

- 5. Arrange a call with a member of the franchise development department
- 6. On the call, share your story-and listen to theirs
- Decide if you'd like to continue learning more about the franchise
- 8. Follow the franchisors "next steps"

Take the steps

If you're still interested in possibly buying the franchise, continue down this list. If not, start your search for a franchise again.

- 1. Call several franchisees, and ask questions like these*
- 2. Visit franchisees-spend a day with one or two of them
- 3. Start writing a business plan*
- 4. Find a franchise attorney
- 5. Visit franchise headquarters
- 6. Have your attorney look over the franchise agreement
- 7. Make your decision

Your Wheels

It's right before your decision that your wheels will be spinning. Sometimes, they'll spin out of control. Things like self-doubt will creep into your head. Fear...real-live fear will also appear on your

doorstep. But, don't worry. It's completely normal.
