

Why Belonging Matters in Construction

Over the last few years, many architecture, engineering, and construction (AEC) companies have started to take a serious look at diversity, equity, and inclusion (DE&I) initiatives. While progress has been made, there's still a long road ahead.

What does belonging look like and mean to you in the construction industry?

Monique: I believe that belonging looks like people feeling a sense of community with those they work and interact with on a regular basis. It's finding common ground in some aspect of your work environment, and where you feel seen, heard, and respected. Overall, the construction industry still a very homogenous group; so I think belonging in the AEC industry looks like CREATING spaces for people to feel comfortable and be their authentic selves and encouraging everyone to try to get to know and find common ground with others outside of their regular circle.

Asia: In my opinion, belonging in the construction industry means that people you work with every day should feel included and accepted at work. People at your company should feel comfortable being their authentic self in the workplace and they should feel that their opinions are valued and heard.

Cliff: Feeling a sense of belonging is furthered by a shared sense of purpose and connection. If you have people in your organization that share

California finally regains jobs lost in COVID-19 recession

For months, Gov. Gavin Newsom habitually crowed about California's recovery from the recession that hit the state when he shut down much of its economy to battle COVID-19.

By cherry-picking monthly employment statistics, Newsom claimed that the state was leading the nation in job gains, even when California's unemployment rate was near the highest of any

state, topping out at 16.1% with more than 2.6 million Californians having lost their jobs.

Finally, however, Newsom can legitimately hail an almost full employment recovery. In July, the state's unemployment rate dropped to 3.9%, exactly the record-low number that California achieved in February 2020, just before he issued the first of his shutdown orders.

Total employment in July was still a bit lower than it was 28 months earlier, 18.8 million vs. 18.6 million, but the labor force was also a little

smaller, 19.5 million vs. 19.3 million, and virtually every private economic sector saw full employment recovery. Government was the only major sector still lagging, about 100,000 workers fewer than it had been.

"California is getting very close to fully recovering all the jobs it lost due to the pandemic," Taner Osman, research manager at Beacon Economics and the UC Riverside Center for Economic Forecasting. "In fact, if we repeat this month's job gains next month, we will reach that milestone."

"Californians are getting back to work with record low unemployment," Newsom said when July's data were released this month. "We have historic reserves and we're putting money back in peoples' pockets as we continue to lead the nation's economic recovery."

If there's any negative aspect to the latest data, it is that while 3.9% ties a record for low unemployment in California, it's still the nation's 38th highest, more than twice as high as No. 1 Minnesota's 1.9%, and substantially higher than

jobless rates in states Californians tend to see as economic backwaters, such as Mississippi and Alabama.

California's unemployment rate is also 1.2 percentage points higher than Florida's, a state that Newsom delights in disparaging, and only a tiny bit lower than the rate in Texas, another Newsom foil.

So, one might wonder, where does California's economy go from here?

There are some indications of economic softening. For example, state income tax revenues are running somewhat below the 2022-23 budget's expectations.

Economists are divided over the direction of the national economy — whether it's already in recession or on the cusp — in light of sharp increases in interest rates by the Federal Reserve System to counter runaway inflation.

Upticks in interest have already cooled what had been a red hot housing market in California, re-

Each year, the Greenbuild International Conference and Expo supports a Greenbuild Legacy Project, an effort to give back to the local community in gratitude for hosting some 10,000 attendees from across the country and around the world.

As we approach the 20th anniversary celebration of Greenbuild in San Francisco, California, the Greenbuild Host Committee proudly awards the 2022 Greenbuild Legacy Project to California Interfaith Power & Light (CIPL) for a neighborhood resilience hub project at Faith Baptist Church in the city of Oakland.

The award, which includes \$7,500 in funding raised through Greenbuild registration, will make possible the purchase and installation of a battery to support the solar array at Faith Bap-

tist Church. The Greenbuild Host Committee aims to raise and contribute another estimated \$10,000 in donations to extend the impact of the Legacy Project, providing CIPL and Faith Baptist Church with additional resources and support for expansion of the community resilience hub.

Faith Baptist Church's senior pastor, Curtis Robinson, is thrilled with the award, which he says will strengthen the community's resilience. "Central East Oakland is a community that resides on the margins, and the development of a resilience hub at Faith Baptist Church, with independent battery storage for clean energy from the sun, will help diminish environmental segregation in the neighborhood," says Robinson. "The funding that is needed to challenge climate justice is a very large and important task, and this award will help Faith Baptist Church raise consciousness for other local churches in the fight for educational, environmental and eco-

nomics in communities that face these challenges."

