### The Power Of Global Gender Parity

Narrowing the global gender gap in work would not only be equitable in the broadest sense but could double the contribution of women to global GDP growth between 2014 and 2025. Delivering that impact, however, will require tackling gender equality in society.

- MGI has mapped 15 gender equality indicators for 95 countries and finds that 40 of them have high or extremely high levels of gender inequality on at least half of the indicators. The indicators fall into four categories: equality in work, essential services and enablers of economic opportunity, legal protection and political voice, and physical security and autonomy.
- We consider a "full-potential" scenario in which women participate in the economy identically to men, and find that it would add up to \$28 trillion, or 26 percent, to annual global GDP in 2025 compared with a business-as-usual scenario. This impact is roughly equivalent to the size of the combined US and Chinese economies today. We also analyzed an alternative "best-in-region" scenario in which all countries match the rate of improvement of the best-performing country in their region. This would add as much as \$12 trillion in annual 2025 GDP, equivalent in size to the current GDP of Japan, Germany, and the United Kingdom combined, or twice the likely growth in global GDP contributed by female workers between 2014 and 2025 in a business-as-usual scenario.

## Pope Francis awakened our better angels

Pope Francis has departed, but his words and his presence linger.

He had an electric effect on those who saw him or heard his words. He served the highest purpose of faith by offering us its wisdom and its forgiveness. He invoked fundamental values, and applied them to the world. He reminded us that we were a nation of immigrants, and that we should treat them as we would wish to be treated. On climate, he summoned us to action to preserve a vibrant world for our children and our children's children. On poverty, he reminded us that the Bible measures our character by how we treat "the least of these." On conflict, he urged negotiation and compromise. He spoke to the most powerful officials of the Republic, and also to the most vulnerable, the imprisoned and the disabled.

His presence and voice provided people genuine hope. He awakened our better angels and called

What do we make of this remarkable moment? Pope Francis has touched our emotions. Will begin to change our attitudes, and if so, then our

behavior? If we change our behavior, we will have to change our priorities. And those change only if the new behavior is enacted into law and reflected in our budgets.

The pope spoke from the longstanding teachings of the church. Yet he had no doubt that our values and our morals should be reflected in our policies and our laws — that we are responsible not only for our private morality but as citizens and legislators for our public policies as well.

So he called on legislators to remember their noble mission: "Your own responsibility as members of Congress is to enable this country, by your legislative activity, to grow as a nation. ... You are called to defend and preserve the dignity of your fellow citizens in the tireless ... pursuit of the common good. ... Legislative activity is always based on care for the people."

In the scabrous, partisan politics of Washington, the reminder was long overdue. Pope Francis then called on legislators to summon the courage to act on global warming, to provide opportunity to the vulnerable, to settle disputes and end the arms trade. He called on them to defend life, focusing on ending the death penalty. In New York, he urged the diplomats at the United Nations to build international law and treaties, to pursue cooperation and negotiation, and to act to lift up the impoverished across the world.

In his speech to Congress, he invoked the example of four great American leaders: a president — Abraham Lincoln — who led the nation to remove the scourge of slavery, and called on us to forgive and to come together. A minister — the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. — who held no office but led the movement to end segregation, to spread the right to vote and to call for action on poverty. Dorothy Day, founder of the Catholic Worker Movement, which combines direct aid with nonviolent action on behalf of the most vulnerable. And Thomas Merton, the most influential American Catholic author of the 20th century, who supported the movements for peace and civil rights and reached out across cultures to find common ground and uncommon wisdom.

Each of these, as Pope Francis said, had a dream. And each devoted himself or herself not only to service and charity but also to action challenging unjust laws and wars, and pushing for peace and justice. They were grounded in faith and sought change in the political arena.

### SBA Awards \$300k in PRIME Grants in the Bay Area

Two community-based organizations in Northern California that provide assistance to disadvantaged entrepreneurs are set to receive \$150,000 each in grants from the U.S. Small Business Administration's (SBA) Program for Investment in Micro-Entrepreneurs (PRIME). OBDC Small Business Finance and Renaissance Entrepreneurship Center help low-income entrepreneurs gain access to capital to establish and expand their small

"By training low-income and disadvantaged micro-entrepreneurs on how to grow their businesses, particularly through the smart use of information technology, the PRIME Program helps small businesses thrive in a 21st century economy, said Administrator Maria Contreras-Sweet, head

Nationally, this year's 39 recipients come from 16 states, Puerto Rico and the District of Columbia. The grants range from \$35,000 to \$200,000 and typically require at least 50 percent in matching funds or in-kind contributions. In total, 104 organizations applied for PRIME awards.

