Finding Subcontracting Opportunities with Major Corporations

Are you looking for new sales avenues for your small business? You may want to consider subcontracting with major corporations. There is lots of opportunity in this arena, because big corporations have huge budgets and many needs. But sell-

doing, and where they may need some assistance.

Big companies have procurement departments that deal with subcontractors and suppliers and will require you to submit a request for proposal. At least, that's the official line. In reality, this approach usually leads to frustration. Why? Because the other companies submitting RFPs are often current subcontractors who are likely to keep getting the business.

Win Big By Thinking Small

So what can you do? Avoid the procurement department and think small. Big companies are organized into functional units within divisions of the corporation. You'll get better results by pitching your services to a functional unit instead of going through the procurement department. You can also approach a regional office instead of corporate headquarters.

Diversity Means Opportunity

One exception to this advice is if you are a woman, a minority, or a military veteran. Many large corporations have supplier diversity programs that actively seek small businesses owned by women, veterans, or minorities as subcontractors. You can get more information about supplier diversity programs and certification here:

Keep in mind that supplier diversity programs generally require you to be certified as a woman-owned, veteran-owned, or minority-owned business. If you're not yet certified, or don't want to go through the process at this time, you can still approach a business through its functional units.

Tips for Making Business Contacts

Your next step is to drill down even further and find the key decision-makers within the functional unit you're approaching. Use social networking sites to get connected with the specific

Should All Documents on Public Contracts Be Public Information?

When a private company -- designer, constructor or manager -- contracts with a government entity, should that company's dealings with other private companies be a matter of public record? That was the question posed in a recent case out of Minnesota.

The contract called for the design, management and construction of public schools. The contractor had subcontracted the architectural design to another company. The publisher of a local newspaper requested a copy of the subcontract. The prime contractor and the architect objected, citing confidential and proprietary information contained in the subcontract.

A Minnesota court ruled that the prime contractor had been performing a "governmental function." The subcontract was a foreseeable, integral part of that function. The subcontract was public information.

This case was decided under a state statute, the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act. But most states have similar statutes. Should subcontract and other project data become public information simply because the project owner is a government entity? I welcome your comments.

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What Is the True Cost of Getting a Building Certified as Green via LEED, BREEAM, or DGNB?

Just how much money will it take to cover the direct and indirect costs of getting a building certified as green? There are, of course, multiple variables affecting the true cost of certification for any given project, but during a recent WPL Publishing webinar, green building expert Kelly Gearhart provided some helpful insight into what expenditures can be expected when pursuing green building labels through the Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED), Building Research Establishment Environmental Assessment Method (BREEAM), and Deutsche Gesellschaft für Nachhaltiges Bauen e.V. (DGNB) rating systems.

"[F]or a typical LEED project -- and what I mean by that in this context is a new construction project -- you can expect to pay around \$1,200 to register [it]," said Gearhart, Triple Green Building Group LLC principal. She noted that actual certification for such a project will average about \$0.045 per square foot. In addition, specialists will need to be paid for their work.

For BREEAM, pursuing certification as a community development will run approximately £5,000 (\$US8,018) for "the beginning stages," she said, adding that certification will cost roughly another £5,000 with further outlays for specialists (i.e., planning and consulting).

"And for DGNB, [when estimating] an average [for] a mid-range building size, you are going to be looking at certification costs of 18,000 (\$US23,337) plus 0.17 (\$US0.22) per square meter" with specialist costs adding to that total, Gearhart said. She reported a recent estimate that there is less than a 0.5 percent premium for planning and consulting associated with DGNB-certified buildings.

Gearhart stressed that these estimates will change relative to multiple variables, such as whether the party pursuing certification becomes a member of the organization whose rating system is being used. "Each of these organizations tend to offer member discounts. Each of these organizations also tend to have different levels of costs, depending on the kind of project that you are embarking on. For example, if you were pursuing the certification as a small commercial office building, the cost for doing that -- the cost to these organizations to help you with that -- is dramatically different than if you are asking them to help you with certifying a 50-acre neighborhood development, so keep that in mind."

Gearhart additionally discussed the basic certification process for achieving certification, international market leaders, the documentation process for certification, minimum standards, resources, and other topics.

Fresno State a leader in developing minor in Urban Civic Education

Fresno State will graduate three students in December with a new Urban Civic Education minor designed to prepare leaders to address community issues.

The program is an outgrowth of a \$50,000 grant from the American Association of State Colleges and Universities. Fresno State was one of five universities in the United States to receive the grant.

Another 10 Fresno State students will graduate in May with the minor, said Dr. Steven Hart, an assistant professor of literacy and early

childhood education in the Kremen School of Education and Human Development.

The interdisciplinary minor is available to all students in any academic discipline and is especially complementary for the work of students pursuing careers in education, psychology, criminal justice, social services, international affairs and community advocacy, said Hart, the program coordinator.

Hart said there are two goals in mind for the students:

- Understanding social, economic and cultural aspects of the community and their impact on residents.
- Developing organizational and leadership skills to help address substantive issues facing local communities and global society.

Emphasis is on service-learning experiences and instructional methods. The Urban Civic Education minor provides an interdisciplinary perspective to studying diverse urban cultural communities, issues challenging them and cultural and community influences on urban children's education.

"With service learning, we connect academics with the community as students are actively engaged with hands-on, real-world experience," said Hart. "They are career-ready with skills to be 'stewards of place' when they graduate."

