

California's Minority-Owned Small Businesses Contribute \$192.8 Billion in Economic Output

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:
The first "State of Diverse Small Businesses in California" report details the statewide impact of minority-owned small business, noting that, annually, they contribute \$192.8 billion in economic output – more than the annual GDP of 18 US States, generate \$28.7 billion in tax revenue, and support 2.56 million jobs.

The California Office of the Small Business Advocate (CalOSBA) recently released a research report, led by the state's leading minority chambers and produced by Beacon Economics, that was California's first on the economic, fiscal, and social impact of diverse firms across the state.

Samuel Maury-Holmes, Practice Lead at Beacon Economics, is presenting the findings this week to the "Investing in Small Businesses Owned by People of Color" working session at the 2023 California Economic Summit hosted by CA FWD in Indian Wells.

Part of the Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz), CalOSBA commissioned this report as part of their efforts to continue embedding equity analysis and considerations in their mission, policies, and practices.



"The Governor's Office has long acknowledged that diverse small businesses power California's economy, generating billions in economic activity and significant tax revenues for California. But we couldn't sufficiently quantify their activities, performance, or impact," said CalOSBA Director Tara Lynn Gray. "This report speaks to that need and signifies the Governor's commitment to a more inclusive understanding of our

economy and the findings will help our office and our partners to better support the Governor's vision of a California for All. This data will also help local small business communities better advocate for their needs."

The report studied businesses from four racial/ethnic groups: Asians, Hispanics, Black/African-Americans, and Native Americans. Key findings

from the report, which reference Census data sources from 2019 (the most recent data year for which all individual data points used in this report were available as of publication), include:

- Minority small businesses contribute nearly \$193 billion in economic output per year, which is greater than the annual GDP of 18 U.S. states.
- Minority small businesses in California generate \$28.7 billion in tax revenue each year.
- Minority small businesses support 2.56 million jobs annually across California.
- The business sector with the highest concentration of small minority firms (defined as employing 20 employees or less) is the Trade, Transport and Utilities sector with over 300,000 minority firms (wholesale trade, retail trade, transportation and warehousing, utilities).

Last fall, CalOSBA called upon the state's largest minority chambers — the California Asian Pacific Chamber of Commerce worked as project lead along with the California African-American Chamber of Commerce and the California Hispanic Chamber of Commerce — to lead the project including selecting a research lead and

Statement by US Secretary of Labor Julie A. Su on September jobs report

Acting Secretary of Labor Julie A. Su issued the following statement on the September 2023 Employment Situation report:

"The Bureau of Labor Statistics reported that the American economy added 336,000 jobs in September, while the unemployment rate remained steady at 3.8 percent, continuing the longest stretch under 4 percent unemployment since the 1960s. Wage growth has remained steady – up 4.3 percent

over the past year. With 13.9 million jobs added since President Biden took office, our economy is strong and stable under the responsible leadership of the Biden-Harris administration.

"The job market continues to bring workers off the sidelines, and today's data show that our hospitality industry is experiencing a strong recovery with restaurants and bars adding 61,000 jobs in September – erasing all the job losses during the pandemic for the first time. Overall, 96,000 jobs were added in in leisure and hospitality. Of

note on National Manufacturing Day, the manufacturing sector added 17,000 jobs in September, and 815,000 manufacturing jobs have been added since January 2021.

"I'm also excited to announce today that the prime age women's employment rate remains at 75.3 percent, a record high for the sixth month in a row. Women have powered our post-pandemic recovery and continue to strengthen our labor force. In order to continue this growth, we must remain committed to addressing structural barriers that keep some women out of the workforce. One of the largest barriers for women and working families is a lack of affordable childcare. That is why the President remains committed to fighting for childcare policies that support both working families and childcare workers. This administration strongly supports congressional efforts to secure additional childcare funding for hardworking families.

"This month's jobs report was more good news for workers showing job and wage increases as well as broad growth across industries This is a

strong and stable jobs report showing a robust labor market that continues to provide employment opportunities for workers all over the country."