Faith Baptist Church's focus on serving the community will particularly benefit vulnerable demographic segments, such as older citizens and children, who are more adversely affected by poor air quality and energy disruption events. Data from CalEnviroScreen, provided by IPL, shows that the Havenscourt/Millsmont community suffers disproportionately from air pollution from surrounding industry, freeways and airports. These public health concerns are further aggravated by wildfire events, making the facility even more important for the local, predominantly Black community.

"With worsening wildfire seasons and higher temperatures, people throughout California are increasingly exposed to dangerous, smoke-filled air and heat impacts," Rebekah Kokalis explained in CIPL's application. "In low-income

communities already dealing with poor air quality, like East Oakland, these dangers are exacerbated by the fact that many are unable to sufficiently insulate their home or invest in high-quality air filters or air conditioning."

CIPL's project application stood out to the Greenbuild Host Committee—Legacy Project working group for its consistency in performance across all Legacy Project criteria, advancing all four of USGBC's core pillars through resilience, equity, health and wellness, and sustainability. In addition to serving the needs of the 700-person congregation, Faith Baptist Church aims to extend its support to the broader community by serving as a state-recognized resilience hub in the event of natural disasters.

The Greenbuild Legacy Project will add battery storage to support basic facility needs, using the existing solar array, resulting in a zero-energy,

the same values, this will increase their sense of belonging. That feeling will help them find joy and value in their work, ultimately giving them fulfillment.

Tell us about a time where you felt a sense of belonging in the construction industry?

Monique: I once worked for an architecture firm where most of the architects were women – at that time, a rarity in a firm that is not a women-owned business! We came from varying racial, geographic, and socioeconomic backgrounds, but we bonded around being women in the AEC industry who share some of the same challenges and goals. I'm still good friends with many of them even though we are all at different firms in different cities now.

Asia: My company recognized me during Women in Construction week this year on LinkedIn. This gave me a sense of belonging because I was given recognition and it made me feel like a valued member of the team.

Cliff: Numerous times, I felt a sense of belonging; that is why I love this industry and enjoy what I do. But, one particular time sticks out in my mind; I had just moved across the country to a new city where I did not have any family and

did not know anybody except my co-workers. I was still young in my career and made a costly mistake that negatively impacted the project, and my supervisor came down on me pretty hard. Typically, I am tough on myself, so I took the criticism pretty hard and questioned whether I belonged in this industry, at this company, and on that team. However, I was fortunate to have a mentor that took the time to sit down with me, provide me with words of encouragement and motivate me to keep pushing. The time he provided positively impacted my career and life; I don't know if I would be sitting here today if not for him.

What inspired you to become a champion for DE&I within the construction industry?

Monique: I have been in the AEC industry for about 20 years now, and I had grown accustomed to and, honestly, I expected to always be the "only" or one of a few in the office or at industry events. However, after the social unrest in 2020 after George Floyd's death, something awakened in me. I got angry, and I realized it was time to get my head out of the sand and start trying to make a difference. If I want to see more people like me in the office and at industry events, I need to contribute to making that happen. I need to be the change that I want to see!

Now I am very passionate about making sure that BIPOC and women see the construction industry as a place where they are welcomed; where they can thrive and succeed; and where they will find a sense of belonging.

Asia: When I first started working at JE Dunn in 2019, I was invited to participate in HBCU Campus Recruitment by our Diversity Manager at the time, Cherelle Cortez. Since then, I have been an active campus lead at multiple HBCUs helping us build relationships on campus and attracting diverse talent.

Cliff: Honestly, I don't consider myself a champion for DE&I. From a young age, I was taught to work hard, know the difference between right and wrong and stand up for what I believe in. I have carried those values and that work ethic throughout my life, so when I had the opportunity to advocate for the importance of diversity, equity, inclusion, and belonging in the construction industry, I didn't think twice about it. I am blessed to have a platform and honored to be considered a champion for DE&I.

As we know, continuing the conversation on DE&I is essential for change. What do you hope attendees will take away from your panel discussion?

Monique: My hope is that attendees of our panel discussion will leave with a passion for diversity and inclusion, whether it's new-found or stoking a fire that is already burning within them. My goal is to make sure they have the tools and resources to start and/or continue those DE&I conversations in their own organizations.

