Ins & Outs of the OSHA Whistleblower Program

It takes a brave individual to seek justice for the wrongs conducted on a worksite. Workers typically become whistleblowers after suffering retaliation from an employer that did not take favorably to being approached about an issue.

In the construction industry, whistleblowing is usually a result of the following wrongdoings as a result of a project:

- Asbestos in school sites
- Excessive air or water pollution as a result of work
- Improper disposal of solid, hazardous, or radioactive waste
- Any form of neglect of standards put in place by the Occupational Safety & Health Act (OSHA) – full list available here

So as to protect workers from the retaliation of employers, OSHA has set up the Whistleblower Protection Program. However, few know of its workings.

How to File a Complaint

Whistleblowers can file a complaint with OSHA if their employer has retaliated against their report of unethical/unlawful activity. While many workers are hesitant to do this for fear they will lose their jobs or be blacklisted in their industry, OSHA does offer protections against this.

Workers who have been retaliated against should file a complaint with OSHA as soon as possible. Based on the law that is violated, there may even be a deadline. Complaints must be filed within a certain number of days after the retaliation has occurred, and can be filed either orally or in writing.

An online complaint form is available, but workers can also call their local/regional OSHA office. Note that complaints cannot be filed anonymously, hence the riskiness many employees associate with the task. Once filed, the employer will be given a reasonable time to respond before an investigation takes place.

What to Expect During an Investigation

If OSHA determines that the complaint/allegation is serious enough to warrant an investigation, they will assign someone to the case. This individual will be a neutral party, hired to assess the facts and get each party's side of the story. All parties will be notified in advance of the impending investigation.

Once the investigation has commenced, both parties must provide each other with all submissions they have made to OSHA in regards to the complaint. Each party should also work to provide contact information for witnesses of the issue in question. The accused party will have an opportunity to provide a written defense against the allegations, but the complaint filer will have a chance to rebut these.

Complaint filers should note that whistleblower investigations can take time. While it's always possible that both parties will settle over the course of the investigation, complainants should prepare themselves. Furthermore, if OSHA does not complete its investigation between 180-

210 days, complainants can involve the federal district court.

Once the Investigation is Over

If a case is solved in favor of the complainant, OSHA will do its best to reward that individual under their protection program. Whistleblowers are usually entitled to anywhere between 15-30% of proceeds from a suit. Upon winning a suit, OSHA will do its best to remove that individual from any industry blacklists that prevent them from finding related work.

It is unfortunate that whistleblowers can be met with such widespread indignation within their field. This can make embarking on the process risky unless the individual is willing to seek different/unrelated work in the meantime.

Despite the price there is to pay for pointing out injustice, significant progress in health and safety has been made through whistleblower programs. In turn, workers that have been wrongfully terminated, cast aside for promotions, and had pay withheld (among other retaliatory actions) can typically rely on OSHA's protection program to make things right.

Construction employment rises from October 2017 to October 2018 in 44 states and D.C.; 36 States, D.C. Add construction jobs since September

Texas Has Biggest Annual Job Increase While New Jersey Continues Losses; Iowa, Florida and California Have Largest One-Month Gains as Mississippi and Louisiana Trail

Forty-four states and the District of Columbia added construction jobs between October 2017 and October 2018, while 36 states and D.C. added construction jobs between September and October, according to an analysis by the Associated General Contractors of America of Labor Department data released today. Association officials said that firms in most parts of the country are adding staff to keep pace with growing demand for construction, but cautioned that rising labor and materials costs could undermine future demand.

"Construction activity continues to expand at a steady clip, with employment growing by more than ten percent during the past year in five states and by more than five percent in another 18 states," said chief economist Ken Simonson. "As contractors pay more for labor and most of the materials they use to build, construction costs will climb, potentially dampening future demand for their services."

Texas added the most construction jobs during the past year (49,900 jobs, 6.9 percent). Other states adding a large number of new construction jobs for the past 12 months include Florida (43,400 jobs, 8.5 percent), California (30,000 jobs, 3.6 percent), Georgia (21,600 jobs, 11.6 percent), Arizona (18,000 jobs, 12.1 percent) and New York (15,600 jobs, 4.1 percent). Arizona added the highest percentage of new construction jobs during the past year, followed by Georgia, Nevada (11.4 percent, 9,500 jobs), Oregon (10.5 percent, 10,400 jobs), New Hampshire (10.3 percent, 2,800 jobs) and Florida. Construction employment reached a record high in five states: Massachusetts, New York, Oregon, Texas and Washington.

Six states shed construction jobs between October 2017 and 2018. The largest declines and steepest percentage losses occurred in New Jersey (-3,800 jobs, -2.5 percent), followed by South Carolina (-1,700 jobs, -1.7 percent), Oklahoma (-500 jobs, -0.6 percent), Hawaii (-300 jobs, -0.8 percent) and Mississippi (-300 jobs, -0.7 percent).

Construction employment rises from October 2017 to October 2018 in 44 states and D.C.; 36 States, D.C. Add construction jobs since September

tween September and October, Florida (3,000 jobs, 0.5 percent) and California (3,000 jobs, 0.4 percent) had the largest gains, followed by Arizona (2,500 jobs, 1.5 percent), Georgia (2,500 jobs, 1.2 percent), Washington (2,500 jobs, 1.2 percent) and New York (2,500 jobs, 0.6 percent). Iowa added the highest percentage of construction jobs for the month (2.0 percent, 1,600 jobs), followed by Wyoming (1.9 percent, 400 jobs) and Rhode Island (1.6 percent, 300 jobs).

From September to October, construction employment declined in 12 states and was unchanged in Connecticut and Maine. Louisiana lost the most construction jobs (-1,900 jobs, -1.3 percent), followed by Oklahoma (-900 jobs, -1.2 percent) and Michigan (-900 jobs, -0.5 percent). Mississippi lost the highest percentage of construction jobs in October (-1.6 percent, -700 jobs), followed by Montana (-1.4 percent, -400

jobs), Louisiana and Oklahoma.

Association officials said widespread construction employment gains are a sign of strong demand for construction services in most parts of the country. But they cautioned that without new investments in career and technical education, immigration reform and swift resolution of trade disputes, labor and materials costs will continue to climb.

"Firms in many parts of the country are hiring as fast as they can find qualified workers to bring onboard just to keep pace with demand," said Stephen E. Sandherr, the association's chief executive officer. "But at some point, the increasing costs of labor and construction materials are going to drive construction prices to the point where many customers reschedule or rethink their projects."