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INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS AND OPPORTUNITIES

Biden-Harris Administration Sending States \$61 Billion from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law for America's Roads and Bridges

The U.S. Department of Transportation's Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) today announced that it has allocated \$61 billion in Fiscal Year 2024 apportionments for 12 formula programs to support investment in critical infrastructure, including roads, bridges and tunnels, carbon emission reduction, and safety improvements, as well as workforce development to support these investments, utilizing funding from President Biden's Bipartisan Infrastructure Law. The funds go directly to all 50 States, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico, and help them continue the important work of rebuilding our roads and bridges and making our transportation system more efficient.

"Long-needed major improvements are coming to America's network of roads, bridges, and highways," said U.S. Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg. "Thanks to President Biden, we are proud to deliver funding to modernize roads and bridges across America—strengthening our supply chains, creating good-paying jobs, and connecting Americans to every corner of this country."

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law makes the single largest dedicated investment in our transportation infrastructure since the construction of the Interstate Highway System in the 1950s and 1960s. The \$61 billion in funding for Fiscal Year 2024 is the third year of funding under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law and represents an increase of \$17.6 billion in formula programs as compared to Fiscal Year 2021, the last fiscal year

before the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law was implemented. This Bipartisan Infrastructure Law funding is distributed annually by FHWA based on Congressionally mandated formulas.

"These historic investments in American infrastructure give States the flexibility they need to determine how to allocate funds for a range of transportation projects such as improving safety for all road users, replacing aging bridges, and reducing carbon emissions," said Federal Highway Administrator Shailen Bhatt. "This funding will allow States to continue the important work of President Biden's Bipartisan Infrastructure Law that is making our infrastructure safer and more efficient for the millions of Americans who rely on it to get to school, work, and other important destinations every day."

Federal-aid Highway Program funds are authorized periodically by Congress in multi-year laws to assist the States in providing for construction, reconstruction, and improvement of highways and bridges on eligible Federal-aid routes and for other special purpose programs and projects. The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law established or continued FHWA programs and authorized funding for those programs from the Highway Trust Fund and General Fund.

A LEGACY TO REMEMBER

SBE Remembers Senator Dianne Feinstein

To the people of San Francisco, Dianne Feinstein was an elected supervisor for nine years, then the city's trailblazing first woman mayor for another nine years.

To the people of California, Dianne Feinstein was the state's first woman United States senator, serving for more than thirty years—longer than any previous senator from California, and longer than any other woman in senate history.

To the people of the United States, Dianne Feinstein was a respected senator who championed the Democratic party's key issues as the chair or a member of various senate committees throughout the decades.

During her fifty years of public service as an elected official, until the day of her recent passing at age ninety, Senator Feinstein was also known as a leader who sought to work with people of differing political views in order to solve problems and accomplish significant public policy goals. Among the many bipartisan issues that Senator Feinstein cooperated across the aisle to address were matters of national security, crime, justice, natural resources, environmental protection, and immigration.

To Small Business Exchange (SBE), founded in San Francisco in 1984, Dianne Feinstein was an active, accessible, caring mayor who visited every neighborhood and attended countless events. Mayor Feinstein tackled tough issues. She also provided steady support to the concerns that continue to motivate SBE's service to small, disadvantaged businesses from coast to coast.

In October 1995, Senator Feinstein sent a kind letter to Gerald Johnson, who is the co-founder of SBE, along with his wife and business partner, Valerie Voorhies Johnson. Senator Feinstein wrote:

Dear Gerald:

I am pleased to join the Black Business Association in recognizing and congratulating you for being honored with the Outstanding Entrepreneur Award.

Your work as the founder of the Black Business Administration in San Francisco and as an advocate for minority contractors in the public

and private sector has been truly inspirational. The doors that you have helped to open for African Americans in the contracting business has helped pave the way for future leaders to follow.

Everyone has benefitted from your hard work and dedication and I commend you on receiving this prestigious honor and wish you all the best in 1995 and in the years ahead.

2023: A MEGA-year for construction in Ohio

Keyed by several mega projects, including the \$20 billion Phase I of the Intel project in New Albany and the \$3.5 billion Honda/LG joint venture battery plant in Jeffersonville, 2023 is forecast to be a record year for a number of Local Unions and regional building trades councils in terms of man-hours.

A mega project is defined as a privately funded construction project with a price tag of at least \$1 billion.

From the shores of Lake Erie to the Ohio River, there will be plenty of work opportunities for union tradesmen and tradeswomen who want to work. Plentiful work hours for travelers is also expected.

