The Next Generation in Construction: A Spotlight on 6 Young Industry Innovators

Construction is a vibrant industry full of innovative and talented professionals. But its future relies on the minds and passions of our youngest generations.

At Autodesk, part of our mission is to create a better industry for today and tomorrow. Through our Make It Real program, we encourage young people to engage with their communities by applying the design thinking process to real problems related to construction and the built environment. Two key initiatives include:

- "Make It Modular" Scholarship Award: We challenged high school students to upcycle materials and reuse waste in the design of a structure that meets a need in their community and could also be repurposed in the future. Winners of the contest earned scholarship prizes totaling \$50,000 to support educational expenses such as tuition, books, room and board, transportation, and childcare.
- Building Changemakers Microgrant Application: This \$500 grant is intended for students ages 17-22 in the U.S. who are

California Awards \$96 Million for Climate Projects in 10 Frontline Communities

The state today approved \$96.2 million in grants to support 10 disadvantaged, unincorporated and tribal communities across California to plan and implement neighborhood-level projects that reduce greenhouse gas emissions, improve public health and the environment and expand econom-

ic opportunity for residents.

Combined, the 10 projects approved today will reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 64,000 metric tons, equivalent to taking 14,000 cars off the road for one year.

"California is empowering communities on the frontlines of the climate crisis to tackle pollution and build resilience in their own neighborhoods," said Governor Gavin Newsom. "This innovative support for community-led projects across the state will bring environmental, health and economic benefits to Californians for decades to come."

The California Strategic Growth Council voted unanimously today to approve this grant funding through the Transformative Climate Communities (TCC) program, which has awarded a total of \$230 million in 26 communities since 2016. In total, the state has allocated \$661 million to the TCC program since 2016. The program is an important component of the Governor's multi-year \$54 billion California Climate Commitment to advance economic opportunity and environmental justice in communities across the state.

The current round of TCC grant funding will support seven planning grants and implementation of three climate resilience infrastructure proposals. Planning grants provide pre-construction support to communities to successfully apply to future funding rounds though TCC or other funding sources, while implementation grants fund affordable housing, transit access, energy efficiency, building electrification, water and waste management, green infrastructure, air quality, workforce training, anti-displacement programs and more.

The TCC grants approved today will support projects in disadvantaged, unincorporated and tribal communities across the state:

- \$35,000,000 Award to South Los Angeles Eco-Lab
- \$35,000,000 Award to Richmond Rising
- \$24,165,510 Award to City of Stockton, Stockton Rising
- \$300,000 Award to County of San Diego

Small Businesses Find Solutions to Workforce Challenges in Criminal Justice Reform

Small Business Majority released new polling revealing bipartisan support for criminal justice reform, including implementing Clean Slate policies to create workforce diversity and expanding candidate pools.

The poll, conducted in six states – Georgia, Illinois, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Texas – found that 84% of small business owners agreed that Clean Slate policies would open up a pool of job applicants that deserve a second chance. Regardless of political affiliation (30% of respondents identified as Republican, 37% of respondents identified as Democrat, and 27% of respondents identified as Independent), small businesses shared support for policies that can help boost labor recruitment. Given the ongoing workforce challenges hindering small business growth, the poll results confirmed widespread backing for policies that seal or expunge qualifying criminal records from background checks.

"Enacting policies that help us tap into a larger pool of candidates only makes sense," said John

Arensmeyer, Founder & CEO, Small Business Majority. "Our new opinion poll reveals that small business owners are optimistic about their business conditions despite rising inflation, ongoing supply chain disruptions, and daunting hiring and recruiting labor needs. However, 63% of respondents say it's hard to find quality candidates. Smaller firms widely support legislation that improves second-chance hiring opportunities for justice-impacted individuals, opening the candidate pool to those eager to contribute to their local economy and community. We are happy to join coalitions like the Workforce and Justice Alliance to help drive national change while also supporting small businesses seeking to engage in criminal justice reform efforts.'

For many small business owners, criminal justice reform is more than laws passed on Capitol Hill. One in three American adults has some form of criminal or arrest record, which can negatively impact families and communities. Even a minor criminal record can create lifelong barriers to employment, and communities of color are disproportionately affected. Small Business

Majority network members have often anecdotally shared that although they've had positive experiences with second-chance hiring, stigma can sometimes impede efforts to tap into this pool of applicants. The poll reveals that small businesses are aware of the inequities in the U.S. criminal justice system and agree with the following sentiments:

- 83% agree one way to expand the productivity and diversity of our nation's workforce is by making it easier for employers to recruit from underused candidate pools.
- 79% agree that removing barriers to employment for people with criminal records will save tax dollars by reducing recidivism and the need for long-term government assistance
- 71% agree that the U.S. criminal justice system disproportionately impacts people of color, leading to employment barriers and economic mobility.

