

JPMorgan Makes \$4.2 Million Investment in Veteran-Owned Small Businesses

Out of the 1 million military service members who will transition out of the armed forces during the next five years, one quarter will start a business. Only 4.5% of that quarter will succeed. These are just some of the findings in the new “Chase Business Leaders Outlook” study.

To support veteran-owned small businesses, JPMorgan Chase & Co announced a \$4.2 million commitment as part of an overall \$75 million effort –JP Morgan’s “Small Business Forward” program—to help women and minority-owned businesses succeed.

The funds will be used to provide business loans to veterans as well as tools and resources related to entrepreneurship. Veterans will have access to this capital through a number of financial institutions including Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFIs), Main Street Launch (California), Carolina Small Business Development Fund (North Carolina, South Carolina, and Florida), and PeopleFund (Texas).

“Veterans make excellent business owners, so it makes perfect sense for us to help connect them with the access to capital they need to succeed,” said Andrew Kresse, CEO of Business Banking at Chase via a press release. “We’re pleased to work with outstanding partners who serve the veteran business community, and in turn, help strengthen the communities in which we all live and work.”

“Those who have served bring invaluable skills like fortitude, leadership, and integrity to everything they do in the civilian sector,” JPMorgan Chase’s Head of Military and Veterans Affairs Ross A. Brown said in a released statement. “Supporting our veterans isn’t just the right thing to do; it also makes good business sense.”

How Two Mayors Think Locally and Act Globally

Mayors have always juggled a lot. The day-to-day needs of city management are profuse: potholes, trash collection, tiffs between council members.

But as President Trump unwinds policies that help U.S. cities thrive—withdrawing from the Paris Agreement, threatening the status of millions of immigrants, and now offering a tax plan that would further slash local budgets—the re-

sponsibility of U.S. mayors seems to grow. Now there's an extra-heavy ball to keep in the air: an obligation to fight for policies that protect 80 percent of the national population—and therefore, to keep the country from going off the edge.

How do they do it? I posed the questions to two mayors who attended CityLab Paris in October: GT Bynum of Tulsa, Oklahoma, and Eric Garcetti of Los Angeles, California.

The national government is “having philosophical debates instead of fixing real problems,” said Bynum. He comes from a line of Tulsa mayors, and said he got into the family business because of the concrete impact good local governance can have. Bynum's sense of responsibility is indeed growing in the current political climate. But he said that when cities exchange resources and ideas through urban networking organizations (such as 100 Resilient Cities, of which Tulsa is a member)

and make collective purchasing agreements (like a massive multi-city request for thousands of electric vehicles), it's possible to make real impact outside limits.

Garcetti agreed—although he believes cities have always been powerful. “They're the original political entity, from ancient Greek times,” he said. “They're organic. They're where people congregated.” But in a globalized society, the problems and solutions cities face are more obviously connected. Addressing L.A.'s horrendous traffic with a major overhaul of its transit system can help Angelenos and also help the U.S. inch closer to its carbon reduction goals.

“I'm troubled by what we're seeing nationally,” Garcetti said. “But I think mayors can tell the story of an America that gets things done.”

Cool Earth Solar (Cool Earth) is an innovative start-up company whose fundamental technology uses an inflatable plastic film to concentrate sunlight onto a photovoltaic (PV) solar cell. With these concentrators, Cool Earth PV cells generate over 1,000 times the electricity of non-concentrated PV cells.

In addition, Cool Earth is developing a complementary technology – a solar meteorological station (met station) that provides highly accurate measurements of solar radiation at a low price point and with minimal maintenance. A network

of these inexpensive met stations produces the data required to develop the highly accurate solar generation forecasts needed by utilities, solar operators, and government agencies such as NOAA.

CHALLENGES

With both the concentrator and met station technologies proven in early field prototypes, Cool Earth faced the challenge of deploying systems at a scaled demonstration site, and ultimately entering the marketplace. In order to improve the quality of their grant applications, Cool Earth reached out to SBDC experts for advice and mentoring in this process.

In addition, Cool Earth sought assistance in improving their go-to-market strategies and tactics, specifically in how to engage with potential partners and first customers.

ACTIONS

Cool Earth Solar was fortunate to have met two SBDC Business Advisors at an iHub seminar on Small Business Innovation Research Grants from the federal government.

After numerous consultations with both SBDC and TFG consultants, Cool Earth significantly improved the quality of their grant application both for SBIR and other granting organizations.

In addition, the SBDC significantly enhanced Cool Earth's go-to-market efforts for the met station and forecasting business.

9 Tech Trends That Will Define 2018

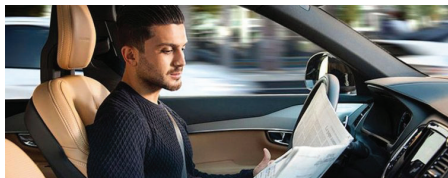


1. Artificial intelligence will inspire how products are designed.

Companies like Airbnb and Netflix already infuse AI into their products in a host of ways, generally to the customer's benefit.

Senior strategist Viral Shah and technology director Matteo Penzo believe 2018 will see far more companies centering their product design around the best use of AI.

"As AI becomes embedded into our products and services," they wrote, "designers are tasked not just with creating machines for humans, but creating machines that are human-like."



2. Other companies will join Google in the "Algorithm Hall of Fame."

Google's PageRank feature -- the search engine's ability to display the optimal results consistently at the top -- may be the company's greatest achievement using algorithms.