SBA placed special emphasis in this year's competition on applications for projects utilizing information technology and software to help small businesses start, strengthen and/or grow. Assisting small businesses with the tools needed to implement automated financial accounting, financial reporting, inventory management and web-based marketing and distribution is emerging as an industry best practice among SBA's most successful microlenders.

This year's awards also emphasized organizations participating in SBA's Community Advantage Program, like OBDC Small Business Finance. This program provides mission-oriented, nonprofit lenders access to SBA's 7(a) loan guarantees to help small businesses that have outgrown microlending but are not able to access more traditional financing, including funding from SBA commercial lending partners. Twenty SBA Community Advantage lenders submitted applications, and 13 were selected for PRIME awards

PRIME was created by Congress as part of the Program for Investment in microentrepreneurs Act of 1999. Funds become available on September 30 and the grant is for one year.

## **Racial Inequality Trends and the Intergenerational** Persistence of Income and Family Structure

Racial disparity in family incomes remained remarkably stable over the past 40 years in the United States despite major legal and social reforms. Previous scholarship presents two primary explanations for persistent inequality through a period of progressive change. One highlights continuity: because socioeconomic status is transmitted from parents to children, disparities created through histories of discrimination and opportunity de-

nial may dissipate slowly. The second highlights change: because family income results from joining individual earnings in family units, changing family compositions can offset individuals' changing economic chances. I examine whether blackwhite family income inequality trends are better characterized by the persistence of existing disadvantage (continuity) or shifting forms of disadvantage (change). I combine cross-sectional and panel

analysis using Current Population Survey, Panel Study of Income Dynamics, Census, and National Vital Statistics data. Results suggest that African Americans experience relatively extreme intergenerational continuity (low upward mobility) and discontinuity (high downward mobility); both helped maintain racial inequality. Yet, intergenerational discontinuities allow new forms of disadvantage to emerge. On net, racial inequality trends are

better characterized by changing forms of disadvantage than by continuity. Economic trends were equalizing but demographic trends were disequalizing; as family structures shifted, family incomes did not fully reflect labor-market gains.

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## **UCLA** scientists confirm: New technique could make cement manufacturing carbon-neutral

Concrete surrounds us in our cities and stretches across the land in a vast network of highways. It's so ubiquitous that most of us take it for granted, but many aren't aware that concrete's key ingredient, ordinary portland cement, is a major producer of green-

Each year, manufacturers produce around 5 billion tons of portland cement — the gray powder that mixes with water to form the "glue" that holds concrete together. That's nearly three-quarters of a ton for every person on Earth. For every ton of cement produced, the process creates approximately a ton of carbon dioxide, all of which accounts for roughly 7 percent of the world's carbon dioxide emissions.

And with demand increasing every year — especially in the developing world, which uses much more portland cement than the U.S. does — scientists are determined to lessen the growing environmental impact of portland cement production.

One of those scientists is Gaurav Sant of the California NanoSystems Institute at UCLA, who recently completed research that could eventually lead to methods of cement production that give off no carbon dioxide, the gas that composes 82 percent of greenhouse gases.

Sant, an associate professor of civil and environmental engineering and UCLA's Edward K. and Linda L. Rice professor of materials science, found that carbon dioxide released during cement manufacture could be captured and reused. The study is published in the journal Industrial and Engineering Chemistry

"The reason we have been able to sustain global development has been our ability to produce port-

land cement at the volumes we have, and we will need to continue to do so," Sant said. "But the carbon dioxide released into the atmosphere creates significant environmental stress. So it raises the question of whether we can reuse that carbon dioxide to produce a building material."