Asia: I hope attendees will be more encouraged to take more DE&I initiatives at their own workplace. I hope our personal experiences and stories that we share motivates attendees to be an ally in the workplace others. Speak up if you see someone making someone else uncomfortable. Plan team activities that everyone can be apart of and enjoy. Make people on your team feel comfortable to be their unique selves.

Cliff: I want attendees to leave the panel discussion excited, empowered, and inspired. Excited about the advancements our industry has achieved so far, empowered to continue to push for change, and inspired to get involved in improving our industry and support each other. We have come a long way, but we have much more progress to make!

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

California named as one of the best places for remote work in the United States

- Vineyard Haven (MA), Faribault-Northfield (MN) and Truckee-Grass Valley (CA) are the very best places in the US for remote work;
- Compared to pre-pandemic levels, remote working in US cities increased by 23.8%;
- 70.2% jobs in urban areas could partially move operations remotely;
- DC, Colorado and Oregon have the highest proportion of remote workers;
- The worst states for working remotely are Mississippi, Puerto Rico and Louisiana.

Vineyard Haven in Massachusetts is the best place in the US for remote work, where 17.7% of employees aged 16 and over reported working from home. Faribault-Northfield, Minnesota, and Truckee-Grass Valley, California, follow closely behind, with 16.6% and 16.2% remote workers, respectively.

Conversely, less than 1% of the jobs in Dumas (Texas), Atmore (Alabama), Magnolia (Arkansas) and Blytheville (Arkansas) are home-based. These are the worst cities in the US for offering remote employment opportunities.

The study, carried out by IT Service Management company SysAid, analysed the data from the latest American Community Survey for 938 micropolitan and metropolitan areas in the US between 2015 and 2020, for civilian workers aged 16 and above. The researchers discovered that, on average, only 5.35% jobs in US cities were remote, including in the first year of the pandemic. However, employers in urban areas still took a significant leap towards remote working.

Compared to the five-year period before the pandemic, 23.84% more people switched to working from home. This represents five times more than the previous period, when the yearly pace at which people were switching to remote working was of 4.67%.

DC, Colorado and Oregon are the top three most remote-friendly US jurisdictions, with 12.3%, 10.8% and 9.4% remote workers respectively. Meanwhile, the worst states on record for adopting remote working are Mississippi (3%), Puerto Rico (3.1%) and Louisiana (4.2%).

SysAid also analysed which industries in all US urban areas could move partly or largely towards remote work. The research shows that, while 10.6% of the jobs in sectors like agriculture, mining and construction require mostly an on-site presence, 70.2% could partially be done remotely. Another 19.2% of industries, such as information, professional, scientific and administration services, could easily accommodate to moving most of their operations off-site.

A spokesperson for SysAid commented on the findings: "It is very surprising that, on average, only one in 20 American city dwellers works remotely. We expected this number to be much higher, considering the importance of social distancing at the beginning of the pandemic.

"Industries such as finance, insurance and most professional consulting could easily adopt a remote work model with the right IT system in place. Even industries like manufacturing can automate chain supply processes more efficiently, for example, so that more employees can manage tasks from any computer. Similarly, all admin jobs can easily be streamlined through better ticketing automation, with one centralized hub to connect across all departments to offer flawless customer service. Having worked with small to Fortune 500 companies along the years, we have found that education, healthcare, manufacturing and HR are the most convertible sectors towards remote or hybrid work models."

self-sustaining facility. The addition of the battery will ensure that even on overcast or smoky days, the building can adequately provide clean air to community members.

CIPL and the church aim to share lessons learned with other projects in the country, a goal that resonated with the Greenbuild Legacy Project working group. Faith Baptist Church and CIPL will host workshops discussing the impacts of climate change on their neighborhood and how to adapt to these changes. Another partner, Green the Church, will use this project as a model to

create a guide for other congregations on how to become resilience hubs. The guide will then be distributed among all three organizations. The resilience hub will also become a source of education and awareness for environmental sustainability, carbon reduction and resilience for the community.

Susan Stephenson, executive director of Interfaith Power and Light, says the team is feeling exceptionally blessed and grateful for the support. "Our mission is to mobilize people of faith and conscience to take bold and just action on climate change, and it is a privilege to take action with Faith Baptist Church to advance cli-

mate justice. As a community that has been historically marginalized socially and economically, the creation of a local resiliency hub will greatly advance the community's climate resiliency, support the community during wildfires and other disasters, and provide resources to safeguard the health and well-being of the most vulnerable within the community," she says.