Mayor Lee Announces Significant Step Forward in Central Waterfront Revitalization & Job Creation

\$58 Million Investment to Create Vibrant Mixed Use Commercial Corridor with Estimated 500 New Jobs

Mayor Edwin M. Lee with Supervisor Malia Cohen announced the introduction of a resolution approving a term sheet for a total investment of \$58 million and findings of fiscal feasibility for the Pier 70 Historic Core project. The Pier 70 Historic Core, the most intact 19th Century industrial complex west of the Mississippi River, is a collection of six historic commercial and industrial buildings that line 20th Street near Illinois Street that are located south of the new UCSF Research Campus at Mission Bay. When the project is complete, the buildings will accommodate a range of new businesses from light industrial, commercial office, studios and showrooms for artists as well as neighborhood dining destinations, in addition to creating an estimated 500 new jobs.

“Encouraging investment in the Central Waterfront is one of my top priorities, and this legislation is an early step forward and a sign that San Francisco is serious about investment in our waterfront,” said Mayor Lee. “From the Warriors Arena at Piers 30-32, to the Giants’ Mission Rock development just south of the ballpark, to Pier 70, we have an opportunity to transform this waterfront corridor into a vibrant neighborhood and regional destination while creating a center for manufacturing. In the Pier 70 area, I’m especially proud of our commitment to balance the need for open space, maritime facilities, historic rehabilitation and new development sites.”

“I am proud to co-sponsor this legislation and to continue working with Mayor Lee and the community to revitalize and restore the historic 19th Century buildings on Pier 70,” said Supervisor Cohen. “Our Central and Southern Waterfront were once the hubs of vibrant commercial activity. The investment that is being made in Pier 70 will revitalize these historic spaces with 21st Century uses, add publicly accessible open spaces and restore this area to the vibrant commercial center it once was.”

Orton Development Inc. specializes in large-scale commercial and industrial rehabilitation and redevelopment projects. Orton has redeveloped over 16 million square feet of buildings, with projects including office, industrial, R&D, loft, and warehouse space. Following a competitive developer solicitation process in May 2012, the Port entered into an exclusive negotiation agreement with Orton for the lease, rehabilitation, and development of the 20th Street Historic Buildings. Orton presented its conceptual project to the Port Commission on July 10, 2012. The proposed term sheet between the Port of San Francisco and Orton Development Inc. was approved by the Port Commission on October 9, 2012.

The Pier 70 Historic Core buildings themselves evoke an era when even industrial buildings were constructed as near-cathedrals: the enormous Union Iron Works Machine Shop, built

in 1885-86 is clad in rose-colored brick, with a 60 foot interior height, building-length skylights and row-upon-row of high arched windows down the entire façade. Its companion building is the Union Iron Works (UIW) Office Building, a Renaissance Revival structure built in 1896, with rounded porticos, two-story arched windows, and a copper “headband” topping its façade.

Two Classical Revival buildings put up by the 1905 successor to UIW, Bethlehem Steel, at the height of the City Beautiful Movement, are appointed in hardwoods, marble, brass, and elegant tile. The Administration Building, finished in 1917, was built at the corner as the grand entry to the Shipyard. It was the most modern and impressive office building of its time. Next to it is the Power House, an elegant Beaux Arts structure built five years earlier to house four large air compressors used by the shipyard and have remained there.

The final two structures are a metal-clad foundry-and-warehouse dating from 1916, with unusual windows and monitor skylights and a basic heavy warehouse, dated to 1941, housing more huge cranes. Both were used during the round-the-clock emergency shipyard work carried out all through World War II.

The Pier 70 Historic Core project is one piece of a larger vision for Pier 70 – a 69-acre historic maritime industrial area. The overall vision for a revitalized Pier 70 is to create an economic driver for the City, connecting San Francisco’s Innovation

Corridor from the Financial District to the Hunters Point Shipyard. A new destination for locals and visitors alike, Pier 70 will eventually include new public parks, a vibrant mixed-use commercial core and facilities to accommodate San Francisco’s 21st century industries including artisanal manufacturing, technology and biotechnology. The Pier 70 project also includes a partnership with Forest City to redevelop the waterfront site, an approximately 25-acre development project at the eastern shoreline of Pier 70. It also includes rehabilitation of existing historic structures, the creation of shoreline open space and a primary role in returning Pier 70 to its historic level of activity and use. A term sheet with Forest City for the waterfront site is anticipated for early 2013.

Sepulveda Pass Corridor



The Sepulveda Pass is a vital regional transportation corridor connecting the San Fernando Valley with the Westside region of Los Angeles. The Sepulveda Pass Corridor is one of twelve transit projects funded by Measure R and is included as part of the America Fast Forward Initiative. Potential project alternatives could include rail transit, bus rapid transit service on the I-405 carpool lanes with bus-only on and off ramps, peak-hour bus rapid transit-only shoulder lanes, or a transit/toll facility. All elevations (surface running, aerial, tunnel, etc.) and parallel routes, such as Sepulveda and Van Nuys Boulevards, will be explored.

\$1 billion funding was allocated for this corridor in the Measure R sales tax measure that was approved by the voters of Los Angeles County in November 2008. However, funding would not be available until the third decade

of the plan unless new ways to accelerate the funding or alternative means of funding the project are identified.

Metro Planning is currently conducting an initial Systems Planning Study of various modal concepts for the Sepulveda Pass Corridor. As a part of this review, staff will examine a potential multimodal transit/express toll road concept for the corridor. Also, Metro may explore public-private partnership (P3) and/or congestion pricing/tolling options to help accelerate the timing of the Measure R project. Once a set of potential concepts is identified, the Metro Board may then decide to undertake an in-depth analysis of the economics and feasibility of a P3 approach. Preliminary approaches for this corridor were presented to the Metro Board in June 2012. A comprehensive report of viable concepts for further study and environmental analysis will be completed in late 2012.
