part 1: Leading with Equity for a Just Energy Future

If twenty years ago we asked what a clean energy future looks like, a sunny green field with a smattering of windmills and solar panels might have come to mind. Today, it's much more complicated. Industries are rolling out new technologies with bold claims about how they can save us from climate change, but in reality many of these solutions don't deliver as advertised or consider the people that are impacted. Even the clean technologies we have embraced, like solar, have profound equity implications.

As the country strives to define and work towards a just clean energy future, how can we ensure the transition does not replicate the same socioeconomic and environmental inequities created by the fossil fuel industry? How can we shape a new energy system that centers and is led by communities of color? One thing is for certain, if we take the same approach to the clean energy transition that we did with industrialization, we'll end up with the same results; people of color bearing the brunt of the burden in the new clean energy sacrifice zones.

While it is tempting to look to technology for quick climate solutions, many energy technologies, including carbon capture and storage, green hydrogen, and critical mineral mining, still run the risk of perpetuating harm to communities and the environment. Below are four guiding equity principles to consider before advocating for, investing in, or otherwise supporting these emerging technologies. We recommend using the principles to analyze the threats and potential opportunities of some of the latest technologies that have gained a buzz.

Greenwashing: A Tactic for Keeping the Fossil Fuel Industry Alive

The momentum toward clean energy gained steam with the passing of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act and Inflation Reduction Act,directing more than \$460B in investments toward local governments, businesses, organizations, and households implementing climate projects. While some of this money has gone towards tax incentives and grants for solar, electric vehicles and capacity building for community organizations, significant funding has also gone towards nascent technologies. This includes \$4.9B earmarked for carbon capture and storage or CCS projects from the IRA as well as \$9.5B dedicated to development of clean hydrogen initiatives under IIJA.

The IRA also allocates \$10B for the Qualifying Advanced Energy Project Credit program (48C) which provides investment tax credits to subsidize building hydrogen technologies, CCS, and critical mineral facilities. However, the danger is that fossil fuel industry players are using these technologies to craft false narratives of environmental good – or "green-

1. Provide direct benefits to priority communities

Clean energy solutions must benefit communities that have historically faced environmental injustices (e.g. reduces pollution in fenceline communities, improves energy affordability, reliability, and resiliency).

2. Eliminate harms to communities

Clean energy solutions should not negatively impact communities (e.g. reject projects that increase communities' exposure to pollution/toxic waste/emissions, increase energy burden, or encroach on community space).

3. Promote community-driven projects

Clean energy solutions should be community-led including robust community engagement process (e.g. multiple touchpoints throughout the project) and establish communities decisionmaking power (e.g. right for communities to reject a project).

4. Advance wealth-building opportunities for communities

Clean energy solutions should prioritize local labor, establish standards for high quality jobs, and support workforce development and targeted hiring for people traditionally left out of the clean energy workforce (e.g. people of color, women, migrants).

washing" – and continue to support the ongoing sale of fossil fuels.

Greenwashing isn't a new tactic for the fossil fuel industry. A utility in Washington faces a lawsuit after claiming "Natural gas is a clean, efficient, and reliable energy". In fact, natural gas disproportionately burdens lowincome communities of color with NOx emissions from leakages that cause serious health impacts and pose a safety threat. Fossil fuel companies use this same angle to mislead the public into thinking they are "greening" their companies by promoting carbon capture technologies at their facilities or hydrogen blending into gas pipelines.

One form of CCS known as point source air carbon capture, separates and captures CO2

emissions from fossil fuel-based power generation. The story from the fossil fuel industry claims this form of CCS is an emissions-free way to continue operating existing infrastructure as we transition. However, this narrative leaves out the fact that these technologies have proven to be ineffective at capturing carbon emissions and other harmful pollutants, while being expensive (money that could be going towards constructing proven decarbonization solutions and decommissioning polluting facilities), and potentially dangerous.