In 2022, Ohio attracted the most corporate investment in new buildings and equipment in any year since JobsOhio was formed in 2011, according to Columbus Business First. The \$30.3 billion in capital projects announced in 2022, tripled the previous record of \$9.56 billion set in 2017.

While the entire \$30.3 billion in construction work will not go union, Ohio building trades will likely construct a healthy portion of the proposed projects.

Dorsey Hager, Executive Secretary-Treasurer of the Columbus/Central Ohio Building and Construction Trades Council, has three mega projects in his territory – Intel, Honda/LG EV battery plant and the Wexner Medical Tower.

This is in addition to ongoing construction of data center campuses for Facebook, Amazon and Google; an additional new data center campus for Amazon, plus other data center campuses throughout Central Ohio; Amgen biomanufacturing plant; multiple hotels; governmental and institutional work; projects at The Ohio State University and other new construction work.

Affiliated members of the C/COBCTC logged about 6.75 million man-hours in 2021 and just over 9 million man-hours in 2022. Hager expects total man-hours to increase by about 30 percent in 2023.

“Work should stay like this for at least the next seven years and probably longer,” Hager added.

Dave Wondolowski, Executive Secretary/Business Manager for the Cleveland Building and Construction Trades Council expects his affiliated members to log more hours in 2023 than in 2022.

Leading the way are multiple marquee projects such as the Sherwin-Williams headquarters in downtown Cleveland; the Sherwin-Williams Research and Development Center in Brecksville; a new Neurological Institute; expansion of the Cole Eye Center; and the Innovation Center on the Cleveland Clinic’s main campus.

Other projects include construction of the Cleveland Clinic’s Mentor hospital and multiple parking garages; new construction and remodeling at Cleveland State University; and building several new Cleveland Metropolitan School District schools. There are also many other smaller and medium-sized projects either underway or set to break ground in 2023.

Wondolowski also expects additional projects when federal funding from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) is awarded.

Economic factors such as inflation, a possible recession, higher material costs and supply chain issues will not negatively affect the 2023 work outlook any more than it did in 2022, he added.

Affiliated members of the Western Reserve Building and Construction Trades Council, which entails Trumbull, Mahoning and Columbiana counties, are also gearing up for a busy year.

WRBCTC President Marty Loney said quite a few affiliated members will be working at the Ultium Cells Battery Plant through the end of the year, with more work expected from IIJA funding.

The state also has awarded more than \$55 million in historic tax credits to renovate downtown Youngstown buildings, and Loney believes his affiliated members will get most of this work.

Many affiliated contractors in Loney’s jurisdiction have a great deal of light industrial and maintenance work on the books in 2023.

“The mega projects are not sustainable,” he said. “We need contractors to be engaged and not give away light industry and maintenance

work. We have to grow to increase our membership and we need a combination of this work.”

In Northwest Ohio, Shaun Enright, Executive Secretary/Business Manager of the Northwest Ohio Building and Construction Trades Council, said his affiliated members will stay busy due to the large number of Project Labor Agreements the council has secured.

PLAs for construction and maintenance work exist with nearly a dozen city and county entities, as well as multiple private developers building residential, hotels and assisted living facilities.

“PLA work alone will keep all our local contractors busy,” said Enright. “We will continue the work at both refineries and the powerhouses, GM Powertrain, Jeep and all other industrial facilities in our area. We will be building a new baby formula factory as well. Man-hours will stay high, but I’m not sure if they will increase.”

Enright added that his affiliated Locals will likely need travelers once the weather improves, but it is hard to predict how many at this point.

South of Enright’s jurisdiction, the outlook also is promising in Lima.

Rick Perdue, President of the Lima Building and Construction Trades Council, was a guest on the America’s Work Force Union Podcast and predicted the first quarter will be a bit slow, but affiliated members will be busy from the second quarter through the end of the year.

Work at Procter and Gamble and Cargill, plus hospital work at Lima Memorial and St. Rita’s will be some of the bigger projects driving man-hours, Perdue said.

He also explained a \$916 million electric vehicle battery separator film plant will be constructed in Sidney. There is no PLA for the 850,000-square-foot plant, but the winning bids appear to be going to union contractors.

