

Bridging the Future of Construction: A Spotlight on 6 Young Changemakers

The construction industry is at a crossroads when it comes to finding talent. According to Associated General Contractors of America (AGC), 85% of construction firms report they have open positions they are trying to fill. To alleviate the labor shortage and sustain the future of the industry in the long-term, construction needs to attract a

new generation of passionate, diverse, and innovative professionals.

At Autodesk, part of our mission is to create a better industry for today and tomorrow. Through our Make It Real program, we encourage young people to engage with their communities by applying the design thinking process to real problems related to construction and the built environment. Two key initiatives include:

- “Make It Bridge” Scholarship Award: We challenged high school students to

rethink a gap that exists in their community by designing a new structure or space that includes a pedestrian bridge to offer something more for the people and places it connects. Winners of the contest earned scholarship prizes totaling \$50,000 to support educational expenses such as tuition, books, room and board, transportation, and childcare.

- Building Changemakers Microgrant Give-away: This \$500 grant is intended for students ages 17-22 in the U.S. who are transitioning from high school into an apprenticeship or additional vocational training in the building trades. It may be used to cover expenses to support training such as tuition, books, safety equipment, uniforms, lab fees, transportation, certification fees, or childcare. In 2023, we supported 100 young people on the path to careers in the building trades with \$50,000 in microgrant funding. Stay tuned for additional funding opportunities in 2024.

So far, we’ve had some incredible winners for our scholarship award and microgrants. We recently had the opportunity to speak to six of our winners to discuss more about what inspired them to enter the awards or challenge, and what’s needed to build a better future for the industry.

Tell us about your submission. What inspired you to enter the design challenge?

It all started from a trip to Ocean City in the summer of 2022. After we checked into the hotel, my family and I decided to visit Assateague Island to see some wild horses, because it was just a hundred meters away from Ocean City. We could even see the plantation on the island standing at the boardwalk. We thought that there must be a way to drive or even walk there and it won’t take too long. The California High-Speed Rail Authority (Authority) has received the American Planning Association’s California – Northern Section’s 2023 Excellence Award for Advancing Diversity and Social Change in Honor of Paul Davidoff at the association’s Awards Gala.

“This work reflects a multi-year process of building relationships with the communities that the high-speed rail system travels through,

with an emphasis on environmental justice and partnership,” said Northern California Regional Director Boris Lipkin. “We’re honored that the American Planning Association recognizes those efforts as a best practice, and we look forward to continuing these relationships as we bring high-speed rail to Northern California.”

Davidoff is remembered as an urban planner who pioneered inclusionary zoning. The Authority is committed to delivering the high-speed

CALIFORNIA CLIMATE INVESTMENT FUNDS

California Distributes \$192 Million for More Clean Transit

Governor Gavin Newsom announced that Caltrans approved \$192 million in California Climate Investment funds for 136 public transportation projects that will cut pollution and create more affordable transportation options, especially for disadvantaged communities.

What Governor Newsom said: “More clean and affordable transportation is coming to California, cutting pollution and making it easier for folks to get around. These programs are key to our climate goals – building charging stations, getting more EV buses on the roads, and reducing costs for public transit.”

Here are some examples of projects:

- \$52 million to fully electrify public bus routes in a transit corridor in Los Angeles County’s North San Fernando Valley;
- \$2.5 million to install electric vehicle charging equipment and replace 15 diesel buses with EV buses in a San Mateo County low-income community;
- \$9.7 million to build a new fueling station to support 50 hydrogen-powered buses in Orange County – 75% percent of the funding will benefit disadvantaged and low-income neighborhoods;
- \$17.5 million for free transit tickets for low-income seniors, youth and people with disabilities in San Francisco;

- \$1.6 million to add a new bus route through an underserved community in the south Fresno area;
- \$522,292 to install electric chargers and convert a fleet of buses to zero-emissions vehicles in rural Butte County.

