Steel and aluminum tariffs remain a hot topic in the construction industry, even as the Trump administration delays them until June 1 for Canada, Mexico and the European Union. Permanent exemptions were granted for Argentina, Australia and Brazil.

Amid the uncertainty, the industry is seeking stability, says Charlie J. Carter, president of the American Institute of Steel Construction.

"The structural steel industry is looking for two things as the steel import policy develops," he says. "Policy that protects American fabricators from even more unfair competition by non-U.S. fabricators [and] clear rules that make us all able to budget projects with certainty." He adds that the extensions and the country exemptions "seem to work against such clarity."

Developers agree; many are taking the looming tariffs into consideration as they plan current and future projects.

"All of our structural steel for this project has already been purchased," says Ryan Moss, on-site project director for McCarthy Cos., on a \$280-million campus transformation of Washington University in St. Louis. "All of our specialty steel, particularly the stainless steel, is something we're going to have to have a long conversation with our suppliers about in June or if the tariffs go into effect at a later date."

Richard Wood, CEO of Plaza Construction, adds that "what was once a simple cost-benefit analysis is becoming a more difficult analysis." He notes that with existing project budget pressures, "every time perceived additional costs or uncertainty is tacked on, go/no go decisions become even more difficult."

While he is "pleased" by the Trump delay, Alex Carrick, chief economist of industry market forecaster ConstructConnect, wonders about the eventual outcome.

"Tariffs when threatened and imposed are sources of uncertainty and cost increases," he says. "The unemployment rate has just dropped to 3.9%, its lowest level in almost two decades. The economy is moving forward like gangbusters. Why toy with a good thing?"

Mayor Garcetti breaks ground on key L.A. River revitalization project

On the first day of National Infrastructure Week, Mayor Eric Garcetti broke ground on the new North Atwater Multimodal Bridge to connect Atwater Village on the river's eastern bank to the L.A. River Bike Path on its western bank. The new bridge achieves goals set in the L.A. River Revitalization Master Plan — a blueprint for the 32 miles of the river in the City of Los Angeles to restore its ecosystem, expand parks and paths along it, and inject new life into the neighborhoods and businesses around the river.

"The L.A. River is an extraordinary treasure with limitless potential for the communities that surround it," said Mayor Garcetti. "This bridge will give Angelenos better access to green space — creating a destination for people across Los Angeles to disconnect from city life and enjoy nature."

The project, which has an expected completion date of late 2019, was largely made possible by a \$4.75 million donation from Morton La Kretz.

"Together, we are writing a new chapter for Los Angeles and its River," Councilmember David Ryu said. "We are building toward a City with better park access, multi-modal movement, and more people out of their cars and enjoying the great outdoors of Los Angeles. The La Kretz bridge is connecting us to that future."

The new bridge will include two separate decks—one for pedestrians and cyclists and the other for equestrians, which includes the LAPD Mounted Unit located in nearby Atwater Village. The new equestrian overpass will provide a safe, year-round path across the river to access Griffith Park through the existing tunnel beneath the I-5 Freeway.

The bridge will feature an iconic design — the first steel cable-stayed bridge constructed in the City of Los Angeles.

"The North Atwater Bridge not only helps connect the surrounding communities to open spaces along the L.A. River, but it creates another way for Angelenos to enjoy and experience the river," said Gary Lee Moore, City Engineer. "The Bureau of Engineering is pleased to deliver another key project as part of the City's plan for L.A. River revitalization."

Mayor Garcetti has been a leader in the City's efforts to revitalize the Los Angeles River by transforming it from a concrete flood channel into a space for nature and recreation — creating miles of open space within our dense urban area. A large component of this revitalization is dedicated to building new bridges that connect communities to the river, such as the Sixth Street Viaduct replacement, which broke ground in February 2015, the Taylor Yard Bicycle and Pedestrian Bridge (breaking ground in late 2018), and the Red Car Pedestrian Bridge (breaking ground in April 2019).

EPA Announces Availability of Funding to Reduce Emissions from Diesel Engines Nationwide

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) announced the availability of grant funding to modernize the nation's diesel fleet by retrofitting or replacing vehicles with cleaner, more efficient diesel engines. EPA anticipates awarding approximately \$40 million in Diesel Emission Reduction Program (DERA) grant funding to eligible applicants, subject to the availability of funds

"These grants will incentivize improvements to aging diesel fleets and improve air quality throughout the country," said EPA Administrator Scott Pruitt. "EPA will continue to target funds to areas facing significant air quality issues."

"Steps to reduce emissions from older diesel trucks are some of the most cost-effective measures we can take to improve the air Americans breathe," said Rep. Ken Calvert (CA-42). "By prioritizing the DERA grant funding in regions that have some of our most complex air quality challenges, the resources being awarded can make a significant impact. I am pleased Congress was able to provide \$40 million for these grants and appreciate the efforts of everyone at EPA in making it a success."

Diesel-powered engines move approximately 90 percent of the nation's freight tonnage, and today nearly all highway freight trucks, locomotives, and commercial marine vessels are powered by diesel engines.

EPA is soliciting proposals nationwide for projects that significantly reduce diesel emissions and exposure, especially from fleets operating at goods movements facilities in areas designated as having poor air quality. Priority for funding will be given to projects that engage and benefit lo-

cal communities and applicants that demonstrate their ability to promote and continue efforts to reduce emissions after the project has ended.

Eligible applicants include regional, state, local or tribal agencies, or port authorities with jurisdiction over transportation or air quality. Nonprofit organizations may apply if they provide pollution reduction or educational services to diesel fleet owners or have, as their principal purpose, the promotion of transportation or air quality. All those eligible may apply until Tuesday, June 5, 2018.

Under this competition, EPA anticipates awarding between 20 and 80 assistance agreements. Applicants must request funding from the EPA regional office that covers their geographic project location. The maximum amount of federal funding that may be requested by an applicant varies by Region.

Region 1 (Connecticut, Massachusetts, Maine, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Vermont) will accept proposals requesting up to \$1,000,000 in grant funds.

Region 2 (New Jersey, New York, Puerto Rico, U.S. Virgin Islands) will accept proposals requesting up to \$2,000,000 in grant funds.

Region 3 (Delaware, District of Columbia, Maryland, Pennsylvania, Virginia, West Virginia) will accept proposals requesting up to \$2,500,000 in grant funds.

Region 4 (Alabama, Georgia, Florida, Kentucky, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee) will accept proposals requesting up to \$2,000,000 in grant funds.

Region 5 (Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Ohio, Wisconsin) will accept proposals requesting up to \$3,000,000 in grant funds.
