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# **Big, Efficient Convention Centers Are in High Demand**

Municipal leaders throughout the country are focusing lots of attention on convention centers. That's because convention-related business contributes millions to city coffers. Two years ago, communities in the United States with convention centers shared in \$845 billion in revenue generated by the meetings industry along with \$104 billion in tax receipts. New data shows a continual and significant upward trend since that time.

As municipal leaders focus on what it takes to bring major revenue-producing events to their communities, the first requirement is almost always a large, conveniently located convention center. The second requirement is often a new hotel.

Convention centers that were adequate in the past may no longer be attractive, efficient or adequate. As a result, city leaders are aggressively making plans to expand facilities to attract larger conventions. Others are planning renovations and upgrades or total replacements.

Since 1969, the convention center needs of the city of Wichita, Kansas, were served by its Century II Performing Arts and Convention Center. However, a decline in the number of conventions in the city is attributed to the size and age of Century II. A city-sponsored study estimated that a new convention center could result in millions of dollars in additional revenue for city coffers.

Officials in Eau Claire, Wisconsin, are also exploring the possibility of building a new convention center after a recent feasibility study estimated that a center could have an economic impact of nearly \$200 million over 10 years. Like most other cities facing budget constraints, Eau Claire is considering various funding options to build and sustain a convention center.

In Sugar Land, Texas, city leaders are narrowing their search for a private-sector partner to collaborate on a convention center/hotel project. The city will select a private developer to build and operate a 50,000-square-foot convention center and a 350-room hotel. Sugar Land wants both to be located in the city's arts and entertainment district.

Many new convention center projects are linked to construction of an accompanying hotel. Although not set to open until 2020, the Luminary Hotel in Fort Myers, Florida, is already booked for its first convention. The hotel is part of a public-private partnership with the city in which the developer will lease the property for 99 years, paying rent to the city based on hotel revenues.

Larimer County, Colorado, will seek privatesector partners to construct new facilities at the county's events complex. The county would like to have a 200-room privately built hotel and a trade show building. County officials are willing to fund the county-built exhibition hall.

The city of Richmond, Texas, has asked for legislative authority to use sales, hotel and mixed-drink tax revenue to fund a new convention center and hotel. Three-dozen other Texas cities have already been approved to use these revenues as community development tools. No details are yet available but the legislation would require that the city sign an agreement with a developer for construction of the hotel

#### Big, Efficient Convention Centers Are in High Demand

and convention center by Sept. 21, 2021.

A \$50-\$60 million downtown convention center is planned for Greenville, South Carolina. Plans are for the city and Greenville County each to contribute \$26 million to the project and then seek private-sector investors. City and county officials have also requested \$5 million from the state legislature.

Officials in Grand Rapids, Michigan, are considering a \$140 million, 26-story, 400-room convention-style hotel that will likely be publicly owned and privately operated. Three hotels are already connected to the city's convention center and adding a fourth that includes 40,000 square feet of meeting space will allow the city to attract larger conventions.

The Indiana General Assembly is considering legislation to provide funding from special taxing districts for a \$120 million expansion of the Indiana Convention Center at Pan Am Plaza. The project would include a 50,000-square-foot ballroom, a 38-story tower, and 1,400 more rooms. If approved, the project would provide a 300,000-square-foot expansion with a covered walkway that connects to the convention center.

City leaders in Austin, Texas, are currently considering options related to the city's convention center. A team of professors from The University of Texas was hired to provide a feasibility study on the economic impact of an expanded convention center. The report also provided various options for consideration.

This type of activity is common throughout the country. A trend is definitely moving through the nation. Companies of all types and sizes will benefit from the demand for services that are being created.

# The 5 U.S. and 3 Canadian Cities With Best Jobs Markets

With respect to their economies, cities are often judged according to their performances in jobs creation, faster being better than slower, and whether they have low or high unemployment rates. The Tables in this article set out those metrics for the largest (by population) 51 metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) in the U.S. and 33 census metropolitan areas (CMAs) in Canada.

Table 1 ranks U.S. MSAs by year-over-year jobs growth on the left-hand side and unemployment rates on the right-hand side. Table 2 copies the layout of Table 1, except that it is for Canada's CMAs.

As a concept, MSAs and CMAs are essentially the same. They're urban areas with sizable downtown cores, plus suburbs with close work-to-residence commuting ties. But there are some differences between the U.S. and Canadian data that should be spelled out.

First, the U.S. numbers in Table 1 are not seasonally adjusted (NSA); the Canadian figures are seasonally adjusted (SA). The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) chooses to emphasize its NSA calculations for city labor markets, whereas Statistics Canada has long provided SA numbers.

Second, U.S. city labor market statistics are a month behind what is available for Canada. Table 1 showcases February 2019 numbers; Table 2 is for March 2019.

It's not that Canadian statistics are always ahead of the U.S. Far from it. For some other data series, – e.g., retail trade data from the Census Bureau, – the U.S. is a month ahead of Canada.

Third, Canadian unemployment rate numbers are always biased higher than their U.S. counterparts. The definition of unemployment north of the border is more relaxed.

Statistics Canada publishes an NSA unemployment rate, with the technical name R-3, that adopts the same stricter methodology as is employed by the BLS and it's usually about one percentage point lower than the 'official' Canadian rate.

#### **Best U.S. City Labor Markets:**

There are currently five major cities in the U.S. that are among the best dozen in terms of having low unemployment rates and rapid year-over-year jobs growth: Nashville, Orlando, San Francisco, San Jose, and Austin. In Table 1, they are the cities shaded in green.

In February, there were several other cities that just missed out from being in the elite group: Salt Lake City (ranked 15th for jobs growth and 5th for low unemployment rate); Dallas-Ft. Worth (4th and 19th); Miami (14th and 10th); San Antonio (12th and 13th); and Denver (17th and 10th).

Some other cities rank highly according to the one criterion, but then falter in the other. For example, Boston has an exceptionally low unemployment rate and ranks 2nd overall among all 51 centers. But its weak performance in employment growth, only +0.4% year over year, has placed it way down the table on that score, with a 46th place ranking.

#### **Best Canadian City Labor Markets:**

Among Canada's biggest urban areas in the latest month (March 2019), three cities stood out

for being among the Top Dozen for both speedy jobs growth and minimal jobless rates: Guelph, Kitchener-Cambridge-Waterloo, and Brantford. All three cities form a high-tech and auto parts manufacturing hub located a short distance to the west of Toronto. (BlackBerry/RIM is headquartered in Waterloo.)

Three Canadian cities comprising a next tier below those at the summit in March were: Hamilton (19th for jobs growth, but 3rd for unemployment rate); Saint John, N.B. (1st and 21st); and Oshawa (9th and 14th). The big percentage jump in employment in Saint John has been on top of a low base, as reflected in the city's still mediocre jobless rate (5.6%). Oshawa's strength is in defiance of General Motor's announced closure of auto assembly operations in the city.