Over the last five years, the Low Carbon Transit Operations Program (LCTOP) has provided more than \$664 million for transportation projects across the state. This year’s highlights include:

- 31 projects to implement free or reduced fares;
- 31 projects to offer new expanded/enhanced service;
- 22 projects to purchase replacement zero-emission vehicles and infrastructure;
- 16 projects for the purchase, construction and installation of renewable energy/fuel for transit facilities in support of new expanded/enhanced transit service.

LCTOP is funded from the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund and is part of California Climate Investments, a statewide program that allocates billions of cap-and-trade dollars to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, strengthen the economy, and improve public health and the environment — particularly in disadvantaged communities.

rail system to all Californians and achieving its mission in a way that reflects the Authority's highest values of diversity, equity, inclusion, and sustainability. The award recognizes that commitment through the Authority's San Jose to Merced Project Section, Environmental Justice Community Improvement Planning and Engagement Process.

In planning for the project's segment between San Jose and Merced, that was environmentally cleared in spring 2022, the Authority collaborated with environmental justice communities to identify improvements that will help offset project effects. Engagement for the project included over 200 different events, including 58 meetings focused on planning for community enhancements. The collaborative planning approach resulted in the identification of 25 community improvements across the eight affected communities.

The enhancements include park and street safety improvements, school/community recreational facilities, supporting school bus routing, pedestrian/bike connections and overpasses, school retrofits, insulation to address noise impacts, and reestablishing a library focused on civil rights at an African American community center.

Since the start of construction, the Authority has created more than 11,000 construction jobs, a majority going to residents from the Central Valley.

The Authority has begun work to extend the 119 miles under construction to 171 miles of future electrified high-speed rail from Merced to Bakersfield. There are more than 25 active construction sites in California's Central Valley, with the Authority having environmentally cleared 422 miles of the high-speed rail program from the Bay Area to the Los Angeles Basin.

not a single road connecting the two islands. We instead must detour inwards onto a highway to get there. It took us 25 minutes. So, I thought this was not only a waste of time, but also the emission from the cars must have also been very detrimental to the environment. So, when the "Make It Bridge" student design challenge came up several months later, I decided to design my own version of a pedestrian bridge that connects two islands for tourists or citizens who had similar experiences to mine. And it is always exciting when I can create something inspired by my real-life story.

What impact do you think the scholarship will have on your future?

This certainly is an honor to receive this scholarship. It will definitely help me get closer to my dream major because it gives me more leeway when considering colleges. It is still a huge amount of money even when it comes to student debt. This head-start builds me a lot of confidence in what I could accomplish in the future.

Why are you inspired to pursue a career in the AEC industry? What impact do you hope to make in the industry?

I have always wanted to be an architect or interior designer. I love how it is scientific, but also extremely creative. Every building you design is not only just a practical place for people to stay, but it also is an art piece that connects us no matter who you are. I really want to design a building or its interiors on my own and contribute more ideas to the architectural industry.

Tell us about your submission. What inspired you to enter the design challenge?

I decided to create a submission for this challenge because I felt inspired to get out of my comfort zone and try something new. I had very little intention of submitting my finished project. I have never previously designed large structures in CAD (Computer Aided Design); I've only designed small home gadgets and models with no particular use in mind. I decided this was a good opportunity to learn something new, and so I took my shot. There was a bit of a learning curve as I went from designing for fun to designing with real purpose, but I soon got the hang of it. As I was designing, I realized I really do love using CAD more than I thought I did. The diver-

sity of ways you can utilize it allows for limitless possibilities and it fills me with a great sense of fulfillment and pleasure. I was proud of the results of this project and the growth it allowed me to experience, so I was happy to turn it in as complete. I didn't expect to get any rewards for it, and I'm honestly still shocked. Thank you for this experience, it was incredible and eye-opening. No regrets!

What impact do you think the scholarship will have on your future?

This scholarship means the world to me. I've never won a scholarship before. I never previously believed in myself enough to sign up for scholarships, but this experience has given me the confidence to take other opportunities. Once I graduate next year, I will be the first in my family to go to college. This scholarship has given me hope that there are means of making college affordable, and it established my desire to build a career using CAD. The \$1000 I earned is going into my first-ever college fund. I never had money to spare to start a fund, but this scholarship has finally allowed me to do so.

