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6 Ways Drones Are Affecting the Construction Industry

The presence of drones in construction means significant changes within the industry. Drones have already begun changing the way the construction industry operates, and those changes will have continued and lasting effects. Here's a look at some of the ways drones have already changed things and how these trends will impact construction operations in the future.

Surveying Land

Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs) are rapidly replacing traditional land-surveillance methods.

They are growing in popularity so rapidly that some have even abandoned the classic "bird's-eye view" expression with "drone's-eye view." Drones greatly reduce the labor and time involved in producing accurate surveys. Drones eliminate much of the human error involved in the process and have the ability to capture necessary data in much less time than traditional methods would take.

Improvements to Infrastructure

Drones provide superior endurance and intelligence on job sites. Their ability to collect and report data allows work to be completed faster. The need for manual labor is all but removed from the equation. In the future, drones will take on even more integral tasks involved in large projects. They are poised to cut the time it takes to build a skyscraper by a broad margin, thereby cutting costs. Contractors who rely on drones will be able to make much more ambitious bids and complete work on time.

Communication and Management

Drone technology has evolved to the point where instant connectivity and communication on the job site are at a surplus. Drones are being used more and more as a means of maintaining constant contact at worksites. Drones that feature mounted cameras can provide video footage to facilitate communication and surveillance.

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The Federal Government Achieves Small Business Contracting Goal for the Fifth Consecutive Year

Record-Breaking \$105 Billion to Small Businesses

The U.S. Small Business Administration announced that the federal government met its small business federal contracting goal for the fifth consecutive year awarding 23.88 percent in federal contract dollars to small businesses totaling \$105.7 billion, an increase of \$5 billion. This marks the first time more than \$100 billion in prime contracts has been awarded to small businesses. The federal government earned an "A" on this year's government-wide scorecard.

"I am happy to report that for the fifth consecutive year, the federal government has not only met and exceeded its small business contracting

goal, but it has awarded \$105 billion to small businesses for the first time earning the government an A on SBA's scorecard for this remarkable achievement," said SBA Administrator Linda McMahon. "This grade reflects significant efforts by federal agencies toward meeting the 23 percent statutory goal to award prime contracts to small businesses. Every contract that gets in the hands of a small business owner is a win-win for the business, creating jobs in their communities, and boosting the nation's economy."

In fiscal year 2017, the federal government exceeded the service-disabled veteran-owned small business and small disadvantaged business goals.

Why Asian Pacific American Heritage Month is still necessary

The minute any Asian American makes an appearance in the mainstream media, the Facebook walls and Twitter feeds of other Asian Americans light up: We like the posts about Chloe Kim winning the Olympic Gold Medal for snowboarding, or retweet the trailer to Crazy Rich Asians, the first major motion picture featuring an all Asian cast in years.

Asian Americans are often proud of the fact that we can pull out the names of celebrities and politicians who are Asian at the drop of the hat, like it's some sort of party trick. But the truth is, we can do so because Asian Americans remain dramatically underrepresented in so many industries.

We are the fastest growing major racial group in America, yet we're still starved for representation in the media: That invisibility is why initiatives like Asian Pacific American Heritage Month are still so necessary.


Take a look at your movies, newspapers, the evening news. Asian Americans make up a little more than 4% of those who work for newspaper and online media outlets, according to the American Society of News Editors. A USC Annenberg study showed that in 2016, 44 of the 100 top American movies didn't feature even one speaking character on screen who was Asian.

In this country, Asian Americans seem to face a paradox: We're the "model minority," often held up as an example of a group that cannot claim discrimination because of our outsized performance on standardized tests and college attendance. It's an unfortunate stereotype sometimes used to oppress other racial groups, undermining solidarity with other minorities who struggle with representation issues, too. But it also erases the many Asian Americans living in poverty and struggling, and can fool some to thinking that Asian Americans have already made it in this country.

Asian Americans know otherwise — and this push for accurate representation is at the core of the mission of organizations such as the Asian American Journalists Association. Every May, we celebrate Asian Pacific American Heritage Month as a way to highlight the growing number of Asian American faces that we see in the media.

