High-Speed Rail Authority to Receive Record \$3.1 Billion From Biden Administration

In the single strongest show of federal support to date, the US Department of Transportation has awarded the California High-Speed Rail Authority (Authority) nearly \$3.1 billion in grant funding for continued progress on the country's first electrified 220-mph high-speed rail system.

"California is delivering on the first 220-mph, electric high-speed rail project in the nation,"

said Governor Gavin Newsom. "This show of support from the Biden-Harris Administration is a vote of confidence in today's vision and comes at a critical turning point, providing the project new momentum."

This is the largest grant the Authority has received and was made possible by President Biden's Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act. This influx of funding will build on the project's ongoing success which has created over 12,000 good paying union jobs to the region.

"I am proud to champion this historic federal investment for California High-Speed Rail," said US Senator Alex Padilla. "California has never been afraid to take on big and bold challenges — including the development of the nation's first true high-speed rail network. Thanks to the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law and President Biden's leadership, California has a partner in this effort to power our economy, reduce emissions, and connect our communities through high-speed rail."

"California takes great pride in our ambitious status as the leading edge of high-speed rail in America. With this new \$3.07 billion in federal funding, we take an important leap closer to making high-speed rail a reality in California," Speaker Emerita Nancy Pelosi said. "An electrified high-speed rail network will dramatically improve the quality of life in the Central Valley and up and down California. These bullet trains will make travel quicker and easier, bring housing closer, create new jobs and economic opportunities that would otherwise be out of reach, secure cleaner air for our children and help save our planet. Thank you to President Biden and Secretary Buttigieg for their recognition of the importance of high-speed rail to California and to our Nation'

"For decades, I've worked to make California's high-speed rail system a reality. Thanks to the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law I helped pass; we now have significant investment to make major progress. I worked to secure this \$3.1 billion federal grant to ensure continued economic growth and investments in California's San Joaquin Valley. I want to thank President Biden, Governor Newsom, and our partners. We still have much more work to be done," said Congressman Costa.

"This historic federal investment sends a clear message that America is serious about highspeed rail, starting right here in California. With

Readout of SBA Administrator Guzman's Convening of Small Business Lending Summit

On Tuesday, December 12, Administrator Isabel Casillas Guzman, head of the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) and the voice in President Biden's cabinet for America's 33 million small businesses, hosted a Small Business Lending Summit at the White House alongside the National Economic Council (NEC) to discuss the Biden-Harris Administration's strong

record on lending to small businesses. The event focused on innovative programs and lending models that the federal government is pioneering, and how the federal government can work with lending partners to close gaps and ensure capital access for all creditworthy small businesses, especially those that are traditionally underserved or hard to reach.

The Summit, which brought together many of the SBA's largest lending partners, provided an opportunity for lenders to engage with the Biden-Harris Administration on actions taken to expand small business access to capital in underserved areas and throughout the country, and for Administration officials to learn more about how new and recently reformed policies are being implemented on the ground. In addition, SBA announced the creation of a Small Business Lending Federal Advisory Committee in the coming months to continue hearing directly from lenders and other stakeholders about how to best meet the capital needs of small businesses, especially in underserved communities.

The summit featured two roundtable discussions as well as remarks by Administrator Guzman, NEC Director Lael Brainard, and Council of Economic Advisors Member C. Kirabo Jackson. Participants shared successes for their small business lending strategies and highlighted how recent SBA changes to modernize their lending programs have allowed for a broader and more diverse set of credit-worthy businesses to access

loans, and how their improved processes have accelerated access to capital for small business borrowers. They also discussed strategies and shared best practices for facilitating more equity in small business lending.

Last year, the SBA partnered with lenders to provide a historic \$34 billion in small business loans through their signature 7(a) and 504 loan programs. These loans have helped promote inclusive economic growth, with \$5 billion going to women-owned businesses, a record \$3 billion going to Latino-owned businesses, and loans to Black-owned businesses more than doubling since 2020. Today's roundtable provided an opportunity for administration officials and lending leaders to discuss strategies to build on these successes to bring small business growth to new

This year's Just Future Summit wasn't your average conference. With 2023 marking



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

a federal partnership that's stronger than ever, we are well on our way to delivering fast, clean and reliable high-speed rail service to connect our state's population centers," said California Transportation Secretary Toks Omishakin. "I thank the Biden-Harris Administration and our Congressional leadership for this visionary investment in the future of transportation."

"This record federal grant is a welcomed investment in the future of this transformative project. The Authority is humbled by the expression of confidence and commitment from our federal partner," said High-Speed Rail Authority CEO Brian Kelly. "We look forward to advancing the project, putting more Californians to work and buying new, electrified high-speed trains, all made possible by this grant."