In August, Autodesk hosted 20 teachers and students from the Boston Public Schools, ACE Mentor Program of America, YouthBuild Boston, and Bunker Hill Community College at Autodesk's Boston office for the AEC Externship, a two-week paid program that aims to uncover ways to engage with and inspire more diverse people to pursue and advance their careers in construction.

As part of this year's program, community members such as public officials, AEC industry professionals, higher education leaders, and representatives from youth-serving nonprofits highlighted for participants how builders can be on the front lines of economic inclusion. The externship participants also worked collaboratively on projects for building a better Boston, with mentorship from volunteers from Autodesk and our partners in the program: Gilbane Building Company, Nitsch Engineering, and Elkus Manfredi Architects, including support from the United Way of Massachusetts Bay. The program culminated in a public showcase at Wentworth Institute of Technology that drew a crowd to hear the students' and teachers' ideas.

In addition to earning microgrants, two YouthBuild pre-apprentices also took part in the externship, including Keyshawn Kavanaugh

What inspired you to apply for a microgrant?

When I first heard about the microgrant from Autodesk, I applied knowing it would help with transportation costs on the commuter rail and food during lunch. Having the grant would allow me greater energy to focus on the work we were doing.

Why are you inspired to pursue a career in the AEC industry? What impact do you hope to make in the industry?

For me when it came to learning about the construction industry and how it all works and comes together and how many pieces there really are, it felt new and interesting. I first learned about what some of the types of construction jobs there are – such as carpentry,

plumbing, and electrical – during my time at YouthBuild Boston. They taught me a lot: how to read a measuring tape; how to use a speed square; the basics of how to build a wall and how to put it together. Learning all these skills and being taught how to build from the ground up just seemed exciting to me and felt different. I found something I could really make a career out of and motivation to sharpen my skills as I learn more. An impact I hope I can make in this industry is continuing to show that I'm willing to learn more and that I can inspire young people to try and find a path into the construction industry.

What was your externship experience like at Autodesk this summer? What impact do you think it will have on your future outlook for your career?

My externship with Autodesk this summer was enjoyable. I first visited Autodesk for a field trip in June with YouthBuild to meet Congressman Stephen Lynch. It was fun to be back at Autodesk again a couple of months later to learn more about issues impacting the construction industry's future.

During the internship we were a diverse group of YouthBuild pre-apprentices, Bunker Hill Community College students, and high school students from the ACE Mentor Program. We collaborated on projects based on our interests. I enjoyed getting to meet the other students and seeing what got them to where they are now. We also got to meet representatives from several AEC firms and learn more about what their role is in the construction field and what part they play. It was fascinating to see how many other aspects there were and how they fit together on a building project. The impact this will have on my future will be a deeper knowledge of what goes on at a construction site, and when it comes to reading blueprints, to have more context for what I'm reading.

SD Unique Boutique

Sayed Mohammad Hashemi is a designer and tailor who opened his shop in El Cajon. He sells handmade purses, wallets, shoes, jewelry, plus traditional Afghan clothing and rugs.

He learned tailoring at age seven and used to own a shop in Kabul. Sayed worked with NATO as a cultural advisor for American troops – and after partial troop withdrawal, insecurity, and instability, he saw the danger and applied for a Special Immigration Visa.

He with his wife and three children moved to the States six years ago. Working hard, he was able to establish his business in 2021. The dresses he creates are mostly traditional Afghan outfits which are popular in the Afghan community here. People wear them for parties, Eid, Nowrooz, and for other public community events.

Sayed started out leasing a small shop and got his business permits. But as soon as he heard about our IRC SBDC services, he reached out. IRC helped him participate in several vending opportunities which helped grow his business. They also assisted him with other marketing efforts, networking, and resources. He says he's grateful for the assistance and plans to work with IRC SBDC to apply for a business loan.