For Hager, whose jurisdiction is considered one of the hottest construction markets in the U.S., the biggest problem his affiliated unions will face this year is lack of manpower.

Travelers will certainly help build Intel, Honda/LG and other projects, but both Enright and Wondolowski do not think many of their affiliated members will head south to work on the mega projects.

Pamela Marquez, Puzz E Gata Jamaica

Ask Pamela Marquez about the first time she drank agua de jamaica in Mexico, and the answer will span generations. “It did elicit ancestral memories in me,” says the Sacramento local, reflecting on her travels across the country. “It empowered my body.” Pamela founded Puzz e Gata Jamaica in 2020 to share the benefits of the sweetened, cinnamon-spiced hibiscus flower tea across Northern California. For a long time, she had been unable to find any product that matched the traditional recipes she had encountered in Mexico. This year, she began working with the California Capital Women’s Business Center to develop strategies for the sustainable growth and innovation of her mission.

Global History, Personal Mission

As Pamela learned during her research, the hibiscus flower is not native to North America. The flower and its tea came to Central America from West Africa by way of the Caribbean. Variations of the beverage are still enjoyed widely across those regions. In fact, the differing recipes from regions within Mexico were a major inspiration for Pamela to bring a traditional brew to Sacramento. Traveling twice a year to different states, she spoke with the women selling their home-brewed agua de jamaica. She absorbed the rich cultural significance of the drink as well as their unique recipes.

“I learned the cultural healing properties, the folk medicine uses of the past, and even the current medicinal qualities,” Pamela explains. She points out that hibiscus tea is rich in antioxidants, can fight inflammation and has been associated—in her personal experience—with alleviation of symptoms of depression. Benefits, she adds, that aren’t present in the sugary drink mixes that merely mimic the flavors of jamaica that she found outside of Mexico. “My purpose is to get real, authentic, hibiscus flower tea to the Sacramento community.”

Growing Flowers (And a Business)

She developed her own recipe, a combination of methods and ingredients she learned during her travels. Then Pamela successfully launched Puzz e Gata Jamaica through the Alchemist Community Development Corporation’s Alchemist Kitchen Incubator Program. This gave her access to a commercial kitchen where she could brew and bottle her recipes. She made her product from flowers grown organically in her home garden.

With this early success, Pamela was able to begin selling at local grocery stores. These included the Sacramento Natural Foods Cooperative and the Davis Food Cooperative. But without a background in running a business, creating a pathway to sustainability and growth was a separate challenge. She turned to the California Capital Women’s Business Center and began working with business counselor Prashante Bailey-Lewis.

“I accept as much help as I can with my business, so whenever I see an opportunity to ask for help, I do,” says Pamela. She adds that with Bailey-Lewis’s guidance, she raised her prices

and developed new strategies for marketing her product to restaurants. “She’s just a well of knowledge.” Pamela has also received support with grant proposals and pitch deck creation. Additionally, she has attended WBC networking events to build her community connections.

Preparing For a Sweet Future

The whole of Pamela’s operation seeks to elevate the culture and flavors of Mexico. From the name Puzz e Gata, her favorite Spanglish phrase for “pussy cat” with a feminized twist, to the recipe variations she offers. In addition to traditional agua de jamaica with cinnamon, Marquez also offers other flavors. These include a less-sweetened “tart” brew, a jalapeno infusion, and an infusion with cactus or nopales.

As a Chicana founder, Pamela’s impact on the empowerment of Mexican heritage goes beyond her personal mission. Studies have cited Latino-owned businesses as the fastest growing segment of small businesses in the country. The number of Hispanic women entrepreneurs grew 137 percent between 2007 and 2016. By bringing her product to the marketplace, Pamela is contributing to the celebration of a staple of Central American culture. She also bolsters the visibility of Latina entrepreneurs in our small business economy.

In the years ahead, Pamela’s main goal is to secure her own brick and mortar store where she can create new recipes. She also wants to test innovative uses for hibiscus flower and feature local artists. “I know I’m going in the right direction,” she says. “I can see all of the creativity that’s going to come out of this business.”

And an insider tip? Try any of Puzz e Gata’s bottled blends poured over ice with a rim of Tajin or Chamoy, says Pamela. And keep your eyes peeled for hibiscus rim sugar for holiday specialty beverages.
