In 2009, Louis Jacobson ranked the states with the worst leadership and policy challenges. Almost a decade later, what's changed?

Think back to the first half of 2009. If you were following state governments -- or were part of one -- the situation was grim. It wasn't just the fiscal squeeze brought about by the Great Recession, but that the fact that political leaders in a number of states weren't up to the challenge -pushing some states into a generalized state of dysfunction.

Now, thanks to improved state finances and a spate of new governors, the situation has changed for the better.

"The states generally are much better off than 2009," says David Adkins, CEO of the Council of State Governments. "The biggest flops today look pretty good when compared to the worst of 2009."

To illustrate, let's look at an article I wrote for the National Journal in the summer of 2009 in which I ranked the six most dysfunctional state governments in the country.

When I assembled that list, I ranked the states based on four factors: the quality of leadership by the state's legislature, its current governor and, where applicable, its former governor; the whiff of criminality in the state's top political leadership; the severity of the state's policy challenges; and the intensity of the media circus surrounding state government.

Based on that criteria, I concluded that the most dysfunctional states were, in descending order, New York, Nevada, Illinois, Alaska, South Carolina and California.

To fully understand the nature of these states' governments at the time, it's worth remembering who was in charge back then.

In New York, the governor was David Paterson, who, weakened by a flurry of ethics investigations, decided against running for a full term after notables in his own party -- including U.S. Senator Kirsten Gillibrand, who he'd personally appointed -- called for his resignation. And New York's state Senate was so riven by partisan factionalism that it could barely perform the most basic operations.

As the New York Times described one Senate session back then, "The two sides, like feuding junior high schoolers refusing to acknowledge each other, began holding separate legislative sessions at the same time. ... There were two Senate presidents, two gavels, two sets of bills being voted on."

Meanwhile, in Nevada, Gov. Jim Gibbons was discovered to have sent more than 800 texts using a state phone to a woman who was not his wife. That, however, was just the highest-profile of his ethical problems. Gibbons, among other things, faced a civil suit claiming he assaulted and kidnapped a woman, and was found to have plagiarized a speech from an Arkansas state official.

In Illinois, the legislature had only recently impeached and removed its governor, Rod Blagojevich, for abuse of power. He would become the second consecutive Illinois governor to go to prison.

In Alaska, Gov. Sarah Palin was finishing her abbreviated tenure, leaving office amid a spate of ethics complaints that left her with at least \$500,000 in legal bills. She had attracted an intense national media circus that followed her bid as U.S. Sen.



High-Speed Rail Costs Jump \$2.8B to \$10.6B

In what's being described as a "worst-case scenario," the cost of California's high-speed rail project through the Central Valley has surged by \$2.8 billion, bringing the total cost to an estimated \$10.6 billion, for the 119-mile section between Madera and Bakersfield.

That's up from the original estimate of \$6 billion. The LA Times and Fresno Bee report a slew of delays in the project, coupled with higher-than-anticipated costs, are to blame. The updated cost estimate underscores criticism from opponents of the project, who have long raised concerns that state officials underestimated the costs and oversold the benefits.

And, it raises questions about how the state will complete the project, considered the largest public infrastructure investment in the country, with existing funds.

Roy Hill, who helms the project team at the lead consulting firm for the California High Speed Rail Authority, WSP, presented the new estimate to the authority Tuesday. Hill told the board higher-than-anticipated costs for land acquisition and related delays added about \$725 million to the cost increase.

Another \$325 million was added to the total to account for construction delays. Safety barriers where the bullet train will operate near freight lines will cost an extra \$450 million, and mitiga-

tion measures to satisfy concerns from communities along the route will contributed \$250 million. Then there is the need to relocate wires, pipes and cables used by utility companies, which is expected to add \$350 million, among other costs.

"The worst-case scenario has happened," Hill told the authority's board at its monthly meeting on Tuesday, the Times reported.

At the same meeting, the board voted to hire Brian Kelly, the secretary of the California Transportation Agency, as the authority's new chief executive. His appointment fills a vacancy by Jeff Morales, who left the authority in June. Kelly will earn a salary of \$384,984.

Paint Companies Could Bill Taxpayers for Lead Paint Cleanup Under Proposed Measure

A proposed November statewide ballot measure could allow three of the nation's biggest paint companies to hand California taxpayers a bill for the cost of cleaning up health hazards caused by lead paint.

The measure would place a \$2-billion bond on the November ballot to fund the remediation of lead paint, mold, asbestos and other environmental dangers in homes, schools and senior citizen facilities. The initiative also would reverse a November state appeals court decision requiring three paint companies -- ConAgra, NL Industries and Sherwin-Williams -- to shell out hundreds of millions of dollars for lead paint abatement. It also aims to block future lawsuits against the paint companies for similar claims.

Initiative proponents contend that the bond measure, which they're calling the Healthy Homes and Schools Act, allows for a more wide-ranging solution to lead paint problems than a potential legal judgment. The bond would finance the cleanup of other environmental threats in addition to lead paint and would apply across the state instead of only in jurisdictions that filed suit against the companies.

" The Healthy Homes and Schools Act is a holistic and comprehensive approach to cleaning up existing homes in California by creating a statewide solution to address a variety of hazards in homes, such as mold, lead, asbestos, pests and other threats," said a statement from Tiffany Moffatt, a spokeswoman for the bond campaign. "Essentially, the initiative provides rehabilitation for old housing -- providing a broader public benefit for all Californians versus cherry-picking winners and losers."