During cement manufacturing, there are two steps responsible for carbon emissions. One is calcination, when limestone, the raw material most used to produce cement, is heated to about 750 degrees Celsius. That process separates limestone into a corrosive, unstable solid — calcium oxide, or lime — and carbon dioxide gas. When lime is combined with water, a process called slaking, it forms a more stable compound called calcium hydroxide.

And the major compound in portland cement is tricalcium silicate, which hardens like stone when it is combined with water. Tricalcium silicate is produced by combining lime with siliceous sand and heating the mixture to 1,500 degrees Celsius.

Of the total carbon dioxide emitted in cement manufacturing, 65 percent is released when the limestone is calcined and 35 percent is given off by the fuel burned to heat the tricalcium silicate compound.

But Sant and his team showed that the carbon dioxide given off during calcination can be captured and recombined with calcium hydroxide to recreate limestone — creating a cycle in which no carbon dioxide is released into the air. In addition, about 50 percent less heat is needed throughout the production cycle, since no additional heat is required to ensure the formation of tricalcium silicate

Sant said the method is analogous to how limestone cementation occurs in nature, where limestone forms the tough exoskeletons of coral, mollusks and seashells, and when microbes form limestone that cements grains of sand together.



Although scientists had examined this idea previously, Sant said it had never been demonstrated before with a view to carbon dioxide-neutral cement production — and that it actually worked faster than he and his colleagues expected. The cycle took just three hours to complete, compared with the more than 28 days needed for portland cement to react with water to near completion and reach its final hardest consistency.

The successful sample was very small, as required by laboratory conditions. But Sant said now that the process has been proven, it could, in time, be scaled up to production levels.

If cement manufacturers continue to operate as they currently do, and if proposed carbon taxes in the U.S. and other nations are eventually enacted, cement production would be much more expensive than it is now. Were that to happen, a new method for producing cement with little or no environmental impact would be of even greater interest, Sant said.

The study's co-authors were Mathieu Bauchy, an assistant professor of civil and environmental engineering, Magdalena Balonis, a research scientist, postdoctoral scholars Kirk Vance and Isabella Pignatelli, and doctoral scholar Gabriel Falzone, all of

## Obscure, Yet Powerful, Jobs in State and **Local Government**

The most powerful political offices can sometimes come from surprising and seemingly insignificant places.

### By Louis Jacobson

Everyone knows governors, legislators and mayors wield a lot of power, but did you know, for example, that one state's liquor board is unusually powerful? It turns out there are plenty of political offices that exercise a surprising amount of power, and often the titles of these positions do little to advertise their degree of influence.

To identify these obscure offices, we asked political observers around the country to name one -- either elected or appointed -- that, despite appearances, is actually quite powerful. We culled the nominations and came up with the list below. It's made up primarily of executive branch positions. But, admittedly, we probably missed a number of posts that should be on this list. #### **Texas Railroad Commissioner**

Among the positions on this list, the Texas Railroad Commission may have the most deceptively blasé title. "Only a small proportion of the Texas public has heard of the commission," said Mark P. Jones, a Rice University political scientist, "with even fewer knowing what it actually does.

The commission was created in 1891 as a populist measure designed to regulate the railroads, which were resented by many Texans for their high rates and operational issues. During the first quarter of the 20th century, its portfolio was extended to include the energy industry. From the end of the Great Depression through the early 1970s, the commission greatly shaped global oil prices, until its influence was eclipsed by the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries. Ironically enough, the commission doesn't even regulate railroads any more. Instead, it oversees Texas' oil and

natural gas industry -- the nation's biggest -- giving it a hand in everything from monitoring fracking and other forms of drilling to the operation of the state's large network of natural gas and oil pipe-


The commission is made up of three commissioners, which are each elected to a staggered six-year term. The three current occupants are Chairman David Porter, Commissioner Christi Craddick and Commissioner Rvan Sitton, All three commissioners are Republicans; it's been more than 20 years since a Democrat won a seat.

Somewhat surprisingly, it has not been a significant stepping stone to higher office, with several former members losing congressional bids as well as races for state attorney general and state Senate. Similar panels in other energy producing states also wield significant influence, including the North Dakota Industrial Commission and the Oklahoma Corporation Commission.

