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Biden-Harris Administration Awards Record-Breaking \$154.2 Billion in Contracting to Small Businesses

Administrator Isabella Casillas Guzman, head of the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) and the voice for America's 33 million small businesses in President Biden's Cabinet, announced that the Biden-Harris Administration exceeded its small business federal contracting goal, awarding 27.2 percent or \$154.2 billion in federal contract dollars to small businesses, an \$8 billion increase from the previous fiscal year. The share of contracts going to small businesses equates to 27.2 percent of total federal contracting funds. Combined with \$72 billion in subprime contracting goals, this historic spend has supported over one million jobs in the American economy.

Overall, the federal government exceeded its goal of 23 percent in prime contract dollars and earned an "A" on this year's government-wide Scorecard. Eleven federal agencies earned an "A+" for their agencies' achievements in small business contracting, and an additional ten agencies received an "A" grade. SBA sets contracting goals for each agency and works with govern-

ment buyers to ensure that they prioritize small businesses

"The Biden-Harris Administration set historic records in small business contracting, including the highest percentage spend to Small Disadvantaged Businesses and growth for our Servicedisabled Veteran Small Businesses, which has advanced competition, strengthened local economies, and supported job growth across the nation," said Administrator Guzman, "By expanding small business opportunities and building equity in federal procurement, we have helped to ensure that federal agencies can fully leverage the extraordinary talent and innovation delivered by our nation's entrepreneurs. Building on the major procurement reforms announced last year; the SBA will continue to further progress in all federal procurement goals so more entrepreneurs can grow their businesses with government contracts, including those presented by President Biden's Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act'

"This budget sets forth our priorities to deliver on the basic services our residents deserve, while also building towards a stronger future as we emerge from this pandemic," said Mayor London Breed. "The significant investments in this budget will strengthen our economic recovery, restore public safety, support workers and families, and build on efforts to reduce homelessness and address behavioral health. I want to thank Budget Chair Supervisor Hillary Ronen for working collaboratively through this process."

Key priorities funded in the budget, include the following:

Economic Recovery

The budget invests \$47.4 million over the two years to promote the City's economic recovery. This includes new direct support for small businesses, as well as new events, activations, public space improvements, and marketing efforts to

support areas that rely on workers, tourists, and other visitors. The funding proposal will also continue the City's existing Ambassador programs located in areas like Mid-Market, Union Square, Downtown, South of Market, and along the Embarcadero.

The budget also includes \$7.2 million over the two years to support an enhanced Tenderloin cleaning initiative, which will expand Public Works' current cleaning operations in the area. In addition to enhanced cleaning efforts, the budget includes \$4.4 million over the two years to support enforcement of the street vending ordinance, developed in partnership with the Board of Supervisors.

Public Safety and Alternatives to Policing

Since the beginning of COVID-19, the Police Department has experienced both a high rate of officer attrition and difficulty attracting new officers to the Department. To address this, the Budget funds a Police Hiring Plan to fill the

Administrator Isabella Casillas Guzman, head of the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) and the voice for America's 33 million small businesses and startups in President Biden's Cabinet, announced the establishment of two new federal advisory committees, the Invention, Innovation, and Entrepreneurship Advisory Committee (IIEAC) and the Investment Capital Advisory Committee (ICAC), to accelerate support for startups driving critical innovation across the U.S. and increase small businesses' access to patient capital.

"The Biden-Harris Administration recognizes that innovation and entrepreneurship are big driving forces of America's historic economic boom and will play key roles in our nation's transition to stable and steady economic growth and prosperity," said Administrator Guzman. "These new advisory committees will help us gain valuable insights into not only how the SBA can improve programs and policies to strengthen the innovation ecosystem across the nation, but also how the agency can better serve our customers while accelerating the flow of patient private and public capital to innovative startups and small businesses.

The advisory committees will consist of members with a diverse set of perspectives, experiences, and occupational backgrounds to provide advice and recommendations to the SBA on policy and programs. The IIEAC will focus on innovation commercialization, lab-to-market translation, and constructing a more equitable, inclusive federal innovation ecosystem. The ICAC will be geared toward developing a more inclusive investment ecosystem for small businesses and domestic private funds committing capital to small businesses with an emphasis on access to patient investment capital and affordable private long-term loans.