Frog's principal solutions architect, Gonzalo Garcia-Perate, expects other companies to make similar leaps in 2018. They will join Google in the "Algorithm Hall of Fame," he wrote.

He said likely candidates include the first company to achieve full vehicle autonomy or create platforms to make universal basic income a possibility.



3. Virtual and augmented reality will become communal experiences.

Right now, virtual reality is a pretty isolating experience. You put on a headset and immerse yourself in a world that only you inhabit.

Going forward, says frog visual designer Seth Mach, VR (and its cousin, augmented reality, or AR) will allow people to explore untold worlds together. They'll get to play, work and explore communally -- in alternate realities.

"Soon, instead of being lone travelers on our augmented and virtual journeys, we'll have friends along for the ride," he wrote.



4. Democracy will cozy up to the blockchain.

Frog strategists Kristina Phillips and Sally Darby believe the rise of blockchain technology won't be limited to cryptocurrencies in 2018. They see it moving into much larger arenas of society, including government.

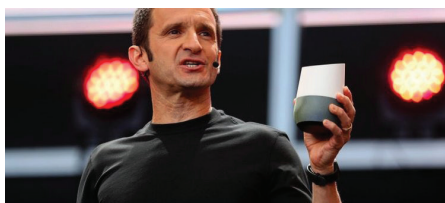
"Because it changes how votes are collected and minimizes the risk of fraud or manipulation, blockchain technology may be what helps more voices get heard in government matters and policy decisions," they wrote. "By the 2018 midterm elections, we may just see an end to paper ballots altogether."



5. Augmented reality will invite questions about intellectual property.

Physical works of art are the property of their creators, but with augmented reality enabling consumers to add infinite changes, frog strategist Kristina Phillips wonders how this will change the nature of intellectual property in 2018.

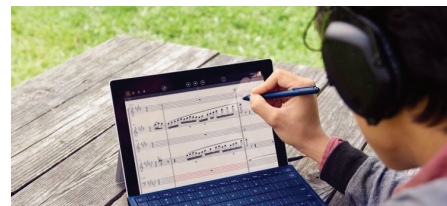
"Enter a new age in contemporary art, one where people can express themselves collaboratively in the digital and physical realm," she wrote. "Think mixed-media taken to a whole new dimension, one where people not only have access to public art, but the expectation they can add their own signature without leaving a mark."



6. Consumer tech will feel even friendlier.

Today's digital assistants and smartphones aren't boxy with sharp edges. They're rounded, soft and inviting, notes frog strategist Sam Hadaway. That trend will only continue into 2018, as tech starts to play a more integrated role in our daily lives.

"Hardware will start to become more expressive," he wrote, noting that "consumers will demand options that fit their style seamlessly and aid in self-expression."



7. Tech will become inclusive for all.

Frog knowledge manager Justine Lee suspects 2018 will see a lot more innovation, allowing tech to become accessible to all.

She pointed to Microsoft CEO Satya Nadella as a sign of good things to come: In October, Nadella emphasized his company would prioritize accessibility, having seen the difficulties firsthand in his son, who suffers from cerebral palsy.

"With a clear focus on empathetic, human-centered design," Lee wrote, "more businesses will be able to share their best offerings with more customers from even more walks of life."

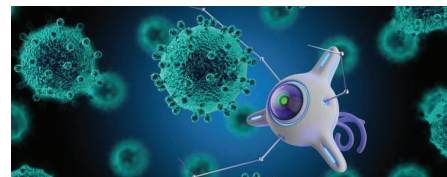


8. Anonymous data will make life smarter but still private.

Frog CEO Harry West believes the emergent trend in 2018 will be low-fidelity audio and visual sensors that can provide vital information about people's behavior without revealing any identifying information.

"We all know big data is big business," he wrote. "It's why our smartphones measure nearly every aspect of our existence, from how far we walk to how long we sleep." The problem is, the data is too intrusive.

"Lo-fi sensors square our need for convenience with our desire for anonymity -- better customer experiences without violating our privacy," he wrote.



9. Ultra-tiny robots will replace medicine for certain patients.

Imagine you have a buildup of plaque in your arteries. Normally, you might take some vitamins to clear the blockage. In 2018, a doctor might slip a nanorobot down your throat to crawl through your system and eat the plaque itself, according to frog interaction designer Tingyu Chen and solutions architect Jona Moore.

"All the while, it will inform personalized, targeted, intelligent advice to help you get healthier," they wrote of these nanorobots. "Trained to detect and treat different medical issues, edible health robots will also travel through the bloodstream to deliver important nutrients."

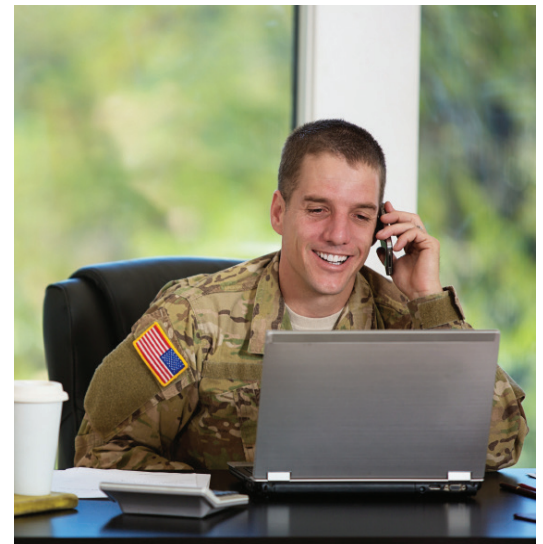
