Infrastructure For Rebuilding America (INFRA) Grants

The INFRA program provides dedicated, discretionary funding for projects that address critical issues facing our nation's highways and bridges. INFRA grants will support the Administration's commitment to fixing our nation's crumbling infrastructure by creating opportunities for all levels of government and the private sector to fund infrastructure, using innovative approaches to improve the necessary processes for building significant projects, and increasing accountability for the projects that are built.

The Department of Transportation (DOT) is announcing the Infrastructure for Rebuilding America (INFRA) discretionary grant program through a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) in the Federal Register on June 29. The

INFRA program will make approximately \$1.5 billion available to projects that are in line with the Administration's principles to help rebuild America's crumbling infrastructure - a priority for this Administration. In addition to providing direct federal funding, the INFRA program aims to increase the total investment by state, local, and private partners.

INFRA advances a pre-existing grant program established in the FAST Act of 2015 and utilizes updated criteria to evaluate projects to align them with national and regional economic vitality goals and to leverage additional nonfederal funding. The new program will increase

August 24, 2017 **State of the Construction Business in 2017 and Beyond**

The construction industry has seen some ups and downs over the past decade, but experts say it's once again on the rise. The influences of millennials becoming parents, a proposed infrastructure program, and some previous government programs taking effect have all led to an increase of demand, especially in residential and infrastructural building. However, increased prices and a decreased skilled labor force continue to challenge profits.

The construction industry saw over \$1.7 trillion in revenue in 2016, per statistics by the U.S. Census Bureau. There were 729,345 construction companies employing over 7.3 million people. Of those companies, 477,950 were specialty trade contractors, 211,956 were building construction companies, and 39,439 were involved in heavy or civil engineering construction.

Predicted Growth by Industry

Of course, growth varies by specific type of construction. Here's a breakdown:

Residential: Single-family homes should again see an increased demand. NAHB predicts 870,000 units, while Dodge says 795,000. Either way, it represents a double-digit growth. Meanwhile, multifamily projects, after fast growth in 2016, will decline once current projects are finished.

Commercial and retail: Dodge predicts a 6 percent increase, though other sources are more cautious, citing tightening of lending standards. Actual retail locations may see a decline with the rise of online spending, but that is counterbalanced by a subsequent need for warehouses and distribution centers as well as data centers that support online stores. Office space is also showing increased demand.

Institutional: Dodge predicts a 10 percent increase for institutional construction in general, which includes schools, sports arenas, casinos and transportation terminals. Hotels, however, will see a steady decline.

Subcontracting: Both sides of the coin

Anyone who has been in the green industry for any time at all can tell you that there is a plethora of specialties your business can go into, but if you're wanting to add extra services without having to learn a new skill set, this is where subcontractors come in.

By definition, a subcontractor is a business or a person who carries out work for a company as part of a larger project. They may be more expensive than regular employees at times, but their expertise is well-worth the price.

Often hired as experts in their field, subcontractors are generally more knowledgeable about their work than a jack-of-all-trades and can also be used to free up a landscaping company's staff.

"They help us when we have a lot of work during the peak season," said Enzo Parilli, owner of TurfCreek, based in Loganville, Georgia. "When we have too many jobs, we use the subcontractors to fulfill demand and help us still create revenue and meet our customers' needs."

When subcontractors are used, landscapers can avoid all the costs associated with hiring and training typical employees as well as the need to outfit them with uniforms or vehicles to get them to the jobsite. Another benefit of hiring a

subcontractor is it frees your company up from buying and maintaining specialized equipment.

"Anything good that a subcontractor does on a job on your behalf has positive ramifications for your reputation with your customer," said Ken Thompson, director of quality and efficiency for the landscape construction division of Ruppert Landscape. "In many cases, the owner or general contractor sees the subcontractor as you. So good (or bad) work or interactions with your sub can help to enhance your reputation with your customer as competent, skilled and responsive."

Working with a subcontractor

The tricky thing about starting a relationship with a subcontractor is first finding one, as a majority of landscaping companies hire one that they already know. If you're just getting started, this is more of a challenge as you know less of who is in the industry. You can reach out to associations like the American Subcontractors Association (ASA) or suppliers and ask who they would recommend.

Over time as you build up your network, you'll soon know former co-workers and people from other trades whose work you trust that you can reach out to for help on a job.

'New Roads to Second Chances' connects hundreds of formerly incarcerated Angelenos to employment opportunities



The City of Los Angeles' New Roads to Second Chances Transitional Work Program is on pace to meet its goal, already placing 264 formerly incarcerated Angelenos on a path to full-time employment.

