Say your small business is Minority and Women's Business Enterprise-certified. What next? Start registering and bidding for contracts is your best bet, and there's plenty to choose from

Matt Thursam, manager of supplier diversity at The Walt Disney Co., said the global theme park and entertainment company buys everything from broadcasting services to shoe repair.

"How do you think the shoe repair business is doing?" Thursam said. "Think of all those Mickey and Donald characters you see in the park. Think to the tune of a half-million to \$800,000 a year in shoe repair. There's some great opportunity out there."

Or, as Thursam points out, local minority businesses do not have to settle for low-paying contracts, but can land bigger, better-paying ones if they play their cards right.

Just ask Errick Young, manager for Orange County Government's business development division. He will enthusiastically tell you how to take your business from gathering \$30,000 contracts to \$500,000.

"I don't know if anyone has talked about piggybacking or not, but if you are successful in winning a contract, especially when it comes to supply, like batteries, you have the right to take the contract to every public entity and say, 'Hey, I just won this contract with Orange County for the next three years. Are you interested in me handling your batteries for the next three years?' Every public entity has the right to say yes."

Young said it's all about building relationships in order to grow.

"The sky's the limit if you're willing to grow your business along the way. You're being evaluated all the time. And remember, people like doing business with people they know," Young said.