The \$3.073 billion will advance work in California's Central Valley including:

- Fund six electric trains for testing and use
- Fund design and construction of trainset facilities
- Fund design and construction of the Fresno station
- Fund final design and right-of-way acquisition for the Merced and the Bakersfield extensions
- Fund construction in the Central Valley

This most recent, and largest award received from the Biden-Harris Administration was made possible through the Federal-State Partnership for Intercity Passenger Rail Program (FSP-National). Over the last 12 months, the Authority has aggressively pursued and been successful in receiving federal funding under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA). Nearly \$202 million from the federal government was awarded in September to advance critical safety, grade separation work on the project, and in August, the Authority was awarded another \$20 million for the historic Fresno Depot and station site. With this award, the Authority has received more than \$3.3 billion in funding from this historic program.

In the last 12 months, the Authority has showed continued progress statewide. In 2023, ten structures were completedExternal Link along the first 119-miles of construction and environmental progress has continued with 422 of the 500-mile project now environmentally cleared.

With the southernmost 22-mile stretch of active construction currently on the verge of completion, the Authority continues advanced design work to extend the 119 miles under construction to 171 miles of future electrified high-speed rail from Merced to Bakersfield. The high-speed rail project has created more than 12,000 good-paying jobs since the start of construction, 70% of those going to Central Valley residents.

Mayor London N. Breed's latest round of small business reforms was approved by the Board of Supervisors today. The legislation, which was co-sponsored by Supervisors Joel Engardio,

Matt Dorsey, Myrna Melgar, Catherine Stefani, Rafael Mandelman, and Connie Chan will facilitate easier permitting for small businesses, encourage economic recovery and growth, and fill commercial vacancies in San Francisco.

This legislation builds on the significant small business reforms Mayor Breed has advanced over the last three years including the passage of Proposition H in 2020, the passage of the Small Business Recovery Act in 2021 and opening a new one-stop shop Permit Center.

Under the legislation, over 100 changes to the Planning Code will serve to ease restrictions across five main categories:

Allow more business uses on the ground floor

- · Lift restrictions on bars and restaurants
- Incorporate new liquor license for music venues
- Remove certain public notice requirements
- Enable priority processing for nighttime entertainment, bars, and restaurants

Since the City began implementing Proposition H in January 2021, over 3,500 businesses have benefited from the program, which allows more commercial projects to be processed within a shorter timeframe, in what's known as "overthe-counter," when permits applications are processed immediately upon submission.

"We are making it easier to fill vacant storefronts and support small businesses that are essential to our economy and the health of our neighborhoods," said Mayor London Breed. "This latest round of reforms builds on the work we've doing over the last few years to make it easier to open and operate a small business in this city. By getting rid of barriers and incentivizing people to invest their time and energy here, we can build a stronger San Francisco."

In addition to this approved legislation, Mayor Breed's recent budget extended First Year Free, which waives the cost of initial registration fees, initial license fees, first-year permit, and other applicable fees for qualifying businesses. Since the First Year Free program started in 2021, approximately 5,724 businesses have enrolled, with 3,640 of these completely new, and the remainder are existing businesses adding a new location. The City has waived more than \$2.38 million in fees since the program started.

This legislation and extension of the First Year Free program is integral to Mayor Breed's Roadmap to Downtown San Francisco's Future. One of the plan's nine strategies is to make it easier to start and grow a business. Simplifying City processes while reducing cost will encourage more businesses to start and remain in San Francisco.

"We started Wave as an art gallery and events popup in Lower Haight, and after an amazingly positive reception, realized there was a need for it to become a permanent space," said Jamila Keba, Owner and Co-Founder and Wave Collective on Haight Street. "The Flexible Retail use has allowed us to continue building a creative multifaceted community space that is gallery, cafe, workshop and event space."

Legislative Details

Allow more business uses on the ground floor and as principally permitted

Under the legislation, "Flexible Retail" would be principally permitted and expanded to all neighborhoods on the ground floor across the City's commercial corridors. An example of Flexible Retail includes a business that sells both plants and coffee, and then later shifts to selling plants and making small production bags on site. The proposed ordinance will also clarify that multiple uses are allowed in the same business space. Additionally, the legislation will expand the types of businesses that can open in ground floor spaces to create more opportunities to fill commercial vacancies.

Lift restrictions on restaurants and bars

Currently, several commercial corridors have restrictions in place for restaurants and bars, such

as not permitting them, imposing a cap on the number of restaurants that can be established, or requiring a Conditional Use Authorization (CUA). Conditional Use Authorization is a lengthy process for businesses to be granted approval for their plans, including providing public notice and attending hearings – CUA can add months to the process of opening a business.