Mayor Eric Garcetti's Office of Reentry was awarded a three-year, \$8.9 million contract with the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) to help stabilize more than 1,300 formerly incarcerated men and women by providing them with transitional employment, job training, and other resources that put them on pathways to careers. Chrysalis was selected to administer the program in July 2016.

"People shouldn't be defined by the past or their circumstances — we need to support them with a mind toward the future," said Mayor Garcetti. "I'm going to keep pushing to make sure that every Angeleno has the opportunity to get good-paying jobs and build lasting careers."

Program participants begin with a 90-day training session, where they participate in employment readiness workshops, life skills guidance, and interview preparation. During the training process, participants start their active job search and perform community beautification work, for which they are paid the prevailing minimum wage. In total, New Roads work crews have collected 123,367 bags of trash, significantly contributing to beautification efforts in the City and County.

"The New Roads Program has taken up the important work of investing in residents with some of the highest need: those returning home from incarceration," said Councilmember Marqueece Harris-Dawson. "With the combination of supportive services and permanent employment placement, New Roads is a great model for public investment done right." "Last fiscal year, Caltrans picked up enough litter to fill more than 8,300 garbage trucks, and picking up all that litter cost the taxpayers \$76 million - that's just what Caltrans spent," said Caltrans Director Malcolm Dougherty. "Caltrans is proud to partner with the city of Los Angeles to help parolees who paid their dues be productive and help us address this litter problem."

"New Roads to Second Chances has created an avenue toward employment for those who need a fair chance," said Mark Loranger, President & CEO of Chrysalis. "A job means dignity, respect, and the opportunity for family reconnection. The ripple effect of stable employment is significant. It has a positive impact on families, the community, and society in general through lower rates of unemployment, homelessness and recidivism."

Mayor Garcetti has put a special focus on creating new opportunities for underserved populations in Los Angeles, including Angelenos who have served time in jail or prison and need help getting a new start. In June 2017, Los Angeles won a \$6 million state Prop. 47 grant — the full amount requested by his Office of Reentry — to launch Project imPACT, to offer counseling and legal support to formerly incarcerated Angelenos.

Last year, Mayor Garcetti formed a Blue Ribbon Commission on Employment Equity — an alliance of private and public sector employers committed to providing opportunities for the formerly incarcerated and others who have been historically excluded from upwardly-mobile jobs. In addition, the Mayor has held Fair Chance Hiring Fairs and launched a pilot with 70millionjobs.comto facilitate employment for Angelenos with past criminal justice involvement. Access to Capital

The Ultimate Cheat Sheet for Your Business Loan Search

Looking to expand your business or bridge cash flow? Then you've probably been reading up on small business loans and you're probably realizing that the loan approval process can be more daunting than you thought?.

Worse, a lack of knowledge may mean that you'll either be rejected outright or sucked into a contract that's not in your best interest. While small business loan approvals from banks do seem to be on the rise, according to a 2016 study by Biz2Credit, only about 23% of small business bank loan requests were accepted in the month of March.

That's why it pays to be prepared. Business loans can be complicated, but they don't have to be. Here's everything you need to know about the small business loan application process.

What Type of Loan is Right For You?

Before we even get into the loan application, let's figure out which type of loan is right for you:

Business line of credit

A business line of credit is flexible "revolving" capital that works almost like a credit card, except you get access to cash, and in some cases,

lower APRs. What's convenient about a business line of credit is that you can get approved in as little as one day. On top of that, there are no strict credit requirements, and it's a great way to build your credit score (as long as you pay back your balance on time!). Even better, with a business line of credit, you only have to pay back the balance and interest on the funds you draw.

There are some cons to business lines of credit. You may need to provide updated documents each time you draw, and the lender might also ask for collateral. Also, if your credit score is low, you may have to deal with higher interest rates. This can make using a business line of credit riskier and/or more expensive.

Term loans

A business term loan is a lump sum that is paid back over a specific period of time with a preset or floating interest rate. One of the more competitive loan products, you'll need to be in business for at least two years, with a 620+ credit score, and at least 100K in annual revenue.

Term loans are traditionally a bank product, but there are many online lenders that offer longerterm loans at an affordable rate. Because term loans generally have lower monthly payments and longer payment terms than short-term loans, you have the flexibility and breathing room to grow your business sustainably.

Short-term loans

Short-term loans operate somewhat like a traditional term loan, but need to be paid back within a shorter timeframe and usually with daily or weekly payments. As a result, loan amounts tend to be smaller and interest rates are higher.