"One of the SBA's top priorities is to provide American main street small businesses and innovative startups with access to critical patient capital and R&D funds to advance innovation and support the small businesses located across communities in every corner of our country. The foundation of our support for innovation is the Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) program which, for 40 years, has served as America's Seed Fund, providing startups with the R&D funding necessary to pursue big ideas. Since 1958, the Small Business Investment Company (SBIC) Program has worked with private equity and private credit funds to accelerate the flow of patient capital and long-term loans to small businesses old and new across industries and geographies. The new federal advisory committees will foster dialogue and identification of opportunities to accelerate and diversify SBA's support for innovative startups and small businesses," said Bailey DeVries, Associate Administrator, SBA Office of Investment and Innovation. Mayor Breed Signs Balanced Budget that Sets San Francisco on Path to Recovery

City's approximately 200 vacant police officer positions. The budget supports this plan by providing:

- Academy Classes: Resources to support four academy classes in each fiscal year, backfilling a total of 220 officers over the two years.
- Recruitment: Adjusting entry-level step salary for incoming officers, making San Francisco a more competitive department compared to other Bay Area cities. The budget also provides funding to develop recruitment tools and strategies.
- Retention: Funding to offer retention bonuses to officers at 5- and 15-years of service to promote longevity and reduce the department's high attrition rate.
- Modernizing department functions and continuing to promote reform. In addition to funding the ongoing police reform work underway, the budget adds 12 new professional staff positions over the next

two years to continue reform work and sufficiently support Public Records Act requests.

The City made significant investments during the last budget cycle to develop new alternatives to law enforcement response strategies. This budget maintains investments for the Street Crisis Response Teams (SCRT), Street Wellness Response Teams (SWRT), and Street Opioid Response Team (SORT). Further expanding on these investments, the budget invests in strengthening community-based outreach teams to improve the City's response to non-emergency and non-medical calls for service that had been the responsibility of law enforcement previously. Enhancements include new Crisis Counselors, which will be embedded in the 9-1-1 Call Center and can help to respond to mental and behavioral health calls as part of the City's services-

Homelessness and Behavioral Health

The City has made bold new investments in homelessness and housing over the last several years through the Mayor's Homelessness Recovery Plan, which has helped the City experience a 15% reduction in unsheltered homelessness, according to the latest point-in-time count.

Building on these efforts, the proposed budget includes funding for ongoing operations of 410 new adult shelter beds in a non-congregate or semi-congregate setting that were acquired in the current fiscal year, as well as continuing operations for three Shelter-in-Place (SIP) hotels that would otherwise close at the end of 2022. The proposed budget also continues funding for Safe Sleep sites in the Mission and Bayview districts, a 70-unit cabin site on Gough Street, and adds one-time funding to create a new 70-unit cabin site in the Mission.

The budget also invests in strategies to end homelessness and provide housing subsidies for transgender and gender non-conforming (TGNC) residents who disproportionally face barriers to housing, services, and employment. These investments fund a citywide strategic goal to end Transgender Homelessness in the next five years.

The budget includes funding to continue the implementation of key aspects of Mental Health SF. Expanding the City's behavioral health treatment bed capacity remains a priority, and the budget includes \$57.5 million over the two years for the operation of newly-acquired bed facilities. This funding will support the goal of reaching 400 beds, greatly improving access to these services for those who need them most.

Labor and Wage Equity

The most significant, ongoing investment in the upcoming two-year budget is a \$240 million investment in the City's public and non-profit workforce. This includes providing a 10 percent wage increase over the period of the two-year budget for non-sworn City workers. The budget also fully restores a 3 percent wage increase for the City's sworn employee unions. It also increases wages for non-profit workers next fiscal year, in line with increases for public sector employees.

Black populations make up about 2% of Orange County, California's 3 million population, according to the U.S. Census Bureau. However, Jamila Moore Pewu, an assistant professor of history at Cal State Fullerton, is working with local museums and nonprofits on a digital mapping project that documents the past, present and future of Black-owned businesses and community organizations in Orange County.

The project, titled #Networked OC, honors the Black communities and Black-owned businesses that prospered throughout Orange County's history and is one of the first of its kind. Organizers said the project's research

is not just about communities of color, but is also done in cooperation with communities of

The project debuted at this year's Segerstrom Center for the Arts Juneteenth Festival with positive feedback from local community members

Moore Pewu says: "When documenting Black businesses, we aren't just talking about the businesses themselves, we're also talking about generational wealth and equity."

"There are a lot of communities that will not engage with university research for a lot of valid reasons like historical disenfranchisement and erasure. One of the things we're trying to emphasize with this project is that the public can meet with us, critique our work, and give us feedback. Then, we can go back to the drawing board.'

"People are now reaching out to get involved with our work at Cal State Fullerton. We are showcasing the work that we're doing because the community begins to respond to you in a

"You can very much ignore the history of certain groups, even more so in a digital environment. It's important for people to understand that a digital space doesn't erase our divides, it actually pronounces them even more. We have to work extra hard to engage with digital technologies in a way that is more equitable."

