Funding From Multiple Sources Will Boost Campus Construction in 2019

Growth and change are descriptors common to colleges and universities throughout the country. That's where the focus is...but managing the two is almost impossible without an abundance of human effort and financial investment.

It would be hard to find individuals anywhere who disagree with the importance of higher education, but public funding has not kept up with campus and teaching needs. University executives scramble every year to cobble together revenue from dozens of sources and that will obviously continue in 2019.

The largest growth in higher education spending for the past fiscal year was in California, where the state authorized a 12% increase. The state of Florida invested in higher education with a 9% increase in funding. North Carolina and Illinois both recorded 6% increases and Georgia rounded out the top five states with a spending increase of 5.5%, according to a recent Illinois State University study. As campuses experience record growth, the need for more resources and facilities increases. Facilities for housing and teaching students are big-ticket items and almost every campus has a decade of deferred maintenance that must be addressed. Technology upgrades are also high on the list of priorities for all schools. There will be high demand in 2019 for construction firms, developers, and technology providers that serve colleges and universities.

North Carolina Central University has announced a variety of projects. Officials hope to break ground on three new residential buildings, a \$38 million business school, and a \$47 million student center. Officials will not rely solely on state funding. The 8,200 member student body approved an increase in student fees that will also generate revenue. A new business school will be paid for largely with proceeds from bonds and three new residential facilities will be built through a publicprivate partnership (P3).

Universities are embracing P3 engagements because funding is a critical component. Additionally, with P3 engagements, private sector partners bring new ideas, development expertise, and are willing to assume most of the risk.

The revenue investment in P3 engagements on college and university campuses has more than doubled in recent years. In fact, there has been almost a 50 percent year-to-year increase from \$1.2 billion in 2014 to \$3.1 billion in 2016, according to an Ernst and Young report. That same report also projects that P3 projects will likely total \$5 billion in the near future.

Officials at Appalachian State University announced recently that seven residence facilities will be replaced through P3 engagements. The \$191 million project, which will include development and financing, will add 2,100 beds, a large new parking deck, and improvements to other existing surface parking spaces. Along with private funds, current university bond funds will also be used to finance the project.

Last month, the University of North Carolina Wilmington structured a P3 agreement for a project to develop an on-campus housing and dining community. The first phase will deliver 1,038 beds and another 776 beds will be added in the second phase. In addition to the new residential areas, a 3,500-square-foot dining facility and a

If you decide to go down the franchise business opportunity path, one of the business artifacts you'll become familiar with is the Franchise Disclosure Document.

Known in franchise circles as the FDD, franchisors generally send this lengthy, but important 300-page legal document to you within the first couple weeks of your introduction to the franchise concept.

Note: The Federal Trade CommissionDownload Adobe Reader to read this link content (FTC) states that "franchisors must furnish prospective franchisees with a disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before the prospective franchisee signs a binding agreement with, or makes any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale."

Construction careers: Earning a degree vs. completing an apprenticeship

With the skilled labor shortage, it's never been a better (or more lucrative) time to take up a trade. Many people exploring a career in construction now find themselves conflicted between earning a college degree or entering an apprenticeship. Engineers, architects, estimators, and project managers often require a four-year degree or beyond, but completing an apprenticeship program is a recognized achievement — one that can open the door to many possibilities and sometimes even a higher earning potential.

So how do you know whether to invest in a degree or enter directly into an apprenticeship program? Take this individual who posted on Reddit under the thread, "Dilemma with my future in construction."

"I am currently going to Iowa State for construction engineering, but any possible careers that come from it (CMs, PMs, safety, designers, etc.) don't seem to hold the same energy for me [as trade work]. Something tells me I'll be bored with my current direction as opposed to actually doing the work. So I guess I'm asking for some advice given my thoughts above from both sides."

Here is some of the top advice that was given, plus some crucial elements to consider when choosing the right path for you.

Differing stress levels

The top-voted comment in the thread was from u/moveshake, an assistant super for a general con-tractor.

"Something worth thinking about is how much stress you want in your life. Managing a job means you have a constant running to-do list in your head at all times.

The apprentices and journeymen on my job site never seem stressed out. There's a sense that they're there to do what their foreman told them to do and do it really well. If something unexpected comes up with my plumber, they're thinking about how to handle the issue. I'm thinking about how to fix the plumbing issue, how this is going to push out my date for closing ceilings, if I can make this delay up by getting more carpenters, or will I need to pay my painter OT down the line and if so, is there anyone to back-charge so I don't have to eat the cost?"

Because these roles involve more high-level responsibility than individual trades, it makes sense that the position would come with a significant amount of stress. This sentiment was echoed by u/ wyonutrition, who works in construction management for a GC.

"If you cannot handle stress, then do not go into CM. It may not ALWAYS be stressful, but at times it will be, and if you can't handle it or balance your life, you will fall on your face...every time."

The physical toll of labor

While discussion participants agreed that construction management typically means higher stress levels, they also noted the physical toll onsite laborers must face. The hands-on work of an onsite laborer is often grueling and has a reputation for having a lasting impact on workers' wellbeing. As u/moveshake noted, "When I've spoken with the tradesmen on site, they point out that after 20 years, doing labor is really hard on your body. A lot of the guys love what they do, but at age 50, they're starting to throw out their backs, and they are wondering if there are opportunities to do something lighter on their body. In contrast, I spend all day on my feet walking the job, but my body is never sore at the end of the day."

