## Mayor Garcetti proposes fiscally responsible 2019 budget that boosts investment in homelessness, infrastructure improvements

"Homelessness is the moral and humanitarian crisis of our time, and we will confront it with historic investments in getting unsheltered Angelenos off the street," said Mayor Garcetti. "My budget also doubles down on the kinds of improvements — like better streets and sidewalks — that Angelenos can see and feel in their neighborhoods, and strengthens our commitment to protecting the city against another economic downturn."

Mayor Garcetti's proposed budget substantially increases spending to fix L.A.'s streets and

Those numbers represent increases of \$13 million, \$10 million, \$43.4 million, and \$16.4 million over last year, respectively.

This year's budget increases the Reserve Fund to \$343 million, or 5.56% of the overall budget; and includes a Budget Stabilization Fund that surpasses \$100 million for the first time ever, at a total of \$104.4 million

# The labor shortage: How military veterans can help fill the gap



Veteran U.S. Army staff sergeant Carlos Alvarez is a senior environmental health and safety (EHS) manager Skanska USA's Houston office. Alvarez said: "My military training has made me more effective because I learned discipline, especially being in combat, it taught me how to endure hardships, and it taught me to deal with a lot of different types of people. You learn that the definition of discipline is doing what you know that has to be always done." Credit: Skanska USA

Approximately 250,000 people leave military service each year and begin the often bumpy process of re-entering civilian life, a large part of which is finding a suitable career. As construction continues to grapple with a chronic workforce shortage, the numbers of new veterans alone represent enormous potential for the construction industry.

Transitioning military members and veterans are a natural fit for construction, which demands problem-solving, loyalty and onsite decision making — all of which are skills the military instills in its servicemembers. Veteran-specific organizations and construction companies alike recognize the opportunity for this demographic in the industry.

Military members undergo training like few other people do. Following rules and procedures, working as a team and placing absolute trust in colleagues can mean the difference between life and death. Tony DeStefano, vice president of human resources at Skanska USA and former captain in the U.S. Army, said military personnel learn to function in very diverse teams, and have ingrained skillsets that can seamlessly transfer to the construction industry and jobsites.

"Particularly, they have a high focus on teamwork and safety, which is critical for success and longevity," he said. "They also have a heightened sense of duty, understanding that the whole is only as strong as its individual parts, and are organized, self-disciplined and are great problem solvers"

### Military to civilian transition

After Navy diver Dave Guerra left the military in 1996, he entered the world of commercial diving before beginning and serving as president his company, Puente Technology LLC, which focuses on construction but also has an IT division. "When I was diving, I did underwater construction, rigging, bridgework, inspections, welding and mechanical," he said. "Construction was a natural process to go into."

The transition wasn't seamless, though. Despite being a veteran-owned, service-disabled company, Guerra still faced typical business challenges, such as securing loans, bonding and insurance. "There's no automatic 'just because you're a veteran-owned company," he said. "It's just a license to drive. You have to build those relationships and still deliver in the best way you can because you're opening doors for other veteran companies trying to get in the market. You're an ambassador for people behind you."

His 8(a)-designated business, a small business assistance program for businesses owned at least 51% by socially or economically disadvantaged individuals, helps it get sole source on \$4 to \$6 million projects and get federal work. "It helps grow and establish the business to continue in the commercial market or as a federal contractor," Guerra said.

Guerra, who also serves on the board of directors for the National Veteran-owned Business Association, hopes to expand his 10-person company, but emphasizes the importance of growing smartly as opportunities come along.

"We'd like to hire more veterans. They know how to lead, follow, show up and take pride in what they do," he said. "It's a commitment I have as a company owner to help veterans transition. It's a brotherhood and sisterhood that unless you've experienced it, you don't understand it, but when you're out, you miss it like no other.

"Veterans have done a lot of tasks and have a wealth of experience; we have to be a jack of all trades," he continued. "If you put them in something they're not as comfortable in, they'll work at it. If you help them flourish, they'll be one of the best employees you've ever had. When you add someone like that to your arsenal and figure out what they get excited about, watch them run. They'll be outstanding."

Ron Olsen, president of construction management firm Vanguard Construction Co. Inc., spent

five of his seven and a half years in the Air Force working as a carpenter. He's owned his business since 2013 and is evaluating how best to grow it. He would like to get into the federal job market as a small construction company within the constraints of his bond limit and with healthy competition from other service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses.

"When I'm able to grow and hire more people, veterans would be an excellent choice," he said. "From what I experienced in my years as active duty and another 15 years working solely on government contracts, they are more motivated, better educated, have more hands-on experience and are extremely disciplined. You couldn't ask for a better workforce."