#### California State Controller

As the nation's largest state -- with an economy that by itself would rank in the world's top 10 -California is home to several statewide elected offices that could qualify for this list, including state treasurer and insurance commissioner. But unlike the other offices, the California state controller oversees a large staff of more than 1,000 employees, has extensive audit authority over both state and local government, and "has the standing and authority to defy orders from the governor," said Garry South, a veteran Democratic consultant in the state.

Several occupants of the office have gone on to win higher office: Alan Cranston became a U.S. senator, and Gray Davis became lieutenant governor and then governor. Controller Betty Yee's predecessor, John Chiang, won a race for treasurer in 2014 and is now a possible gubernatorial contender in 2018. "One of the reasons the position

of controller has been more of a launching pad than other state positions is [its] check-writing function," South said. "Every state tax refund, every state pension fund check, every payment from the state of California comes from the controller, and is signed by him or her. Over time, millions of Californians will get payments directly from the controller." South recalls that when he was running Davis' campaign for lieutenant governor in 1994, people would often come up to him and say, "Oh, I've been getting my pension checks from you for years." Another influential position is the comptroller of New York. Currently held by Democrat Tom DiNapoli, the comptroller controls two major levers of power: state pension funds and state audits.

#### **Delaware Chancery Court**

Delaware has long had tax-friendly laws, which is one reason that about half of U.S. public corporations have incorporated in the state. The court that holds jurisdiction over those companies and, as a result, that wields significant power nationally and even internationally -- is the Delaware Court of Chancery.

### The Power of Parity: How Advancing Women's Equalty Can Add \$12 Trillion to Global Growth

- · Both advanced and developing countries stand to gain. In 46 of the 95 countries analyzed, the bestin-region outcome could increase annual GDP in 2025 by more than 10 percent over the businessas-usual case, with the highest relative boost in India and Latin America.
- MGI's new Gender Parity Score, or GPS, measures the distance each country has traveled toward gender parity, which is set at 1.00. The regional GPS is lowest in South Asia (excluding India) at 0.44 and highest in North America and Oceania at 0.74. Using the GPS, MGI has established a strong link between gender equality in society, attitudes and beliefs about the role of women, and gender equality in work. The latter is not achievable without the former two elements. We found virtually no countries with high gender equality in society but low gender equality in work. Economic development enables countries to close gender gaps, but progress in four areas in particular- education level, financial and digital inclusion, legal protection, and unpaid care work—could help accelerate progress.
- MGI has identified ten "impact zones" (issueregion combinations) where effective action would move more than 75 percent of women affected by gender inequality globally closer to parity. The global impact zones are blocked economic potential, time spent in unpaid care work, fewer legal rights, political underrepresentation, and violence against women, globally pervasive issues. The regional impact zones are low labor-force participation in quality jobs, low maternal and reproductive health, unequal education levels, financial and digital exclusion, and girl-child vulnerability, concentrated in certain regions of the world.
- Six types of intervention are necessary to bridge the gender gap: financial incentives and support; technology and infrastructure; the creation of economic opportunity; capability building; advocacy and shaping attitudes; and laws, policies, and regulations. We identify some 75 potential interventions that could be evaluated and tailored to suit the social and economic context of each impact
- Tackling gender inequality will require change within businesses as well as new coalitions. The private sector will need to play a more active role in concert with governments and non-governmental organizations—and companies could benefit both directly and indirectly by taking action.

Gender inequality is not only a pressing moral and social issue but also a critical economic challenge. If women—who account for half the world's population—do not achieve their full economic potential, the global economy will suffer.

While all types of inequality have economic consequences, in this research, we focus on the economic implications of lack of parity between men and women. Even after decades of progress toward making women equal partners with men in the economy and society, the gap between them remains large. We acknowledge that gender parity in economic outcomes (such as participation in the workforce or presence in leadership positions) is not necessarily a normative ideal as it involves human beings making personal choices about the lives they lead; we also recognize that men can be disadvantaged relative to women in some instances. However, we believe that the world, including the private sector, would benefit by focusing on the large economic opportunity of improving parity between men and women.

# How to Improve Your Chances of Getting a Loan With a Bulletproof P&L Statement

### **By Caron Beesley**

One of the three essential financial statements for your small business – a profit and loss (P&L) statement – is useful for analytical purposes, but it can also tell any possible investors whether you have a strong, viable operation.

