Women's History Month: A Bright Future For Women-Owned Small Businesses



Today, women-owned businesses are the fastest-growing segment of new businesses in our economy.

In fact, an analysis by American Express suggests that the number of women-owned businesses has risen by 200,000 over the past year alone, which is equivalent to just under 550 new women-owned firms created each day.

Regardless of how you slice the data, we know that this trend is growing and that women are over-indexing in entrepreneurship.

As Administrator of the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA), I travel all around the country meeting with small business owners and entrepreneurs. I see how their businesses are transforming their industries

and rebuilding their communities following the economic downturn.

These are businesses like UEC Electronics in South Carolina. Rebecca Ufkes, an engineer and the company's president, is laser focused on growing her successful electronics manufacturing business. She is supplying products to major manufacturers, such as Boeing, Cummins Engine Co, as well as the U.S. Marines and Air Force. And she is creating good American manufacturing jobs in the process.

UEC employs 194 workers, an increase of 49 percent since August 2011. And Rebecca is part of a growing American supply chain of innovative small businesses that is driving large multinational manufacturers to bring more production back to the U.S.

However, today, many women-owned entrepreneurs face what we call the "missing middle."

For example, take my home state of Maine. According to the most recent census data, men owned 54 percent of businesses in Maine and women owned 26 percent of businesses in the state (the remaining were co-owned). However, when you look at the receipts of these businesses, womenowned businesses lagged behind, capturing only 7 percent of receipts, compared to 78 percent of receipts earned by men-owned firms. There is a similar trend occurring in states across the country.

Clearly, women-owned firms are growing greater in numbers, but challenges persist in scaling their operations and garnering market share.

8 Essential Elements for Success

California Infrastructure Receives a Mediocre Grade on 2013 Civil Engineers Report Card

2012 Report Card for California's Infrastructure



Sacramento, CA (March 19, 2013) -- The American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) today released its latest report card on the state of the nation's infrastructure, and the grades for the past four years are less than stellar for both California and the nation as a whole.

The report http://www.infrastructurereportcard.org/?utm_campaign=GR-20130319Report%20Card%20Launch%20Email%201&utm_medium=email&utm_source=Eloqua points out that infrastructure is the foundation that connects: the nation's businesses, communities and people, driving our economy and improving our quality of life.

For the U.S. economy to be the most competitive in the world, we need a first class infrastructure system – transport systems that move people and goods efficiently and at reasonable cost by land, water and air; transmission systems that deliver reliable, low-cost power from a wide range of energy sources; and water systems that drive industrial processes as well as the daily functions in our homes. Yet today, said the report, our infrastructure systems are failing to keep pace with the current and expanding needs, and investment in infrastructure is faltering.

For the 2013 Report Card, America's cumulative GPA for infrastructure rose slightly to a D+

or poor. The grades in 2013 ranged from a high of B- for solid waste to a low of D- for inland waterways and levees. Solid waste, drinking water, wastewater, roads and bridges all saw incremental improvements, and rail jumped from a C- to a C+. No categories saw a decline in grade this year.

The facts on California's infrastructure -which received an overall grade of C or mediocre on the report -- are a "cause for statewide concern," says John Moossazadeh, current president of the Sacramento-based American Council of Engineering Companies of California.

"We remain in continuing state of disrepair in both our nation's infrastructure and here in California, as well. Many people don't realize that those who make decisions on where to locate new business expansions, new jobs and major corporate investments, consider the health of a state's infrastructure as a key decision point," says Moossazadeh. "The fact that we received barely a passing grade is of little solace when you consider the economic perils we face, the potential devastating impact on both our economy and lifestyle, and the need for a sustained investment in our infrastructure facilities."

The report breaks down the current state of California's infrastructure with a litany of both national and statewide facts and figures that

produce more questions than answers. Some of these numbers, says Moossazadeh, should open our eyes wide to the importance of investments that we must make if California is even going to come close to maintaining our current standard of living.

According to the report Card:

- California has 807 high hazard dams overseen by a dam safety program that has 60 full-time employees -- with each one responsible for overseeing an average of 20.9 state regulated
- Only 45% of the state regulated dams in California have an Emergency Action Plan.
- California has reported that it needs to invest \$39 billion just to keep up with drinking water needs over the next 20 years and another \$29.9 billion for the proper infrastructure required to treat wastewater.
- About 12% or 2,978 of our 24,812 bridges are considered structurally deficient and 16% (4,178) functionally obsolete.
- Driving on roads in need of repair costs California motorists \$13.892 billion a year in extra vehicle repairs and operating costs – \$586 per motorist.