The advantage is that you can get approved quickly (sometimes in just one day) and can set up your own payment structure. For those with bad credit, a short-term loan is a funding option worth considering, as even those with low scores may be approved.

The downside to short-term loans is that they can be very expensive. Because of the higher cost, payments could be hard to meet if cash flow is slow during a week, month, or quarter. So, you definitely want to analyze your actual ability to service the loan first.

SBA 7 (a) Loans

SBA 7 (a) loans are long-term, low-interest rate small business loans partially guaranteed by the government--meaning the government will cover a portion of the loan if the borrower defaults. SBA loans are coveted by small business owners who might not qualify for traditional bank loans because of the low cost and excellent repayment terms.

While SBA loans typically have the lowest down payments, longest payment terms, and reasonable interest rates, the process takes lengthy paperwork which leads to longer approval time. SBA loans may also require collateral.

Merchant cash advances

Merchant cash advances provide you with a lump sum of capital that you repay with a portion of your daily credit card sales.

The advantages of merchant cash advances are that the approval process is easy, you enjoy quick access to funding, and bad credit is often okay. Getting cash fast and easily can be the jumpstart your business needs to start booming.

Be warned, while a merchant cash advance may give you access to fast cash, the daily payments can be a strain on your cash flow and they are absolutely the most expensive loan product on the market. You might want to consider another short-term loan before applying for a merchant cash advance.

State of the Construction Business in 2017 and Beyond

Continued from page 1

There's some disagreement about the future of new school construction. Some say an increasingly urban population has decreased the need for new school buildings, and as colleges get more expensive, they will have fewer students and less need to expand. Others point to millennials having families and moving to the suburbs, which need new schools to accommodate their kids. A potential rise in endorsements and business-college partnerships may mean more revenue for buildings devoted to research. Hospital construction will most likely decline, at least until the nation is more sure about the direction health care will take.

Infrastructure and civil construction: Experts expect this area to grow. Public-private partnerships have spurred the growth of office buildings. Public works may increase as much as 6 percent thanks to the Federal Transportation Bill and the Water Resources Development Acts that went into effect. Utilities and gas plant construction will most likely fall by 26 percent or more as current projects complete.

If Trump's \$1 trillion infrastructure plan goes into effect, infrastructure construction will continue to rise, but that probably won't happen until 2018. President Trump has begun planning discussions, but has also said health care and tax reforms take priority.

Sustainable energies: President Trump has vowed to cut government subsidies to this area, but the industry is moving toward promoting green construction for cost savings. If it succeeds, it may become a more integral part of other construction.

Increased Price for Materials and Employment Challenge the Industry

The biggest challenges of 2017 will be an increase in input prices and finding skilled labor.

Input prices are affected by the global economy and increased demand.

The ABC has seen a small but continuous growth in prices across the board. Much of it has had to do with the increase in crude oil prices, but there's also been an increase in the prices of materials from cement to steel. (To keep up on month-to-month statistics on this, check out the ABC website.)

Lumber may increase in price as well this year. The 2006 Softwood Lumber Agreement between the U.S. and Canada expired in October 2015, and the one-year standstill period ended last year. As a result, price increases due to tar-

the impact of projects by leveraging capital and allowing innovation in the project delivery and permitting processes, including public-private partnerships.

Additionally, the new program promotes innovative safety solutions that will improve our transportation system. INFRA will also target performance and accountability in project delivery and operations.

"The President and the Department are committed to revitalizing, repairing and rebuilding America's aging infrastructure," said Secretary Elaine L. Chao. "By ensuring the right incentives, projects selected under this program will be better able to make significant, long-term improvements to America's transportation infrastructure."

The Department will make awards under the IN-FRA program to both large and small projects. For a large project, the INFRA grant must be at least \$25 million. For a small project, the grant must be at least \$5 million. For each fiscal year of INFRA funds, 10% of available funds are reserved for small projects.

The INFRA grant program preserves the statutory requirement in the FAST Act to award at least 25% of funding for rural projects. The Administration understands that rural needs may well exceed this limit, and the Department will consider rural projects to the greatest extent possible. For rural communities in need of funding for highway and multimodal freight projects with national or regional economic significance, INFRA is an opportunity to apply directly for financial assistance from the federal government. For these communities, DOT will consider an applicant's resource constraints when assessing the leverage criterion.

INFRA grants may be used to fund a variety of components of an infrastructure project, however, the Department is specifically focused on projects in which the local sponsor is significantly invested and is positioned to proceed rapidly to construction. Eligible INFRA project costs may include: reconstruction, rehabilitation, acquisition of property (including land related to the project and improvements to the land), environmental mitigation, construction contingencies, equipment acquisition, and operational improvements directly related to system performance.