### Training for a career

When Vietnam War veteran Bob Luckett came home from the service, he entered the construction industry, where he spent the next 50 years. Three years ago, he sold his company with the intent to retire, but realized he wasn't quite ready for full retirement. While doing consulting work, he got the idea to recruit and train veterans in construction. He founded 501(c)(3) Veteran's Next Mission about a year and a half ago, and is CEO of the eight-person board.

The organization pays veterans while they undergo the three-component training: classroom education; deconstruction, which shows veterans how buildings come apart and allows them to practice with myriad tools; and actual field work for individuals

"We're exposing them to all trades,"Luckett said. "We just finished an addition where trainees, under my supervision, did footings, foundation walls, framing, insulation, ductwork, drywall, painting, interior, roofing and siding. It gives them exposure to just about everything."

Fifteen individuals are participating in the fouryear program. Most participants have been out of the military for a few years, although they do have some Reservists.

"A machine gunner in the Marine Corps doesn't translate well into civilian life,"Luckett said. "They can find a job, but they can't find a career. They're looking for something to build into a career. This program fills a need in the construction industry, where there is a huge labor shortage and it gives vets a career that'll support them the rest of their lives."

Luckett touts the good fit veterans are for construction. "They're used to following directions, working as a team and working in less than ideal climate conditions. They're loyal," he said, adding: "One thing they like about this training is the camaraderie and being with people with a like background."

Word of mouth, as well as advertising and postings on job search sites like Indeed.com, help populate the program. "A lot of people are looking for construction training," Luckett said. "Companies need to be willing to put in the time to train these people. They'll reap the reward because of the loyalty they'll get. But they have to put in the time;

## Mayor Garcetti's proposed budget also includes:

- Increasing 3-1-1 staff, and reducing wait times.
- Funding for Census 2020 outreach and support.
- Improving opportunity and expediting hiring in the City of Los Angeles, by developing online civil service testing that is available anytime, anywhere.
- Expanding Domestic Violence Shelter Operations to increase shelter availability, adding 60-70 new beds which can serve an additional 400 clients each year.
- Investing \$1 million in Girls Play Los Angeles to increase girls' participation in Recreation and Parks sports programming with a goal of reaching gender parity, and double the number of young people who learn to swim.
- Reducing the Neighborhood Community Plan refresh rate from 10 to 6 years.
- Committing to over \$10.5 million in improvements to the L.A. Convention Center.
- Increasing funding to provide outreach and education regarding the Rent Stabilization Ordinance, along with a \$1 million pilot for Accessory Dwelling Units construction streamlining.
- Increasing investment in solar technology on municipal facilities and expanding the City's network of electric vehicles and chargers.
- Leveraging local and federal dollars for SAF-ER, which increases fire suppression and emergency services such as our Fast Response Vehicle Program.

## How military veterans can help fill the gap

they can't expect someone to come in and know enough in the first few weeks.'

Veteran's Next Mission is embarking on a warehouse campaign, hoping to acquire a 6,000-squarefoot warehouse to use for its deconstruction program component, which gets a lot of donated recycled material. The organization intends to sell some of it and have part of the warehouse designated as a shop, where staff will train disabled veterans to build furniture out of reclaimed materials.

"I've had several disabled veterans talk to me about work and being in the program," Luckett said, "but they can't get around a jobsite. They can, however, get around a concrete floor. They can't lift the kind of load that needs to be lifted on a jobsite, but in a warehouse setting we can rig a lift system.'

Home Depot recently announced its charitable arm's, The Home Depot Foundation (HDF), will donate \$50 million in the next decade to prepare 20,000 workers for careers in construction. That money will go to the nonprofit Home Builders Institute which, in turn, will train military veterans and active U.S. Army soldiers who are preparing to transition out of the service, along with high school students and disadvantaged youth in the Atlanta area. HDF has worked with the Fort Stewart and Fort Bragg Army bases and had a job placement rate of 90%.

## Company recruiting efforts

Skanska USA is one construction company targeting veterans through a national talent acquisition and recruitment program. The company sponsors and attends veteran career fairs throughout the country, as well as running a specific military recruitment campaign — "Pride in Country. Pride in Skanska" — that features military veterans with the company on the job.

Veterans often have a difficult transition from active duty to civilian life. Ever cognizant of that, Skanska USA provides On-the-Job Training (OJT) programs that address construction skills from a field office clerk to an electrician. Internal training programs for all new hires include entry-level rotational programs, an online learning center and mentoring programs.

DeStefano said that the company is always looking to connect with veterans, but that it hopes to connect with service people before their transition to close the gap and lessen the burden. Skanska USA has partnered with RecruitMilitary and finds great value in career fairs, including NC4ME, regionspecific veterans job fairs and Salute to America's Veterans.