AAJA was founded in 1981 in Los Angeles, by a group of Asian-American journalists who were eager to help build up a pipeline for more journalists like themselves, and ensure that the news industry's coverage reflected the reality of the growing Asian community in this

The Federal Government Achieves Small Business Contracting Goal for the Fifth Consecutive Year

The federal government also exceeded its sub-contract goals for awards to Women-Owned Small Business and Small Disadvantaged Businesses and awarded \$75 billion in subcontracts to all small businesses. The fiscal year 2017 prime and subcontracting awards to small businesses equate to nearly one million jobs created to support the nation's economy.

SBA continues to collaborate with federal agencies to expand small business opportunities for small business contractors to compete and win federal contracts. The FY2017 Small Business Procurement scorecard analyzed the prime contracting and subcontracting performance, and

other contributing factors which resulted in an overall "A" grade for the federal government. Eight agencies received A+, 12 received a grade of "A", three received a "B" grade and one received a "C" grade.

About the Scorecard

The annual Procurement Scorecard is an assessment tool to (1) measure how well federal agencies reach their small business and socio-economic prime contracting and subcontracting goals, (2) provide accurate and transparent contracting data and (3) report agency-specific progress. The prime and subcontracting component goals include goals for small businesses, small businesses owned by women, small disad-

vantaged businesses, service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses, and small businesses located in Historically Underutilized Business Zones (HUBZones).

Every year, the SBA works with each agency to set their prime and subcontracting goals and their performance is based on the agreed upon goals. Each federal agency has a different small business contracting goal, determined annually in consultation with the SBA. The SBA ensures that the sum total of all of the goals exceeds the 23 percent target for the federal government as well as the socio-economic goals established by law.

While each federal agency is responsible for ensuring the quality of its own contracting data,

SBA conducts additional analyses to help agencies identify potential data anomalies. As part of its ongoing data quality efforts, the SBA works with federal agency procurement staff to provide analysis and tools to facilitate review of data, implement improvements to procurement systems and conduct training to improve accuracy.

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Access to Capital

Microloans a glimmer of hope for small businesses in need

Three weeks after the February 2016 launch of New York-based event marketing company The XP Agency, the company landed its first client.

"In order to complete the project, we needed \$60,000 to pay for our upfront costs of producing the event," co-founder Tamara Francois says. "Neither my business partner or I had the funds to cover these costs, so we sought a business loan."

Traditional lenders turned them down, so Francois went to an alternative lending non-profit called Community Capital, which offered microloans — small short-term loans designed to give

small businesses working capital. After submitting their business plan and proof that they had a signed contract from a major corporate client, The XP Agency secured a \$10,000 microloan and a \$100,000 line of credit. "I don't think we would have been able to sustain our business without it," Francois says.

Microloans can transform business for small companies such as The XP Agency. The Small Business Administration has a microloan program that works with non-profit community organizations across the country to provide loans to local small-business owners. While microloans are typically \$50,000 or less, businesses in regions that have less access to capital may

qualify for up to \$250,000.

The maximum repayment period for SBA microloans is six years, and the average SBA microloan in 2016 was \$13,533. But the SBA is not the only game in town.

The microloan market has evolved in the past five years, says Antara Dutta, a social entrepreneur and mentor with the Delaware chapter of SCORE, a volunteer network of small-business advisers. Many non-profit organizations, foundations and peer-to-peer lending networks have also entered the microloan market.

One such company is Funding Circle, a San Francisco-based lending platform that connects

investors with small-business owners. "Banks have really pulled back from doing small-business loans over the past decade," says Sarina Siddhanti, Funding Circle's U.S. Head of Commercial. "We fill that gap."

While Funding Circle awards business loans up to \$500,000, they also offer microloans to entrepreneurs who need less. One of those entrepreneurs was Bret Morey of Charlotte.