"America is a nation of possibilities, but too often those possibilities are thwarted by stereo-

types and prejudices," said Jonathan Summers, Founder, Sage Leadership Academy, Riverside, Calif. "As a small business owner and a formerly incarcerated person, I know what it means to open doors for others and give people a second chance. By doing that, I've learned that people are more similar than dissimilar, and most people are genuine at heart. This attitude has served my business well. I implore other small business owners to get past their personal fear and employ justice-impacted individuals because they could become your business's rockstars."

This report outlines support for policies that can help address our country's hiring challenges. Utilized on federal and state levels, the poll findings make the case for stronger legislation that can help to reduce barriers to a diverse labor pool created by inequities in the criminal justice system.

The complicated process of recycling batteries in Washington state

At first glance, you might think Phil Currie is holding the world's least appetizing bar of chocolate. But the damaged computer battery — glossy, dark and segmented into bulging squares within a large Ziploc — presents a much bigger health risk than a Hershey's.

"We can't put these with other batteries because it might cause a fire," said the environmental field site specialist, standing amid drums and boxes full of battery waste at the North Seattle Hazardous Waste Facility. The collection site on Stone Avenue North, sandwiched between Aurora Avenue North and Haller Lake and decorated with whimsical frog statues, is one of four sites in King County where county residents can regularly drop off hazardous waste, including batteries.

More people are using batteries as battery-powered tools become bigger parts of our lives, from laptops to electric vehicles promising to release us from the grip of fossil fuels. But anything that holds a charge will ultimately need to be carefully disposed of. Rechargeable batteries like

nickel, lithium-ion, and lead batteries can be recycled into silverware, pots and pans, stainless steel and even new batteries. Single-use alkaline and lithium batteries can also be recycled into steel, with the former ending up in products as varied as road asphalt and sunscreen.

This creates more opportunities for people to dispose of batteries improperly, polluting the environment and putting waste processors' health at risk.

Many batteries can be recycled with the help of people like Currie and his colleague Diana Doyle. Recycling enables the reuse of metals and critical minerals such as lithium, cobalt and nickel that are in increasingly short supply and often inhumanely acquired.

"I see people wanting to do the right thing, often," Doyle said. "A lot of times they'll bring, literally, bless their heart, one battery in... from five miles away."

But many people don't know how, or don't have the resources, to dispose of batteries correctly. People involved in King County recycling and hazardous waste management as well as environmental advocates worry that the existing county and state systems and voluntary manufacturer take-back efforts just can't keep up with demand in a safe way. Consumers need more help to dispose of their batteries safely, cheaply and equitably.

"We're making all these really amazing strides to help us and to improve our environment. And we're now realizing that those strides have some consequences, such as we really don't have a system set up to handle all these battery-containing products that we are now creating," said Tristen Gardner, who works on battery policy for the county.

A big boost in battery use — and potential harm

King County collects hazardous waste from at least 2.1 million residents and 60,000 businesses across 38 cities, unincorporated areas and two tribal nations, and has collected batteries for at least 15 years. In 2019, the Hazardous Waste Management Program collected 90,000 pounds of batteries from households and 4,000 pounds from businesses. Household batteries make up nearly 18% of King County's hazardous waste collection.

Gardner said about 200,000 pounds of batteries were properly disposed of in 2020. It's tough to say how many batteries are used in King County, which would give a better idea of proper disposal rates.

The county estimates 914,000 pounds of household single-use and rechargeable batteries were sent to Cedar Hills Regional Landfill in 2019 — about three times as much as in 2011, when 296,000 tons were sent there.

At the state level, the Department of Ecology reports that between 2016 and 2021, hazardous waste facilities working with households and small businesses collected 31% more batteries. "The amount of batteries in the waste stream is too small to detect any trends. But we know the use of batteries in consumer goods is growing exponentially," said Ecology's Dave Bennett.

That increase puts battery management "close to the top" of concerns for people thinking about recycling and product stewardship, said Adrian Tan, policy and market development manager for the King County Solid Waste Division. Based on what his colleagues see at landfills, people aren't disposing of batteries well.

7 Mistakes a Seasoned Estimator Knows Not to Make

Construction is an industry with razor-thin margins. It's important not to overlook the importance of comprehensive budgets and estimates when companies are working under immense pressure to get work done on time and for a profit.