California finally regains jobs lost in COVID-19 recession

ducing the pool of would-be buyers by increasing monthly mortgage payments.

We know from past experience that when the nation's economy catches a cold, it quickly turns to pneumonia in California and that a serious drop in the stock market due to rising interest rates would have a disproportionately negative impact on California's budget.

About three-quarters of the state's general fund revenues come from personal income taxes and the top tiers of taxpayers generate the vast majority of those taxes, largely from their gains in the stock market and other investments.

In the shorter run, however, economic expansion may be hindered by an increasingly acute shortage of workers. The proliferation of help-wanted signs in California attests to the troubling fact that relatively few working-age adults are either employed or are available for work. The state's "labor force participation rate" of 61% is two percentage points lower than it was a decade ago and one of the nation's lowest.

Governor Newsom Signs Legislation to Improve Working Conditions and Wages for Fast-Food Workers

Governor Gavin Newsom announced that he has signed landmark legislation to empower fast-food workers with new wage and workplace protections to support their health, safety and welfare.

AB 257, the Fast Food Accountability and Standards Recovery Act by Assemblymember Chris Holden (D-Pasadena), authorizes the creation of the Fast Food Council comprised of representatives from labor and management to set minimum standards for workers in the industry, including for wages, conditions related to health and safety, security in the workplace, the right to take time off from work for protected purposes and protection from discrimination and harassment.

"California is committed to ensuring that the men and women who have helped build our world-class economy are able to share in the state's prosperity," said Governor Newsom. "Today's action gives hardworking fast-food workers a stronger voice and seat at the table to set fair wages and critical health and safety standards across the industry. I'm proud to sign this legislation on Labor Day when we pay tribute to the workers who keep our state running as we build a stronger, more inclusive economy for all Californians."

Members of the Fast Food Council at the Department of Industrial Relations will include fast food workers and their advocates, franchisees, franchisors and representatives from the Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development and the Department of Industrial Relations.

Under the Newsom Administration, California has made important strides to support workers and advance workplace safety. Last year, the Governor signed legislation to protect warehouse workers from unsafe production quotas and nation-leading legislation to end exploitative piece-rate compensation for garment industry workers. The Governor also signed a measure directing Cal/OSHA to create an advisory committee to recommend state policies to protect domestic workers and a bill to ensure that workers with disabilities are paid a fair wage. In 2019, the Governor signed legislation giving child care workers the right to join a union and collectively bargain with the state.

Lucas & Marcia, Universal Art Gallery

Lucas and Marcia Da Silva, owners of the Universal Art Gallery in Los Angeles, have been in the custom art framing business for 16 years, and were facing an all too familiar problem: the need to expand versus the fear of an uncertain economy.

The custom picture framing industry is cyclical; although the Da Silvas have many clients ranging from corporate to retail and wholesale, the turnaround time combined with the accounts receivable terms were leaving the Universal Art Gallery owners looking for funds to bridge the gap and to purchase more equipment to speed up production.

“We approached several banks and everyone said they are not doing loans right now. The banks got financial assistance from the government but we didn’t and we needed help,” said Lucas Da Silva. “It seemed like no one was willing to help.”

That’s when Mr. Da Silva decided to contact VEDC for a small business loan. With the help of VEDC and a Citywide Small Business Loan the Universal Art Gallery was able to purchase new equipment allowing them to shorten their project turnaround, giving them the flexibility to take on more projects.

“VEDC stepped up during a critical time.” noted the Universal Art Gallery co-owner. “We were

afraid to deplete all our funds during this uncertain economy but with the Citywide Small Business Loan we have been able to purchase new machines and expand our business. We have also been able to take on new employees. We’re even looking at the possibility of buying another delivery van.”

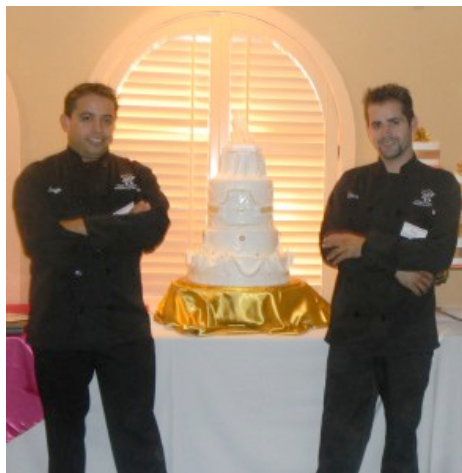
Jorge and Oscar Flores, Don Polvoron Bakery

In the mid-2000s, Jorge Flores worked for a company that imported stuffed animals and promotional materials from China and distributed them across the country. When the job moved from San Francisco’s East Bay area to Stockton, the 1.5-hour commute was too much. Then the owner downsized.