If you're applying for an SBA loan program, a P&L statement with forward projections and historical data is a must-have. Small businesses are inherently a high-risk investment for lenders, so the more you can do to prove the integrity of your business and your data, the greater your chances of securing a loan.

In fact, alongside impeccable credit, a solid business plan, a strong personal resume and a strategic marketing plan, a P&L statement (also known as the income statement) is one of the top five small business loan requirements, according to Kabbage.

Here are five things you can do to bulletproof your P&L statement and be on your way to securing the financing you need:

### 1. Understand what your P&L statement can do for your business

Your P&L statement is a summary of the profit and losses that your business has incurred during a particular time period. Basically, it's revenue in, less expenses incurred (cost of goods sold, OPEX, and depreciation).

In addition to showing how profitable your business is, your P&L statement also sheds insight on what money is left in the business to pay your

salary, clear debts, fund growth or hire an employee. It won't, however, show if you have enough cash to pay your bills. (Refer to your cash flow statement for those details.) In a nutshell, it's your financial health report card.

#### 2. Take advantage of available tools

Getting started with a P&L statement isn't the easiest thing in the world. If you need help, download SCORE's profit and loss statement template (.xls). This includes all the necessary calculations to help you forecast net profit. To streamline the process completely (and ensure reliable data), consider cloud accounting tools. Because they automatically feed in data from other reports, cloud software eliminates the hassle of data entry, synchronization and maintenance.

#### 3. Set profitability goals

How much profit do you want to realize from one month or quarter to the next? Use your P&L statement to track performance against those goals and use the data to glean insights. For example, if revenues were down one month, is there something you can do from a marketing perspective to generate more sales? If expenses are running high, make sure you understand why and plan accordingly.

### 4. Set projections

Your lender (and the SBA) will want to see your projections for future profits and losses, plus a business plan that explains how you intend to make your numbers. Plan on projecting out a minimum of one year into the future. Three years, however, is ideal because it shows the impact that external financing will have on revenues and prof-



its. For year one, have a clear sense of your monthly projections; for the remaining years, it's usually okay to focus on quarterly targets.

### 5. Review it regularly

At a minimum, review your P&L statement on a monthly basis. It is a good idea to get into the habit of checking everything on a weekly basis, so you can stay on track and make necessary adjustments to your business plans. Consider hiring and accountant to keep an eye on your key financial statements; the benefits will almost outweigh any fees. Things to look out for include:

- Increasing sales, but declining profit. This is a sign that something is wrong. Are your costs too high? What about your margins?
- Stationary sales. Look for opportunities for growth in new markets, product lines or lead generation campaigns.
- Increases in overhead (utilities, rent, insurance, etc.). Look for ways to keep costs low by shopping around.
- Increases in the cost of goods sold (COGS). Find out why.

## **CDFI Bond Guarantee Program**

## A GATEWAY To Capital and Community REVITALIZATION

The CDFI Bond Guarantee Program provides Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFIs) access to a significant source of capital. By providing guarantees of bonds issued by certain qualified bond issuers, the CDFI Bond Guarantee Program injects new and substantial capital into our nation's most distressed communities. CDFIs can gain from the potential scale of the CDFI Bond Guarantee Program, which offers long-term credit at below-market interest rates. Administered by the Community Development Financial Institutions Fund (CDFI Fund), an office within the U.S. Department of the Treasury, the program is a groundbreaking effort to accelerate community economic revitalization.

### UNDERSTANDING THE CDFI BOND GUARANTEE PROGRAM

Through the CDFI Bond Guarantee Program, qualified entities (CDFIs or their designees) will issue bonds that are guaranteed by the Federal government and use the bond proceeds to extend credit to the broader CDFI industry for community development purposes or to refinance certain existing obligations. Through fiscal year 2014, \$525 million had been guaranteed in bonds through the CDFI Bond Guarantee Program.

### THE CDFI BOND GUARANTEE PROGRAM—BIRD'S EYE VIEW

As a Qualified Issuer, a Certified CDFI (or its designee) applies to the CDFI Fund for authoriza-

tion to issue bonds worth a minimum of \$100 million. The CDFI Fund provides a 100 percent guarantee on these bonds, up to \$1 billion per year.