Overlooking cost variances may lead to big hits to your profit margin. That's why the most experienced and tenured estimators across the industry handle their projects differently, focusing on cost certainty and leveraging all the tools at their disposal. They use data to their advantage and spend their time increasing accuracy and reducing errors, until they have a high level of confidence their project will fall inside the upper and lower limits of their estimate.

As an estimator, there are things you need to be picky about. There are also sand traps that you need to avoid. Fortunately, with a few small changes, you can more often avoid potential mistakes and improve your estimates in the long term

1. Spreadsheet reliance

Spreadsheets may sometimes be a bit of a necessary evil – you may need them sometimes, but overreliance can hinder the estimation process. Working solely or primarily out of spreadsheets leaves your estimates prone to error. Manual inputs and human error, accidentally deleting a spreadsheet, or not having all the spreadsheets you need in one place can all lead to damaging errors.

Consider using cloud-based construction estimating software to reduce your reliance on spreadsheets. Rather than going back and forth between different spreadsheets, you can keep all the little details you need in one place. As an estimator, a cloud-based cost estimating solution can help keep your company competitive, because you can create realistic bids faster.

2. Not using templates

When you have a template, it's much easier to make sure you have consistency across project bids. Not starting from scratch every time is a good way to save time, yes, but it also means you're less likely to omit important information.

With templates, you can prefill vital information, such as your business's contact information, contract terms, and other details that could influence the value of your bid or the work you're doing. You want a good template that has all the agreed-upon rates printed clearly for yourself and your clients.

3. Not performing adequate risk analysis

Risk analysis is simply a part of the job for you, because not realizing all the potential risks could mean that you put together an estimate for a project that is just too low. From bespoke and niche designs that add time and additional ma-

terial costs to not factoring in material cost increases, you could run into trouble if the risks end up coming to fruition.

When you're assessing a new project, take the time to really get to know it. Take a spin in the model, ask the VDC manager or project manager for an overview, any familiarity you can gain will benefit you in the long hall. If there is any part of the project that is a high risk, keep digging until you understand the possible downsides of that part of the build.

4. Not using available models

2D and 3D models are an essential part of creating an accurate estimate. The best estimators know how and when to leverage models to get the most benefits out of them.

As mentioned under #3, models help you better visualize a design or the plans for a project, so you have a real grasp of the full scope of the project. With the right model, you'll be able to generate a more accurate takeoff, faster. Keep in mind, too, that having instant access to model quantities for items that are tedious or hard to count accurately in 2D will save you time and reduce the risk of omissions and miscalculations.

5. Not using the right pricing

Not using the right pricing causes issues. Remember that you must account for changes in the cost of labor or materials in different regions. You may even need to calculate different pricing based on the time of year or changes in the economy.

For the most accurate estimate, you'll at least need pricing that you can change automatically based on the region you're working in. You should be able to access transparent pricing information, including the current prevailing wages and private wages in the area. Using a construction cost database helps you start out your bid with the right cost information available at your fingertips.

6. Not checking your work

According to a survey by Quickbooks, 1 in 4 construction companies would go out of business if they made just two or three inaccurate estimates. Double checking your work is of the utmost importance to avoid errors that could hurt your business's bottom line.

The last thing you want is to see that you won a fixed-price-contract but undershot the actual estimate by 5, 10, or even 20% of its true value.

7. Not counterchecking subcontractor proposals

Subcontractors submit project bids for different jobs, and it's your job to go through the proposals to see what is or is not included. You need to make sure that the subcontractors didn't miss part of their scope or omit it from the bid.

When you dig through these proposals, you're giving yourself the opportunity to countercheck the subcontractors' work and to make sure they're not overquoting the price.

Improve Your Estimates and Make Better Bids

Improving your estimates is possible if you use the right software. Construction cost databases, construction takeoff software, and construction estimating software all help you be sure you have the right numbers to make decisions about your project.

With the right information, you'll reduce the likelihood of underbidding and minimize the chances of errors of omission. Consider trying ProEst construction estimating software and Autodesk Takeoff to take your project from bid to takeoff more quickly and easily than before.

"Make It Modular" Scholarship Award Winners



Sophia DiLoreto, Senior, Wachusett Regional High School, Massachusetts

Tell us about your submission. What inspired you to enter the design challenge?