Last week, ConAgra, NL Industries and Sherwin-Williams donated a combined \$6 million to a campaign supporting the bond measure, indicating the companies were gearing up for a signature-gathering effort to qualify the initiative. That amount would likely be more than enough for supporters to collect the 365,880 valid voter signatures needed to secure a place on the fall ballot.

The bond proposal has angered those who have fought the companies in court for the last 18 years. The three companies, not the general public, should pay to clean up affected homes, said Greta Hansen, chief assistant county counsel in Santa Clara County.

"It's unfortunate that they're seeking to shift the burden for their unlawful activities to the taxpayers of the state of California," Hansen said.

The dispute over who's responsible for cleaning up lead paint dates back to a lawsuit filed in 2000 by Santa Clara and Los Angeles counties and eight other local governments across the state. The cities and counties argued that lead paint was a public nuisance and that the paint companies promoted its use even after they knew the material could cause negative health effects, especially in children. Lead paint became illegal to use in homes in 1978.

The November appeals court decision largely upheld a lower-court ruling requiring ConAgra , NL Industries and Sherwin-Williams to set up a fund for discovering and cleaning up lead paint problems in the communities that filed the lawsuit. The three companies have since asked the California Supreme Court to review the case. Shortly after the November court decision, the proposed \$2-billion bond was filed with the state attorney general.

The bond measure includes language declaring that lead paint is not a public nuisance, a declaration that would apply to active court cases, including the suit filed by Santa Clara County and the other cities and counties.

"It seems to me that this is designed to erase liability in that case and also potential liability in any future cases for them, and substitute taxpayer-funded bond measures to do the remediation that these companies would otherwise be responsible for," said Sean Hecht, a UCLA School of Law professor who has followed the litigation.

The state's nonpartisan Legislative Analyst's Office came to a similar conclusion in its analysis of the bond, saying the initiative could reverse the existing court decision, cause the loss of several hundred million dollars in company-funded lead paint remediation and prohibit other local governments from filing similar lawsuits in the future. The analysts estimated the bond would cost the state's day-to-day operating budget roughly \$110 million annually for the next 35 years to repay with interest.

The proposed ballot measure has also upset affordable housing activists. Last year, state law-makers agreed to put a \$4-billion bond on this November's ballot to fund low-income housing development and provide home loans for veterans. A second housing-related bond on the state-wide ballot could complicate its passage, activists say.

"This appears to be a cynical, brazen attempt by a few select corporations to get themselves off the hook at taxpayers' expense, and we remain focused on the Veterans and Affordable Housing Bond that will actually bring safe, affordable homes to California families, seniors and veterans," said Ray Pearl, executive director of the California Housing Consortium, in a statement.

Private industries benefiting from the public initiative process is not uncommon in California politics. In 2008, billionaire Texas oilman T. Boone Pickens pitched a failed initiative that would have provided billions in state subsidies for consumers to purchase natural gas vehicles fueled by companies Pickens owned.

But Thad Kousser, a political science professor at UC San Diego, said he couldn't recall any companies sponsoring an initiative that would get them out of paying a legal judgment.

"There's nothing that comes to mind that says, 'Government stuck us with the tab for something, and we're going to make someone else pay for it instead,' " Kousser said. "That's the gutsiest element of this initiative."

The paint industry has been a major player in statehouses across the country. In 2011 and 2012, Harold Simmons , then owner of NL Industries , donated a total of \$750,000 to a political organization supporting Wisconsin Gov. Scott Walker and state GOP lawmakers, according to leaked court documents published by the Guardian. Soon after the donations and amid intense lobbying from paint manufacturers, Wisconsin passed legislation to shield the companies from liability in lead paint lawsuits.

The 6 Most **Dysfunctional States** Then and Now

John McCain's lightning rod of a running mate in his 2008 presidential bid.

In South Carolina, Gov. Mark Sanford had recently made "hiking the Appalachian Trail" a euphemism for marital infidelity, setting off his own media

And in California, Republican Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger and the Democratic legislature were at loggerheads, unable to reach agreement on basic necessities such the state budget, even as unemployment in the state was soaring.

So how are these six states doing today? Based on interviews with local political observers and national experts on state government, there are two bits of good news to report.

First, it would be hard, if not impossible, to assemble a list of states as dysfunctional as these six were. A big reason for that is a vastly improved economy. While some resource-dependent states are worse off today then they were in 2009, the vast majority have made great economic and budgetary strides since the Great Recession.

"Money helps lubricate governing," Adkins says. "Decisions get easier when there is new money."

South Carolina offers a good example. State revenues fell between 2006-2007 and 2009-2010, but since then they've risen in each of the last seven years -- and the amount collected was 43 percent higher in 2016-2017 than it was in 2009-2010. That's a big boost. Jack Bass, an emeritus professor at the College of Charleston, credits the growth largely to manufacturers. "[They're] expanding, with a new Volvo plant nearing completion and Boeing expanding."

Second, the leadership situation in these six states is better today than it was in 2009.

In New York, key members of the legislative leadership may have faced criminal prosecutions, but the state has exchanged Paterson (and his disgraced predecessor, Eliot Spitzer) for a more effective governor.

"Love him or hate him, Andrew Cuomo has been a strong leader, and it has shown with everything from on-time budgets to on-time public works and a general sense that someone is really in charge," says Lawrence Levy, the executive dean at the National Center for Suburban Studies at Hofstra Uni-
