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Rep. Janice Hahn holds press event to announce grants to help people land jobs at Metro

Rep. Janice Hahn (D-San Pedro) held a press event this morning to announce \$443,000 in new grants from the Federal Transit Administration to Community Career Development, Inc., the nonprofit operatore of the Compton and Wilshire Metro WorkSource Centers.

The Centers provide job training to low-income minorities who are seeking employment as Metro bus operators. The goal of the new funding is to help hire at least 200 new operators, according to the FTA. Here is the FTA's news release on the grants.

About Janice

Janice Hahn is the U.S. Representative of the 44th district of California. She was elected to Congress in a special election held in July of 2011, and reelected in November 2012. She sits on the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee as well as the Committee on Small Business. She serves as Ranking Member on the Small Business Subcommittee on Health and Technology.

Her desire to serve was instilled by her father, Los Angeles County Supervisor, Kenny Hahn. In 1962, during the Civil Rights movement, when Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. visited Los Angeles, not a single local, state or federal public official was willing to go to the airport to meet Dr. Kingexcept one: Kenny Hahn.

Ignoring all the warnings of 'political cost,' Kenny Hahn went to the airport to welcome Dr. King to the City of Angels. That day, Janice learned a lesson she would never forget: that she must never let anything stop her from standing up for justice.

Janice always knew she wanted to serve her community, but public office wasn't always her path. She was a teacher, a businesswoman, and a single mother of three children.

C-33 License (Painting & Decorating)

A Contractor License Fee of 1% of the Job Order Sum for every Job Order shall be paid directly by the Contractor to The Gordian Group as set forth in 6.3.10 of the Supplementary Instructions to Bidders.

Every effort will be made to ensure that all persons have equal access to contracts and other business opportunities with the University within the limits imposed by law or University policy. Each Bidder may be required to show evidence of its equal employment opportunity policy. The successful Bidder and its subcontractors will be required to follow the non-discrimination requirements set forth in the Bidding Documents and to pay prevailing wage at the location of the work.