Applicants may resubmit their previous FAST-LANE application, but must explain how the project competitively addresses the improved INFRA Grant criteria. This NOFO will remain open until 8:00PM EST, November 2, 2017.

Subcontracting: Both sides of the coin

"By treating our subcontractors like they are part of our team (and not their own separate company), we often get referrals of other quality-oriented subcontractors through sphere of influence," Thompson said. "Subs often refer each other to our organization."

While a time crunch may tempt you to hire just about any subcontractor, it's important to remember that your reputation is directly affected by their work. Before hiring any subcontractor, check their references and their work. Thompson advises not to just look at the most recent job as they need to prove they have a track record of success.

Other ways to make sure you are hiring a reputable sub is to visit their work in person, check their accreditation and test their skills. If you're still trying to feel out their abilities, hire them for smaller projects first before trusting them on bigger jobs.

Once you are satisfied with their credentials, it is crucial to have a signed contract that specifies the scope of work, payment rate and deadlines. Including quality standards can also circumvent any corner cutting in materials and workmanship.

"It's also important to include a provision allowing your company or the subcontractor to terminate the contact upon giving a certain amount of notice," Thompson said. "Also, check to see if the subcontractor carries an appropriate license for his/her field as well as liability insurance, workers comp insurance, auto insurance and if they are bondable."

After the agreement has been signed, make sure you have quality control measures in place to ensure the work is done accurately and in a timely manner. For Parilli, he hires someone to supervise the sub on site and make sure that they are doing everything that is outlined in the work order.

Without having communicated your standards beforehand, some subcontractors will opt to use cheaper materials or produce substandard work by rushing. One way to avoid the issue with lowquality materials is to buy the materials they will need, saving them in expenses and giving you control over the matter.

The greatest challenge of working with subcontractors is probably scheduling, as they have their own business, and trying to match up their availability with the needs of the client.

"It's worth it," Parilli said. "When you have a lot of business, a customer may like to get things done sooner, but you have to work with the sub-contractor's availability."

While scheduling can be a challenge, there are ways to keep it from derailing your timetable.

As you work more regularly with a sub, they are more likely to work to meet your deadlines, and paying them promptly can also incentivize them. Smaller subcontractors depend on the cash flow more and will jump at the chance to be paid promptly by a company that respects their work.

After finding subcontractors from each trade you need who you work well with, make a point to keep this relationship strong.

"While it's a balancing act between trying to get the best value for the work being done, it's usually worth paying a little bit more to build a long-term relationship with a subcontractor who aligns will with your company values," Thompson said. "Hiring an untested contractor who doesn't live up to your customer's expectations could end up costing you far more in the long run."

State of the Construction Business in 2017 and Beyond

iffs may be seen as early as April.

Finally, the \$1 trillion infrastructure plan that will bring an increase in contracts also brings an increase in demand for supplies, which can drive up the price.

A shortage of skilled labor puts pressure on the industry.

A 2016 Associated General Contractors (AGC) survey showed that two-thirds of its members had trouble filling at least one craft position, and half were hard-pressed to find supervisors or project managers. Construction employment is rising at double the growth rate of the overall economy, yet positions are taking longer to fill. This can result in project delays.

It also means higher wages to attract skilled workers. The average construction worker earns \$28 an hour. The increase in the price of health care and the increased need to train workers has also added to construction costs.

2017 and Beyond: The Future of the Construction Industry

As prices increase and skilled labor becomes more scarce, construction companies will turn to cost-saving measures. Contractors are turning to more cooperative measures, like public-private construction. Design-build companies and integrated project delivery models reduce prices by removing third parties from the process. Some companies are turning to modular materials as a cost-saving measure as well.

To tackle the skilled-labor issue, some companies are working closely with high school and community colleges to develop a more skilled worker base. Internships and other programs not only benefit the student, but give the company a chance to train potential employees at reduced expense.

It's still in the future for most companies because of expense, but there's a growing interest in using internet technologies such as wearables, virtual reality and drones. Already, some companies equip employees with wearable devices to monitor their activities, use drones to survey sites, and have augmented reality goggles for conducting inspections. Virtual reality is being explored for training as well as site inspections.

Increases in input prices and a shortage of skilled labor present big challenges for construction companies, and some owners have expressed concern about its growth in the coming year. However, analysis by expert associations indicates that the industry should improve as a whole in 2017. A renewed need for homes and entertainment as well as infrastructure will open opportunities. Meanwhile, cooperative programs and technologies are being explored for cutting costs and bringing up a new generation of construction workers.