Budding Young Entrepreneur Bakes Up Success

At a recent small business popup event, I met the owner of Pryncess Treats, a small business founded during the pandemic. Pryncess Treats' owner and CEO is a six-year-old named Elysia. Elysia started Pryncess Treats because of her love of baking. After a business unit at school, she mentioned to her father that she thought she could create a small business to sell her banana muffins.

Charles, Elysia's father, wanted his daughter to learn business acumen, responsibility, and leadership and have fun while doing so. So, he told Elysia that if she wanted to sell her muffins, she needed to create a name for her business, design a logo, and create a business plan. It took Charles and Elysia nearly four months to research and comply with all the regulatory requirements of starting and owning a baking business.

The business launched in December 2021. Within 36 hours, Elysia sold seven dozen banana muffins. Elysia's marketing techniques included online marketing, popup events, and farmers markets. Charles took advantage of an SBA program from the Veteran's Business Outreach Center to learn about starting a small business. He and his wife are both active-duty military members and have other small businesses.

Digital presence is very important for new businesses such as Pryncess Treats. Having access to reliable internet and a computer to build a website were key to Elysia's success. Elysia was lucky that she lived in an area with reliable internet, but many small businesses in rural areas need assistance with access. Advocacy reviewed updates to loan and grant programs from USDA regarding broadband accessibility in rural areas that will help level the playing field.

Due to Pryncess Treats' success, Charles and Elysia are looking to expand their reach beyond their once-a-month baking popups. To do so they must overcome regulatory hurdles and additional administrative costs. Currently, Elysia is required to provide basic labeling that include the ingredients used in her products and any known allergens. Charles and Elysia are also careful about complying with sanitation requirements when baking.

As Pryncess Treats grows, Elysia will have to include nutritional information, calorie counts, and other information on her labels. This will create new costs and could potentially hinder growth. Elysia likes to try baking new products each month, and Charles is worried that redesigning and reprinting new labels will add to their overhead costs.

Advocacy attorneys are all too familiar with labeling requirements and the challenges they pose for small businesses. For instance, Advocacy worked with USDA on their proposed bioengineered food labeling requirements and the FDA's regulatory changes to the nutrition facts label to ensure that the requirements were not overly burdensome for very small businesses like Elysia's.

Charles also mentioned that current global supply chain issues have impacted Pryncess Treats. They have had to hunt to find the specialty ingredients they need for their products. This may also pose a challenge to expansion. If Elvsia and Charles are forced to substitute a product at the last minute due to unavailability, they will not be able to completely redesign their labels with the new ingredients. Having flexibility to place a sticker over an existing label or use a QR code so that the information can be provided on their website, will be key to the future success of Pryncess Treats. Such methods are already being used for some labeling requirements and Advocacy hopes that agencies will continue to use such technology

Pryncess Treats is one of many micro businesses that emerged during the pandemic. The success of these businesses is dependent on their ability to keep administrative costs low, while still ensuring the safety of their products. Advocacy attorneys work daily to ensure that agencies consider less burdensome alternatives while meeting their intended regulatory objectives. Through this work, Advocacy can ensure that the next generation of budding entrepreneurs such as Elysia have a fair chance at thriving and succeeding.

How to Win More Construction Bids in 2022

Are you looking to win more construction bids in 2022? Maybe you're planning to grow and scale your construction business in the new year or perhaps you're just looking to be more efficient in your estimating and bidding process to improve your bid-hit ratio.

What does it take to win more construction bids? Here are a few tips on how to bid smarter by going after the right opportunities to win more work.

Find Quality Construction Leads

You shouldn't bid on every opportunity that comes your way. You also can't sit around and expect project leads to come to you. Market your business to owners and general contractors you want to work with by showcasing your experience and expertise in your trade.

Reach out to your network to find out about upcoming opportunities. Take the time to get prequalified with general contractors or owners you want to work with, so you can receive more invitations to bid (ITBs). Make sure they know what trades you can perform and the types of projects you are interested in bidding on.

Take a proactive approach by utilizing as many tools as possible to ensure you are receiving quality leads. Word of mouth, bid boards, local contractors associations, and your subs and suppliers are all great sources for learning about upcoming bidding opportunities. Consider investing in a leads service with a searchable database, updated project details, and plans and specifications attached so you can focus on finding the right opportunities for your business.

Select the Right Projects to Bid

Winning construction bids on projects your business can't adequately perform can be just as costly as not winning them. Remember, it is never too late to abandon a bid—even after you've started working on it.

Once you start crunching the numbers you might discover that your company won't make a reasonable profit if you were to win the contract. The best thing to do is dump it and move on to the next project.

For example, you may discover during your bid preparation that your company cannot adequately handle the scope and requirements of the project. At that point, you need to make the smart business decision to walk away from the bid.