Under the legislation, those restrictions will be lifted for new restaurants in Chinatown, along Haight Street, and Taraval Street. Likewise, restrictions on new bars will be lifted along Haight Street, Sacramento Street, and Union Street

Incorporate new liquor license for music venues

The ordinance will incorporate into local Planning Code a new liquor license, Type 90, which was adopted by the State in 2022. This new liquor license type gives venues more options as it allows a music venue to serve beer, wine, and liquor without excluding minors from the business

Remove the public notice requirement in Eastern Neighborhoods Mixed Use Districts for business changes

In November 2020, voters adopted the "Save our Small Business Initiative" (Proposition H), which reduced the steps a business owner needed to take when they change their business use. Before this, if a clothing store, for example, were to become a café, the change would require that the general public be provided notice about the change for at least 30 days and the business could not receive their Planning Department approvals over-the-counter, even though both types of businesses are permitted in the neighborhood. Under the legislation, these benefits will be expanded to the commercial corridors in the eastern portion of the City.

Enable nighttime entertainment, bars, and restaurants to benefit from priority processing at Planning Department/Commission

Currently, nighttime entertainment venues, bars, and restaurants with full liquor licenses are excluded from participation in the Planning Department's Community Benefit Priority Processing Program (CB3P). Under the legislation, nighttime entertainment venues, bars, and restaurants with full liquor licenses will benefit from expedited Conditional Use Authorization review, which can save a new business from months of waiting for a hearing at the Planning Commission

"Most bars, entertainment venues, and restaurants seeking liquor licenses are small businesses, yet they have been excluded from programs that enable fast-tracking of permits like other small businesses," said Steven Lee, managing partner of a legacy restaurant and nightclub in Chinatown, and is a board member of the California Music and Culture Association. "The legislation offers exciting incentives for entrepreneurs who are on the fence about opening new entertainment venues or bars in San Francisco given concerns about paying high rent while waiting for local approvals required to operate."

Mohammad, Tailoring and Alterations

Mohammad fled Afghanistan with his wife and three children in 2010. They stayed in Turkey until they resettled in the United States in 2018. Despite the hardship he initially faced in the first two years, he built a successful family tailoring and alterations business in his new home of Sacramento. Mohammad overcame economic, cultural, and language barriers to find stability and build a home for his family.

Mohammad has two full-time tailors and one sales representative. His business sells traditional Afghan attire and provides tailoring services for modern and traditional clothing and curtains.

In his shop, Mohammad offers free tailoring and alterations training for newly arrived Afghan women. His wife, who works alongside Mohammad, volunteers to train the women to sew modern dresses and traditional attire. She does so in their native languages, Dari and Pashto. She also volunteers weekly at a non-profit organization to teach 15-20 women

stitching and alterations. "My wife and I are fortunate to give back to our community. The women we train here can work from home and make money while caring for their kids," Mohammad says proudly.

A friend referred Mohammad to Opening Doors' Micro-Lending Program to enhance his business. He took a \$10,000 loan to expand his business at the Galt Flea Market, which specializes in serving Spanish-speaking clients.

Now working as a manager for both businesses, Mohammad says, "I am living a prosperous life! I have a successful business, and I am actively engaged in social events of my community where I give back."

Mohammad's journey is one of the many stories of immigrants paying it forward to their host communities by supporting new arrivals with opportunities to help them find self-suf-

Rising to the Challenge

The Rising Loafer Café and Bakery's mission is to "contribute to the well-being of their community." Their breakfast and lunch menus are prepared with locally grown ingredients to help reduce the business' carbon footprint and support the local economy. They also started a back-business garden and are a certified Bay Area Green Business

The Rising Loafer Café and Bakery has reduced their waste over 80 percent by recycling, reusing, and refurbishing materials. They banned $\mathsf{Styrofoam}^{\mathsf{TM}}$ products and $\ \mathsf{use}\ \mathsf{``real''}$ plates and silverware instead. All animal fats, plastics, cardboard, cans and glass are recycled and tables are made out of old doors. The Rising Loafer installed low flow faucets and toilets and uses energy and water efficient appliances. They also replaced light bulbs with energy saving units and installed timers on equipment.

The owners are recognized leaders in sustainability and regularly share their green restaurant knowledge and experience with other businesses in the community. They are also training young adults in environmentally-friendly operation of restaurants by partnering with the Job Corp of America and the Berkeley Youth Alternative to offer

Crestwood Healing Center is a behavioral health services provider which has gone above and beyond to reduce their carbon footprint and serve as a beacon of sustainability in their community. By implementing a sustainability team and creating a position for a Sustainability Coordinator, they have devised creative strategies to cut waste, reduce energy consumption, improve client satisfaction and have fun while doing it!

Seeing a need for greater environmental responsibility and an opportunity to make a significant impact, Crestwood made numerous operational changes with sustainability in mind. Single-use items such as tableware, napkins, water cups and pill containers have all been replaced with reusable versions. For 2016, staff estimate they avoided sending over 100,000 paper napkins and over 90,000 plastic cups to the landfill, saving almost \$2,000 in the process.

To reduce water usage, the facility identified and repaired all leaks, installed low-flow toilets and shower heads, and replaced faucet aerators.