Meanwhile, his brother Oscar had been working for a bakery owned by his godfather. Over eight years, Oscar came to run the bakery and loved what he was doing. When his godfather passed away, the family took over but didn’t have experience running a bakery. The problems started.

Tired of driving, in 2005 Jorge sold his house and approached his brother Oscar about opening their own place. They bought a donut shop and Don Polvoron Bakery was born. Jorge would run the sales side and Oscar would be in charge of baking. The shop was in a mostly Latino area so instead of donuts, they catered to the local population. Instead of closing at 2:00 pm, they expanded their hours to open at 5:00 am and to close at 9:00 pm. They attracted a loyal clientele in the morning – the gardeners, construction workers, and other early risers. They wanted breakfast. Then Jorge asked them “what else do you need,” and the answer was “something to eat

over there.” So Jorge added sandwiches.

The bakery became popular. In the afternoons, the families came. Jorge listened to customers who wanted him to sell other drinks besides coffee. The bakery started to sell homemade hot chocolate and champurrado, a traditional Mexican hot drink made of corn flour, milk, vanilla, and cinnamon.

The first two years were really hard – waking at 3:00 a.m., arriving home late, and not making much profit. The worst was when a piece of equip-

ment broke and there were no funds to fix it. Jorge found the money somehow, even though the bank wasn’t an option because of credit issues. But the brothers worked hard. Jorge told his wife, “there will be good times and bad times.”

Jorge still wanted to do better, so he began taking cake-making classes. He learned to work with fondant, experimenting, researching ways to improve his craft. Jorge started getting requests for cakes he never had baked. He never says “no, I can’t.” If he doesn’t know how he figures it out and finds out how to do it right.

For example, he learned how to make a green dress cake. A woman came in and wanted a standing cake of her daughter’s quinceañera dress. So Jorge figured that if he put a structure in the middle then that would help keep the shape, even if decorating was harder. He took the finished cake, worried it would fall because of its weight, to the event hall in one piece. The woman put the masterpiece in the middle of the dance floor so everyone could see all the details. A week later, a framed photo arrived with a note that said: “you’re part of the dress.”

In addition, she has served our communities for years in a number of volunteer capacities. She graduated from Making Your Money Work for You and became a Building Assets matched savings participant. She took numerous JEDI workshops to strengthen her business skills. Early in 2011, she met with JEDI counselor Renee Getreu to discuss her new vision, which she now calls New Humanity United. Sandy had a dream to establish a not-for-profit thrift store that would donate proceeds back to other worthy non-profits in the Mount Shasta area, while also serving the community in a variety of ways. As the discussions unfolded, Getreu became convinced that her idea was sound. Sandy was stepping out to practice one of the principles Getreu teaches in Making Your Money Work for You: to align your business with a greater purpose that will help to generate a sustaining trend toward success.

Sandy proceeded to launch the New 2 You project with the help of a dedicated team of volunteers who shared her vision. This team had already been involved twice before with successful thrift store efforts. They were experienced, and they knew they could do it. The New 2 You team began by holding a series of yard sales to generate enough cash to anchor their project in a store front location. Then they found support from another JEDI business owner, Atara Melo, owner of A Melo Place. Atara believed in their effort and generously offered to collaborate with the team so they could hold their sales in an ongoing location in her large back parking area during the summer. As fall drew on, Atara decided to move her business closer to downtown and Sandy was able to strike a deal with the building owner to take over the space Atara had been using. Now New 2 You is happily established at 412 South Mount Shasta Boulevard, and A Melo Place may be found at 417 Chestnut Street.

9 months ago, New 2 You was able to make the first of their planned quarterly donations. The three non-profits that the group decided to support included Meals on Wheels, Hospice and JEDI. At the first gifting, each organization received \$1000 apiece. The following two quarters, each received \$3000! With little more than a wing and a prayer, Sandy and the New 2 You team have turned the community’s donations into a delightful shop that supports the community, as well as the people who shop and work there. The team’s spirit of generosity and genuine caring lift the hearts of many who pass through their doors, and JEDI takes this moment to publicly acknowledge and thank Sandy and her crew for the many ways their effort is strengthening our communities.
