Tutor Perini JV to bore LACMTA Purple Line Extension tunnels



The Frontier-Kemper/Tutor Perini Joint Venture has received a notice of intent to award a contract from the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (LACMTA) for the Purple Line Extension Section 3 Tunnels Project, according to an announcement from Tutor Perini Corporation.

Officials said the contract is expected to be valued at about \$410 million. The project entails the design and construction of twin bored tunnels for LACMTA's future Purple Line subway service, which is set to stretch about 2.6 miles between Century City and a hospital in Westwood, Calif.

The Purple Line extension is intended to offer a high-capacity, high-speed, dependable transit option for commuters traveling to and from Los Angeles' West side.

Tutor Perini is presently working on the Purple Line Extension Section 2 Project, which officials said includes tunneling, as well as building new stations in Beverly Hills and Century City.

The company notes it has previously successfully completed subway and regional transportation projects, specifically having built major portions of Los Angeles' Red Line subway and San Francisco's Bay Area Rapid Transit system.

Tutor Perini is also in the midst of completing substantial work on San Francisco's Central Subway extension to Chinatown; California's High-Speed Rail system, which will link San Francisco and Los Angeles; New York's East Side Access project; and Washington State's Alaskan Way Viaduct Replacement project.

The contract award for the Purple Line Section 3 Tunnels Project is expected to be complete in the next 30 to 60 days, with notice to proceed expected to take place shortly after, officials said.

Substantial completion of this segment of the project is predicted to take place in the summer of 2022.

U.S. EPA recognizes three Bay Area Federal Green Challenge winners

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency recognizes the Presidio Trust, the Golden Gate National Recreation Area and the U.S. Forest Service for conserving resources and saving taxpayers' money as part of the Federal Green Challenge (FGC). These federal agencies were part of a national effort that resulted in approximately \$22 million in cost savings in the last year.

"Federal agencies nationwide challenge themselves to improve efficiency and minimize environmental impact, and their achievements are saving American taxpayers tens of millions of dollars," said EPA Administrator Scott Pruitt.

In 2017, FGC participants reduced the federal government's environmental impact by reducing fuel oil consumption by more than 206,000 gallons, sending nearly 300 tons of end-of-life

electronics to third-party certified recyclers, using almost 59 million fewer gallons of industrial, landscaping and agricultural water, and diverting over 422,000 tons of waste from landfills. Participants also prevented more than 840 tons of food from being landfilled through food donation and composting efforts.

"We applaud these agencies implementing innovative, sustainable practices," said Mike Stoker, Regional Administrator for EPA's Pacific Southwest Region. "The commitment by federal employees to reduce waste and be more energy efficient inspires other facilities to follow their example, and is of statewide benefit."

EPA is recognizing the following participants for improving the efficiency of their facilities in the following categories in 2017:

Leadership: Presidio Trust, San Francisco, Calif.

The Presidio Trust conducted waste audits across the site, including daily audits at locations with the most significant waste diversion challenges. Based on their findings, the Presidio Trust made changes at 11 buildings, including downsizing containers or waste hauling service, increasing diversion from landfill, and correcting the size or service for chronic bin overflow. The Presidio Trust also installed customized signage at the Rob Hill Campground to engage the public in recycling efforts. From 2016 to 2017, the Presidio Trust increased its reuse of materials by 47 percent and its composting by 30 percent.

Innovation: Forest Service, Vallejo, Calif.

The Forest Service Sustainability and Energy Team completed the Southern California Energy Savings Performance Contract ENABLE Project, a streamlined procurement process allowing aggregation of small projects across multiple federal facilities to install energy conservation measures and renewable energy systems more efficiently. The project included a combination of lighting upgrades, HVAC controls, one-for-one HVAC replacements, and small-scale photovoltaic systems at nine sites across the Los Padres and San Bernardino National Forests in Southern California. It will reduce energy use by 80 percent across the sites and save about 4,893

million BTU of energy and \$225,000 in energy costs annually.