Fossil fuel companies also use hydrogen technology to greenwash their operations by proposing that blending hydrogen into existing gas pipelines is more climate-friendly. Whether it is hydrogen produced through renewable energy (aka "green hydrogen") or not, blending hydrogen into gas pipelines has no merit from an emissions reduction or cost effective perspective, and can actually be a safety risk at high blending percentages. This blatant misrepresentation of the viability of these technologies has, unfortunately, started to slip into policy – a hydrogen blending bill, sponsored by a gas utility company, was introduced in California this year. While this particular bill didn't make it into law, it was one among several green hydrogen bills introduced with many likely to come in the future.

Types of Capital for Construction Businesses

Construction companies need capital to get off the ground, stay in business, and keep growing. The term capital is used across industries to represent all of a company's financial assets, including cash, inventory, equipment, and more.

Several different types of capital — working capital, debt capital, and equity capital — are common in the construction industry. Construction companies need a solid understanding of capital to run a successful business.

In this article, we'll explain what construction businesses need to know about the different types of capital available — and how to use them.

What is capital?

Capital is a fundamental financial concept meaning anything that is able to generate value. Money, for example, is a basic form of capital because it can be used to invest and create more wealth. But capital can take many other forms: Human capital, for instance, is labor that can build wealth. Construction businesses may have equipment, materials, or technology that function as capital, too.

However, when most construction companies think about capital, they are almost always thinking about cash. That's because other forms of capital — like labor or equipment — can't generate value if you don't have enough cash to take on new jobs, acquire materials, or cover overhead.

Joshua Leyenhorst, a CPA at BasePoint who has worked with many construction companies, defines capital like this: "Capital is all of the financial resources available to start or maintain a construction company, including working capital, debt capital, and equity capital."

Each type of capital has a specific purpose for construction businesses as they get started or look to grow.

3 types of capital for construction

Construction companies need to know the differences between the three types of capital and why each one is useful for managing and growing a business. For most businesses, working capital will be front of mind, but debt capital and equity capital serve important purposes as well.

1. Working capital

Working capital measures the difference between a construction company's current assets and current liabilities. In other words, working capital highlights the financial prospects of a business in the short term.

Businesses whose assets (like cash, accounts receivable, inventory, or materials) exceed the value of their liabilities (like wages, debts, vendor payments, or overhead costs) have working capital to use to maintain or grow. On the other hand, companies that have liabilities exceeding their assets lack working capital and may have trouble making payments and staying afloat.



"Working capital evaluates the financial resources a company requires to operate the company," notes Joshua Leyenhorst. "It's something business owners need to consider over the course of the next year of operations. Many companies are only thinking in terms of the next month — the next two payroll periods or upcoming vendor payments — but stable companies typically have sufficient cash forecasts to project their working capital further out."

Working capital is the lifeblood of a construction business. Because payment for construction jobs may be weeks or months after work is already completed, companies must manage their finances carefully to maintain cash reserves for taking on new jobs.

In certain situations, a company's best option is to employ debt capital to finance certain expenditures, which helps keep working capital intact.

2. Debt capital

Debt capital is funding that a construction business acquires by borrowing, typically from banks or other lending institutions. By taking on debt, construction companies can defer payment on large purchases and use cash reserves for more immediate costs, like employee payroll or purchasing materials for a new job.

"In construction, debt capital is often used to purchase so-called 'capital assets,' which would include equipment, vehicles, and real estate," says Joshua Leyenhorst. "Often, the case is pretty strong to use debt financing for long-term assets, which frees up cash for operating expenses. However, companies need to be on the lookout for lender covenants or other restrictions that may make debt capital less attractive." Construction companies, just like individuals, need a credit history in order to borrow money. Frequently, companies start with a business credit card or another small line of credit that they pay back consistently in order to increase their creditworthiness. That way, as the need for credit increases, a business already has a demonstrated history of paying back debt.

Debt capital can be vital for managing cash flow in construction. Debt payments spread out the cost of a large purchase over time, enabling a construction company to continue to take on new jobs and bring in revenue to tackle the debt while still maintaining enough cash to pay operating costs and grow.