Finding the right balance between bidding and winning enough jobs can be difficult. On the one hand, you don't want to bid and win so much work that you can't properly manage and complete the projects you've been awarded. You also don't want too little work that you aren't making any money and your workers aren't staying busy.

Selecting the right work to bid is vital to maintaining a profitable business, which is why it's vital to have an established bid/no-bid decision-making process in place to win more construction bids.



Understand Your Bid-Hit Ratio

Are you keeping track of your bid-hit ratio? If not, you need to start. Your bid-hit ratio is the number of projects you must bid to win one job. Understanding your bid-hit can help you how many projects you need to be bidding to keep your pipeline full and weed out the opportunities that don't have a high probability of winning.

To really make your bid-hit ratio work for you to maximize your bidding efforts you need to do an in-depth analysis. Sort the projects you've bid and group specific categories. Consider things like public versus private work, building type, scope of work, geographic location, contract size, and the general contractor or owner of the project.

By categorizing and analyzing your bid-hit ratio, you get better insight into which types of projects to go after. For example, let's say your overall bid-hit ratio is 7:1. After performing your analysis you discover that your bid-hit ratio for medium-sized private office projects is 4:1 and your ratio for large, public school projects is 10:1.

In this scenario you have a better bid-hit ratio on the private office projects, so you should focus more effort on those opportunities and less time bidding on school projects.

Review Profitability

Now that you know the types of projects that you have the best opportunity of winning, it's time to look at profitability on those projects. Make sure you are recording accurate job costs for materials, labor, and equipment. Compare your actual costs to your estimates and ask the following questions:

- Were your estimates for labor and materials accurate?
- Did you include all the job costs in your estimate including like bonding, supplies, and equipment?

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- Did you factor in your profit and overhead mark-up correctly?
- Was your contingency budget adequate?

If your profit margins on projects aren't what you expected there are two possible reasons. Either your estimates are too low, or you are having productivity issues on the jobsite which is causing job costs to be higher. Regardless of which is the cause, you should work to resolve the issues to get your profit margins where they need to be.

By combining the data from your bid-hit ratios and your profit margin analysis you can hone in on the projects that you have the best chance of winning and make the most money on.

Conduct a Bid/No-Bid Review

Now that you're getting quality leads and you know the types of projects to pursue, it's time to start bidding, right? Not so fast, before you start investing your time into putting together a bid proposal you need to conduct a thorough bid/no-bid review of each opportunity.

The first thing to do is gather all the project documents, plans, and specifications and familiarize yourself with them. You want to make money, so crunch some quick numbers to determine whether you can make a reasonable profit on the project.

Next, determine whether you can perform the work if you win. Make sure you have the manpower and equipment available to start the job on time and complete it on schedule. Does your company have the experience and expertise to handle the size and the scope of the project? It's no good to anyone if you bid and win a job you can't complete.

Perform a risk assessment to determine if there are any red flags that might cause problems if you win the project like unknown site conditions, safety concerns, accelerated timelines,

and incomplete or inaccurate bidding docu-

Other factors to consider in your review should include project location, duration, competition, and client. Decide which criteria are most important to your company when selecting projects to bid and apply them to all projects you are considering bidding on.

Identify and Manage Risks

Identifying and managing risks is probably the most overlooked aspect of preparing a bid. Once you've identified the potential risks, you will need to analyze and evaluate each one individually so that they can be properly managed and mitigated.

Consider the probability of each identified risk and the impact it can have on the project. For example, a low-probability risk with a low impact might be easy to mitigate. But a high-probability risk with a high impact that you can't effectively manage could be detrimental to the project's profitability.

Identifying and evaluating possible risks associated with a project when preparing your bid will make you better prepared to handle a situation when something goes wrong.

By starting the process early, you can avoid bidding on projects that aren't profitable. It will also lead to more accurate bids with reasonable contingencies built in and result in your company winning more bids. Project management will run smoother, and you'll save time, money, and resources as work progresses.

Seek Clarifications, Avoid Assumptions

As you're preparing your bid, you need to do your due diligence to ensure that you have all the pertinent information, that the information is accurate, and that you have a complete understanding of this information.

Fully review the plans and specifications to determine everything required to bid on the project and complete the work. This includes knowing everything from what bonds are required to whether there are participation goals for minority business enterprises (MBEs) or if material substitutions are allowed in the bid. If you are unsure of any aspect of the project when preparing your bid, you should seek clarification from the architect, owner, or owner's representative.

Be aware that there are typically cut-off dates in place for questions to be submitted. This allows for the project team to make any changes to the plans and specifications and for any addenda to be issued to the bidders and plan holders.

If you are unclear on any aspect of the project, the onus is on you to get clarification. Making assumptions is no way to submit a winning bid. If you can't get your questions answered to your satisfaction, you might want to reconsider whether bidding the project makes sense.