Energy: Golden Gate National Recreation Area, San Francisco, Calif.

The Golden Gate National Recreation Area made substantial achievements to reduce its carbon footprint with the goal of becoming a carbon-neutral park. Their key accomplishment was purchasing 100 percent renewable energy for all park buildings. The achievement was made through a combination of the use of on-site renewables, participation in community choice programs, and the purchase of renewable energy certificates.

FGC efforts across the federal government further the goals of President Trump's May 17, 2018, Executive Order 13834 Regarding Efficient Federal Operations. The executive order directs agencies to prioritize reducing waste, cutting costs and enhancing the resiliency of federal infrastructure and operations, and to track reductions to ensure accountability.

The FGC is a voluntary, yearlong commitment under EPA's Sustainable Materials Management Program, in which participants focus on efficiently managing their resources to reduce the costs of building operations, maintenance, and supplies.

Latino Leadership brings new vision to Sonoma Valley

A remarkable collaboration is developing and supporting a new generation of leaders for nonprofits and other entities in the Valley. At the end of May, eleven young Latinos completed a seven-month training to develop leadership skills. La Luz sponsored the program and provided the location and course materials to implement a concept introduced several years earlier by board-member Sal Chavez.

“We are building the capacity of the whole community,” said Veronica Vences, program director of La Luz.

The course was designed and staffed through the efforts of Jeni Nichols, founder and former owner Sonoma Leadership. The facilitators were two experienced consultants, Holly Seaton and Darren Blonski, whose work was in large measure pro-bono. Seaton said her work with this group was “deeply rewarding and humbling.” The format begins with an overview of the five practices of exemplary leadership, and each of these is studied in depth in the successive monthly meetings.

Chavez’ dream for La Luz to empower young Latinos was fully realized with this year’s class. One purpose of the program is to provide the community with leaders who can meet the longstanding unfilled need for Latino presence on the boards of local nonprofits. The presence of youth on these boards is unquestionably an added bonus.

Chavez told The Sun that he had wanted to bring more thoughtfulness about what the Sonoma community needs from the next generation. He believes that “the burden should fall heavily on us, the first-generation college graduates.” He observed that he and his peers were able to be educated here “because of our parents’ pursuits, efforts and triumphs. They gave us our morals and values.”

Chavez serves as Trustee for the El Verano district on the Sonoma Valley Unified school board and has been a La Luz board member for four years. He views the commitment from young Latinos to become leaders as an acknowledgement and appreciation of their parents’ efforts. It is his hope to “change the narrative” of a majority of Latinos living here but few participating in the community.

What does this program offer young Latinos looking to take on a leadership role, both in the community and in their work? Chavez answers that it offers a perspective that he and his peers had lacked, and are hungry for. Most participants commented that it was an opportunity for personal growth and involvement in the Latino community.

Holly Seaton, a consulting psychologist who facilitated the program, explained that her goal was for each participant to see him or herself as a leader, and to be able to identify their voice and use it, whatever their job setting or volunteer efforts. Seaton added that at the outset most of the participants were not aware that they could add value to the

community. A comment from one of the participants affirms this: “There are skills we can learn and practice to become a leader, you don’t have to be ‘born a leader.’ It was eye-opening to identify leadership skills in myself and in my peers.”

A unique feature of the program is that most participants are paired with a mentor, an older community member with experience in an area of community leadership related to the mentee’s interest. The participants began their training by identifying their passions, and the professionals and community leaders involved aligned them with a mentor whose experience could guide the young leader to complete a self-designed project reflecting particular interests and skills. This mentoring element is one of the main reasons for the success of this year’s program.

Sandy Sanchez, who works as a program manager at La Luz, reflected, “I thought it would be a great learning opportunity both personally and professionally. I especially was drawn because it included a project within it, not just discussion.” Sanchez’ mentor was Kathy King, ED of Sonoma Overnight Support, and her project was to help with S.O.S.’s social media presence through Facebook and Constant Contact.