As a refugee and entrepreneur, Sayed's advice to other immigrants and refugees is to follow their entrepreneurship dreams. Because he believes in the American dream. "And the great news is that resources and centers like IRC SBDC will be there to offer them with resources and help them open and expand their business free of charge."

TumorGen

TumorGen is a start-up striving to fight metastasis and save lives. Focusing on biotechnology research, the company is developing a novel drug discovery platform to identify unseen therapeutic targets associated with cancer metastasis. They're now patented technology is used to capture circulating metastatic cancer cell clusters (MCCCs). The MCCCs have been shown to be the primary vector for disseminating distant metastases in most solid tumor cancers. Their innovative platform can open a new therapeutic target space for biopharma developing drugs impacting cancer metastasis pathways.

After Jeff Allen lost his wife to cancer in 2002, the analytical biochemist put his training to work to learn more about the disease – and eventually started TumorGen. They also joined The

Brink SBDC's Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) program.

"The SBIR workshop allowed us to prepare a competitive and well-scored application," describes TumorGen's Peter Teriete.

"The schedule and agenda were really well aligned with the application deadline, and following it helped us to stay on top of many of the administrative requirements which are easily overlooked but can derail the application fast if not taken care of.

"The group of like-minded entrepreneurs in the life science field who we were partnered with provided much constructive feedback on our aims and research strategy. In many ways, they peer-reviewed our application in a manner not too dissimilar with how the study section reviewers at the NIH would do. I would strongly recommend any individual or company considering the (submission of) their first SBIR application to take advantage of what this workshop can offer."

Scott Swaaley founded MAKESafe Tools, an engineering and manufacturing company that develops innovative industrial motor control devices to make tool operation safer.

He saw how yearly over 16,000 people were significantly injured as a result of known and easily mitigated machinery hazards despite resources available and OSHA requirements. Through research, prototyping, testing, and applying his education and experience expertise, they developed solutions. MAKESafe also works with organizations like the National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health to develop new products for the industrial safety market.

Today MAKESafe offers a variety of products, systems, and distribution methods as well as integrators – plus free quotes and trials. The business has also worked with The Brink SBDC to grow, obtain two patents, add a full- and part-time job, as well as find success with SBIR, Small Business Innovation Research programs.



"The facilitators at The Brink SBDC introduced me to the concept of SBIR grants, helped me navigate through the complexities of federal grant writing, and were always available to help at a moment's notice. Without them, I never would have received my \$150,000 Phase 1 award. I can't imagine writing a SBIR proposal without help from The Brink. Their hard-won experience, germane insights, and how-to workshops take a seemingly impossible task and make it manageable. Don't get me wrong – it's still really hard – but you now have a resource to help organize and translate all that gov-speak into an actionable to-do list."

Sanctum Tequila

Father Lorenzo Lebrija, founder of Sanctum Tequila, received a \$10,000 Dream Fund grant from the California Office of the Small Business Advocate (CalOSBA) to grow the nonprofit organization. Sanctum Tequila was born from Father Lebrija's volunteer service at a children's shelter in Mexicali – he wanted to build a business to support the kids at the shelter with basics like keeping the lights on.

"Without the Dream Fund, I would not have taken

the step to launch when I did," said Father Lebrija. Father Lebrija received technical assistance from Caravanserai Project, a provider in the CalOSBA Technical Assistance Partner Network. He is leveraging the Dream Fund grant to run Instagram ads, re-do the website, which just re-launched in early February 2023, and to help with client acquisition.

Father Lebrija worked with his 80-year-old father, a serial entrepreneur, to develop the direct-to-consumer model and launched Sanctum Tequila in the summer of 2022 as a dream – first as a Limited

Liability Company and then switched to a nonprofit organization. They worked together to find a tequila distiller in Jalisco, Mexico willing to take their custom recipe and produce small batches for distribution. He found a distributor to transport the tequila from Jalisco to Tijuana and then into the United States. 100% of the proceeds for Sanctum Tequila are donated to Border Compassion to assist children's shelters in Mexico.