Morey and his son, Elijah, were bit by the business bug in 2014, thanks to their mutual love for hot peppers. When Elijah was 12, he asked his father if they could create their own hot sauce. That led to the launch of hot sauce company

The total estimated cost of the Contract is in the range of \$500 to \$625 million not including Options. The Design-Build Contract Work consists of furnishing all management and technical services including coordination, professional services, labor, equipment, materials, safety certification, training, spare parts, and other services to perform the design, manufacture, installation, testing and commissioning, and handover of the turnkey communications based train control system for BART. The Work includes related vehicle, wayside, communications and Automated Train Supervision (ATS) systems work. Subcontracting opportunities include, but are not limited to, electrical (C10) and track work, project management, construction services and support, and communications.

The District is also requiring Proposers submit Proposals for Contract No. 49GH-120 for Train Control Performance Support Services (TCPSS Contract) for a term of 10 years, with two 5-year Option extensions. The TCPSS Contract provides, among other things, replacement parts and support services to BART to ensure that after the new CBTC System is installed, it performs as defined per the CBTC Contract; that the District efficiently and effectively operates and maintains the CBTC System; and that the District has technical support for modifications (hardware/software) to the CBTC System. Proposer shall submit its Proposal for the TCPSS Contract with its Proposal for the CBTC Contract. The two Proposals will be reviewed together by the District as part of the Best Value evaluation.

Both the CBTC Contract and the TCPSS Contract will be awarded by the District at the same time.

The annual estimated cost of the TCPSS Contract is in the range of \$5 to \$7 million dollars.

country. Now, we have 20 chapters around the globe and more than 1,500 members, representing the more than 6% of Asian Americans who make up the country.

And yet, we still find ourselves missing from the ranks of newsroom leaders: A diversity survey by the American Society of News Editors showed that Asian Americans, Hawaiian and Pacific Islanders make up 3.31% of newsroom leaders in print and online outlets, while more than 86% of newsroom leaders are white.

It's tough to imagine the disparities don't matter when it comes to coverage. That's where AAJA plays a crucial role: as a watchdog and a liaison for our community. Among the instances AAJA leaders responded to in the past few years was in response to a Fox News satirical segment blatantly making fun of people in New York City's Chinatown.

Microloans a glimmer of hope for small businesses in need

Elijah's Xtreme. After creating another sauce in 2016, Morey ran into a problem most business owners experience when moving from one level to the next.

"You're using the profits from the one sauce to fund the other, and it really stretches your income and ability to grow," he says. To create additional products, Morey sought out a \$25,000 microloan from Funding Circle and used the money to develop a new marinade and a gift set. Without the funding, the company wouldn't have been able to expand its product line, Morey says.

The types of businesses that benefit from microloans are those that need cash for a specific purpose, such as buying new equipment, expanding the marketing program or stocking up on inventory before a busy season, Siddhanti says.

Small-business owners can also use microloans to build up their business credit history, Dutta points out. "You borrow small, and pay it back. Then as your business grows, larger banks will talk to you about larger lines of credit," Dutta says.

Some organizations offer microloans to people who fall within certain demographics, such as minorities or women.

Robyn Porteen of Grand Rapids, Mich., received a \$35,000 microloan from the Grand Rapids Organization for Women for her custom bag design company Porteen Gear. In 2010, Porteen was an international photographer who wanted a camera bag that was classy, yet inconspicuous — so she designed her own. "It was kind of the trailblazer for designer camera bags," she says.

When the product took off, she needed a commercial sewing machine, a website that would let people custom design their bags, and part-time help, which the microloan paid for.

One of the best things about microloans is that they allow small businesses to grow at their own pace, says Porteen, who paid off her microloan in five years. "A smaller loan felt safer. I didn't want to put all of my ducks into one big loan and then not be able to pay it."

How to qualify for a microloan

Every microloan lender has its own requirements, but here is what you can do to improve your chances of getting approved.

*Document your plans. Have a business plan as well as detailed documentation about how you plan to use the microloan, Dutta says. Also show how long it will take your business to recoup the funds to pay back the loan.

*Show a pattern of growth. "What we will look for first and foremost is solid business financials, which means we want to look at companies whose bottom-line profits or revenues have been growing," Siddhanti says.

*Don't neglect your credit. Entrepreneurs who have less-than-stellar credit have a better chance of getting a microloan than they might a traditional small-business loan because the requirements tend to be less stringent, Dutta says. But having good credit can only work to your advantage.