King, enthusiastic about her young mentee, reported that after Sanchez presented her project to the S.O.S. board in April, she was invited to become a member. Sanchez reflected, “I am excited to learn as much as I can from the fellow board members about

not only the organization but the responsibilities and roles of a board. As the youngest member and only Latina, I look forward to bringing a new perspective to the board.”

Lucy Rodriguez, promoted from front desk to patient financial advisor at Sonoma Valley Hospital, hopes to “inspire young Latinas just starting out to believe in themselves and not doubt their capabilities.” She was mentored by Celia Kruse De La Rosa, marketing and public information officer at SVH. She affirms that Rodriguez, who added this program to an already busy life juggling the roles of career and wife/mother, is indeed an inspiration.

Angie Sanchez, community engagement manager at La Luz, had a mentor from the county-wide Hispanic Chamber of Commerce. She was immediately thrust into that high-powered group of leaders. Tony Fernandez’ interest in preserving the planet led him to the Sonoma Ecology Center. Mentored by Alana Fichman and Caitlin Cornwall, he conducted a bilingual nature discovery hike, fulfilling his wish that “the Latino community have the freedom to explore the wonders of nature.” Ramie Hencmann, owner of Sweet Scoops, was brought onto the Chamber of Commerce board. Although she lost her mentor with the departure of CEO Patricia Shulz, she is proceeding with her vision of making a photo project about the immigrant experience, based on events in the life of her employee who is a DACA recipient.

How and Where to Get Startup Business Loans

3. Equity crowdfunding

Equity crowdfunding is specifically designed to aid startups or businesses that are in the early stages of their development. With equity crowd-

funding, you agree to give the investors shares in your company in exchange for funds.

You set the terms, and if the investors look through your portfolio and like what they see, you can reach an agreement. With this method, investors take on more risk, as they would not be able to recoup their money if your business isn't successful.

4. Business credit cards for startups

According to CreditCards.com, 80 percent of businesses that apply for credit cards receive an approval letter. That makes business credit cards an excellent and attainable resource for startups. Not only can cardholders request a cash advance if needed, but the card itself can be used to purchase office equipment, inventory and advertising expenses.

Business owners should look for cards with a low to 0 percent introductory APR, as well as cards with an attached rewards program, such as airline miles if the business requires you to travel or cash back if the extra money would be helpful.

5. Rollover business startup

as 24 hours and be able to use the money as you see fit, such as to secure an office building or purchase a delivery truck. The downside is that a personal loan makes it more difficult to keep business finances separate from personal finances and that personal loans are often limited to around \$40,000.

7. Grants

Grants are a preferred method of funding for startups because they don't have to be paid back. Of course, some grants come with stipulations that business owners must agree to follow.

The grant could be designed to provide technology to get your business organized, or it might specify that the funds are for stocking the shelves of your store. The SBA does not offer grants for business startups, but there are other organizations that do.

8. Home equity loan

Entrepreneurs who don't have a business history or a credit score in the excellent range might find it easier to obtain a home equity loan rather than a small business or personal loan. There is a risk of losing your home if your business doesn't earn enough to repay the home equity loan, but the benefits of going this route include lower interest rates and a quicker approval process.

9. Equipment financing

Perhaps you have the money to pay rent and utilities for an office space, but you could use a little help with buying the appropriate equipment to make your business run smoothly. If this is the case, equipment financing is the way to go.

Companies like Wells Fargo and Direct Capital offer this type of loan. Depending on the financial institution, you might be able to borrow up to \$250,000 for a period of up to six years and receive your money within 24 hours.

10. Friends and family

Don't leave family and friends out as a potential loan source. It is this group that is often the most supportive, and if they have the money, they might be willing to loan you funds with a generous interest rate and repayment plan.

The best part is you don't have to worry about credit scores or putting down collateral. You will need to put the terms in writing so that both parties are on the same page and so that the loan is legally binding if legal mediation is needed.