However, many users argued that the physical toll of trade labor can actually be mitigated by good posture and other preventative measures. u/ Prongu argued,

"Everyone older I know in labor is fitter and healthier than their white collar peers. Sure, they complain about the toll on their body, but posture and flexibility are bigger factors in how you'll feel than 'how much labor you do,' if that makes sense."

Proximity to the work

Something else to consider when choosing a path in construction is how much time you want to spend in an office versus on the job site. While earning a degree in a field like construction management will involve some level of onsite experience, a trade apprenticeship is all about gaining practical onsite experience. Similarly, the career options for someone who earns their degree will likely involve some (if not a significant amount of) office time.

For those who enjoy both, u/wjw21 recommended getting a degree but working for a subcontractor rather than a general contractor.

"In the subcontractor management world, you are closer to the work. In our trailer, you know you are on a construction site, which is what I think you are looking for. It is a more informal, playful atmosphere, but you still need to know when to be serious and get your work done."

However, it's important to remember both sides: while working for a subcontractor may get you closer to the field, general contractors often have a reputation for offering higher salaries and more opportunities for growth. This isn't always the case, but carefully consider all of your options to find the best fit for your goals.

You aren't confined to a single path

If you do choose to enter an apprenticeship and decide later that you're interested in construction management, you aren't stuck. As u/wyonutrition said,

"Here's the thing — there are a decent number of laborers and carpenters who wind up as GCs down the road. If I were you, I'd finish school, join the trades, and see what happens next.

learning center are planned.

Many other projects on higher education campuses are waiting to be announced. Here's a sampling of what is currently under consideration:

- The University of Houston has requested \$60 million from the state for a new law center. With funding, university officials will construct a five-story facility to replace a building that suffered major water damage from flooding. The new facility will include modern technology, a law library, classrooms, a courtroom, and event space.
- The University of Illinois at Chicago master plan includes more than a dozen new buildings. Four projects could begin within the next 18 months. Plans include an entertainment district, a new soccer stadium, and a new livinglearning center for freshmen students.
- . Athletics-related projects totaling \$11 million will be out for bid at Auburn University beginning this month. Solicitations will include a \$3 million Auburn Arena locker room

project, a \$4 million construction project for a 10,000-square-foot facility at the softball complex, and a \$4 million improvement project that includes a building with indoor batting cages.

- Officials at Montana State University have requested \$32 million in bonds to renovate Romney Hall. The project would expand the historic building that has four classrooms into a facility with 19 classrooms.
- The University of Texas of the Permian Basin has requested state funding for its critical need to update technology systems at its very old Mesa Building.

Expect lots of activity in 2019 on university campuses. Funding will be found from a multitude of sources to meet the challenges caused by growth and the ever-changing demands of technology and education.

chisors also must furnish a disclosure document to a prospective franchisee earlier in the sales process than 14 calendar days before the franchisee signs or pays."

What this means is that you, as a prospective franchise owner, have the right to receive the FDD 14 days before signing an agreement, or when it becomes apparent that you've taken steps to show that you're interested in the offering.

The Disclosure Items

There are 22 items (plus a receipt you'll sign stating you've received the FDD) that are included in every FDD.

That said, the purpose of this post is not to go through every item, one-by-one. You can do that with a franchise attorney.

Instead, I'm going to focus on the three most important items contained in the FDD.

3 Important Items Included in the FDD

1. Estimated Initial Investment

Obviously, you'll need to know what your total upfront investment will be. This section of the FDD breaks the needed investment range* down.

*Because of variables like commercial space, leasehold improvements, and local advertising costs, you'll be shown an investment "range."

For example, under "leasehold improvements," the FDD may show a range of \$150,000 - \$300,000.

That's because it may cost closer to \$300,000 to build out a store near Los Angeles, as opposed to building out a store in the Des Moines, Iowa area, which may cost significantly less.

In any event, make sure you look over this section of the FDD closely, so you understand how much capital you'll have to have to start and open your franchise business.

2. Franchisee's Obligations

It's important to know that you have certain obligations when you're a franchisee. And they're all spelled out in the FDD. A few of them include:

- Compliance with standards and policies/ Operating Manual
- Restrictions on products/services offered
- Insurance
- Records and reports

And more.

Your franchise agreement (contract) will contain the specific requirements for each obligation listed in the FDD.

Tip: make sure you know what all of your obligations are before you move forward on a franchise you want to own.

3. Outlets and Franchisee Information

This is one of the most valuable sections of the FDD.

That's because it contains current contact information for every franchisee in the system. Here's what that information will look like:

The reason why this part of the FDD is so incredibly valuable, is that you now have people you can call-and maybe even visit, who have already invested their own money in the franchise business you may buy. These are the people to reach out to with questions.

In conclusion, the Franchise Disclosure Document is something you'll need to become familiar with as you investigate various franchise opportunities.

If you become serious about one of the franchise opportunities you've been researching, hire a competent franchise lawyer to go through it with you. That way you'll understand what your obligations are going to be if you become a franchisee.