My submission was for a design challenge in which a shipping container was to be repurposed into something greater. I decided to design an outdoor classroom that could be sent out after a natural disaster, to be used during construction, etc. What inspired me to get involved in the design challenge was the challenge itself. Designing an entire classroom made out of a shipping container is a grand feat. I wanted to push my creative ability and produce something I was truly proud of. Looking back, I realize that my design has the potential to be used in the real world.

What impact do you think the scholarship will have on your future?

I believe that this scholarship has given me a huge step into the computer drafting and design field. If students are looking for a good resume builder, the Instructables challenges are great for it! A prize or placement is not necessary for colleges or future employers to see dedication and creativeness. Not only that, but this scholarship has given me confidence in my creations. After putting hours and days into my design, I started to see the things I was capable of.

Why are you inspired to pursue a career in the AEC (architecture, engineering, and construction) industry? What impact do you hope to make in the industry?

I am interested in pursuing a career in the engineering industry because I feel as though it has the greatest impact on communities and people's personal lives. I've always found the engineering field fascinating as there are so many different opportunities to try. I hope to bring new ideas and processes into the engineering field. I

believe the engineering industry has the chance to make people's everyday lives a little bit easier and make their quality of life better.



Michael Hidalgo of Florida, Freshman, Miami Dade College, Florida

Tell us about your submission. What inspired you to enter the design challenge?

From the moment I learned about the challenge, I knew I wanted to enter. I was presented with a platform to share my solution to the increasing homeless population and cost of living. On my way to school, I would notice how the homeless would live by an intersection for days or weeks at a time before they would find something more stable. Next to this intersection, there's also a large parking lot that is never at capacity. I thought it would be effective to create inexpensive self-sustained modular home units that could be placed and relocated where needed. That was easier said than done. The research took time, and it was often discouraging.

The more I researched the more hurdles I encountered and that required me to research even more. I wanted this project to be feasible and creating a completely self-sustaining home out of a 20' x 8' x 9'6" container without spending too much money was difficult. Everything from space to plumbing to electricity to cooling to withstanding the elements was a challenge. Allocating my time between the design challenge and my other responsibilities was difficult. I spent almost a month gathering information and creating different potential plans before I started designing. Once I started designing, I very quickly realized I had no idea how to digitize my ideas. I had to do more research and learn how to use the software.

The entire process was a back-and-forth between an idea popping up, researching the viability, and figuring out how to put it into my digital model. This was all very frustrating because there was a challenge at every step, but I had to overcome them. Exceptionally frustrating were the renderings, I collectively spent over a week with my computer on day and night rendering, and it was heartbreaking when my computer would crash, or I'd notice I should make a change and must redo a series of renders.

Creating the physical prototype was straightforward after the digital model had been completed but it posed some challenges because I hadn't done anything like it. I knew a 3D printer would make the entire process much easier, but I didn't have access to one, so I made the best of what I had. Almost everything I did on the physical model was an application of the basic principles I had learned in my art classes. Scoring cardstock was an example that allowed me to create

the exterior walls. Everything took much longer than I had anticipated, both for the physical and digital models.

If I were to give advice, it would be to start early and don't get discouraged because you can do it even though it may not initially seem like it.

What impact do you think the scholarship will have on your future?

The Autodesk Construction Solutions Scholar-ship Award has given me hope. Since completing my entry, I've enrolled in a two-year community college because of the high cost of universities. Now that I've been awarded the scholarship, the ability to use it for housing has freed me to explore state universities across Florida and possibly out of state. However, the most valuable thing this scholarship has provided me is hope. I had never thought I could earn a \$10,000 scholarship. This whole experience has come as a shock to me and has encouraged me to continue pushing myself.

Why are you inspired to pursue a career in the AEC industry? What impact do you hope to make in the industry?

From a young age, I've always wondered how tall buildings, highway overpasses, and bridges are designed and built. I always had a curiosity, but I didn't necessarily see it as a career path. It took me a while to learn that civil engineering was what I wanted to study. I didn't have any college graduates in my family, nor did I know any engineers. Through research, clubs, and job shadowing that connected me with people in the industry, I was able to solidify this was the industry I wanted to be in.

In our country, our infrastructure is aging even though we continue increasing our reliance on them. Infrastructure is falling into disrepair and instead of preventing what we have from deteriorating, we only react once it is too late. In the AEC industry, I hope to implement ways to save our current infrastructure and create a more resilient and robust future.

I first learned about the Make It Modular design challenge through the ACE Mentor Program, a club that I was a part of during high school. I thought that this design challenge would be a great way to practice the many skills that I picked up from ACE Club and my school courses.

What are some problems that the building industry is facing right now?