The Qualified Issuer then sells the government-backed bonds to the Federal Financing Bank (FFB) — a government corporation that ensures that Federal obligations are financed efficiently. Each bond has a maximum maturity of 30 years. The Qualified Issuer must use the proceeds from the bond sale to extend credit to other CDFIs. As a result, Qualified Issuers serve as a "go-between" financier to the broader CDFI industry.

## MOST CDFIS WILL PARTICIPATE IN THE CDFI BOND GUARANTEE PROGRAM AS ELIGIBLE CDFIS OR SECONDARY BORROWERS

These CDFIs have the opportunity to borrow capital from Qualified Issuers for long-term, large-scale community investments. Such projects may include such activities as the development of small businesses, commercial real estate, housing units, shelters, charter schools, daycare or healthcare centers, and municipal infrastructure, among others. In addition to these projects, Eligible CDFIs may use the capital to extend credit to other community development borrowers— or Secondary Borrowers—or refinance existing loans at below-market interest

### **KEY PROGRAM DISTINCTIONS**

- Unlike other CDFI Fund programs, the CDFI Bond Guarantee Program does not offer grants or direct loans, but is instead a federal credit subsidy program. The bond proceeds are debt instruments that must be repaid.
- The CDFI Bond Guarantee Program is designed to function at no cost to taxpayers.
- Bonds (including principal, interest, and call premiums) are 100 percent guaranteed by the U.S. government. The FFB is the sole purchaser of bonds issued under the CDFI Bond Guarantee Program.

### WHO SHOULD APPLY FOR QUALIFIED ISSUER STATUS?

To receive Qualified Issuer status, an organization must demonstrate the expertise, capacity, and experience to issue taxable bonds and make loans for Eligible Community and Economic Development Purposes. In short, an Qualified Issuer must:

- Be a Certified CDFI (as designated by the CDFI Fund), or its designee;
- Be able to issue bonds and make loans; and
- Demonstrate the capacity to perform specialized administrative functions, including loan servicing and financial reporting.

By taking some simple steps, CDFIs can begin preparing to become Qualified Issuers. These steps can include, among others:



- Reviewing the CDFI Bond Guarantee Program regulations (12 C.F.R. 1808) and the applicable Notice of Guarantee Authority;
- Reviewing the FFB's Lending Policy at www. treasury.gov/ffb;
- Reviewing certain Office of Management and Budget circulars (particularly, Circulars A-11 and A-129) for further rules and guidance for Federal credit programs;
- Defining standardized loan terms, especially "default," "delinquency," and "modification";
- Standardizing loan servicing procedures to facilitate smooth and equitable lending for Eligible Purposes; and
- Drafting a plan for proposed sources and uses of funds for Eligible CDFIs.

They are enforceable anywhere in California by any law enforcement officer who has received or seen a copy of them.

FEE WAIVER: If you cannot pay the filing fee, ask the clerk for a fee waiver form. The court may order you to pay back all or part of the fees and costs that the court waived for you or the other party.

- 1. removing the minor children of the parties from the state or applying for a new or replacement passport for those minor children without the prior written consent of the other party or an order of the court;
- 2. cashing, borrowing against, canceling, transferring, disposing of, or changing the beneficiaries of any insurance or other cover age, including life, health, automobile, and disability, held for the nefit of the parties and their minor children;
- 3. transferring, encumbering, hypothecating, concealing, or in any way disposing of any property, real or personal, whether community, quasi-community, or separate, without the written consent of the other party or an order of the court, except in the usual course of business or for the necessities of life; and
- 4. creating a nonprobate transfer or modifying a nonprobate transfer in a manner that affects the disposition of property subject to the transfer, without the written consent of the other party or an order of the court. Before revocation of a nonprobate transfer can take effect or a right of survivorship to property can be eliminated, notice of the

change must be filed and served on the other party.

You must notify each other of any proposed extraordinary expenditures at least five business days prior to incurring these extraordinary expenditures and account to the court for all extraordinary expenditures made after these restraining orders are effective However, you may use community property, quasi-community property, or your own separate property to pay an attorney to help you or to pay court costs
