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Construction Suffers Project Cancellations, Employment Declines as Pandemic Pain Continues

Construction firms are experiencing widespread project deferrals and cancellations, along with disruptions to ongoing work and few new project awards, as the economic damage from the pandemic drags down industry employment in metro areas across the nation, according to a new survey and an analysis of new government data released by the Associated General Contractors of America (AGC). Association officials urged Congress to pass new coronavirus relief measures to head off further job losses.

"The survey results make it clear that the monthslong pandemic is undermining demand for projects, disrupting vital supply chains and clouding the industry's outlook," said Ken Simonson, AGC chief economist. "Without new federal relief measures, these challenges pose a significant threat to current construction employment levels."

Simonson noted that three-quarters of survey respondents report having a scheduled project postponed or canceled. He added that is up from the 60% of contractors who reported a canceled project in our August survey and 32% who did so in June. Meanwhile, only 23% of contractors report working on new or expanded construction projects as a result of the pandemic, about the same percentage as in June.

The coronavirus is also disrupting projects that are still underway, Simonson noted. According to the survey:

• 78% of respondents report they are currently experiencing project delays or disruptions, up from 57% in June

- 42% of firms are experiencing disruptions due to a shortage of construction materials, equipment or parts
- 35% are experiencing disruptions because of a shortage of craftworkers and/or subcontractors

In one bit of good news, however, only 7% of firms are experiencing disruptions because of a shortage of personal protective equipment.

Shrinking demand and disrupted operations are shaking many contractors' faith in the future, the survey showed. Thirty-four percent of respondents report they do not expect their firm's volume of business will return to pre-pandemic levels for at least a year.

Delays, disruptions and uncertainty threaten to undermine employment levels in the construction sector. In fact, 30% of firms report they have already furloughed or terminated employees because of the coronavirus. That is likely why construction employment fell during the past year in most metro areas, Simonson added.

Construction employment fell in 234, or 65%, of 358 metro areas between September 2019 and September 2020. Construction employment was stagnant in 38 other metro areas, meanwhile, and only 86 metro areas added construction jobs during the past year.

- Houston-The Woodlands-Sugar Land, TX, lost the most construction jobs over those 12 months (-24,400 jobs, -10%), followed by New York City (-19,500 jobs, -12%)
- Brockton-Bridgewater-Easton, MA, had the largest percentage decline (-36%, -2,000 jobs), followed by Altoona, PA (-32%, -1,000

jobs), and Johnstown, PA (-32%, -900 jobs).

- Dallas-Plano-Irving, TX, added the most construction jobs from September 2019 to September 2020 (5,100 jobs, 3%), followed by Baltimore-Columbia-Towson, MD (4,700 jobs, 6%).
- Walla Walla, WA, had the highest percentage increase (25%, 300 jobs), followed by Fond du Lac, WI (15%, 500 jobs).

Simonson added that a majority of firms report they plan to cut jobs or abstain from adding new employees during the coming year. Twenty percent expect their headcount will shrink while 42% report they do not plan to add to the size of their headcount during the next 12 months.

Most firms participating in the survey (78%) cited a preference for new federal relief measures to mitigate against the impacts of the coronavirus. Among the measures firms are hoping Washington officials will enact are new federal investments in infrastructure, liability reforms that protect responsible firms from frivolous coronavirus suits and a new highway and transportation bill.

As a result, association officials urged Congressional leaders to recall legislators right after the election to pass much-needed new coronavirus relief measures. In particular, the construction officials called on Congress to enact new infrastructure investments, liability reforms and an additional round of Paycheck Protection Program loans.

"As our survey shows, the pandemic and efforts to mitigate its spread have deeply wounded the economy, depressing demand for many types of commercial construction projects," said Stephen E. Sandherr, AGC's CEO. "Congress can end the downward economic slide and help create needed new construction jobs by passing measures to boost demand and protect honest employers."

Kayleen's story: From building fences to building a successful career in construction—and helping others do the same

A Famous Face

If you've ever watched the DIY Network on television, Kayleen McCabe's is a face you may recognize.

She is the host and star of "Rescue Renovation," a show that helps homeowners who are in over their heads. Renovation projects turn from disastrous "befores" into jaw-dropping "afters."

When Kayleen is not in front of the camera, she's traveling the country telling students the story of how her long-time construction hobby turned into a successful career.

Growing up different

"As a little girl, I was always building stuff with my hands," Kayleen says.

"My dad was a welder by trade, so I learned a lot of what I know from him."

"We did repairs around the house, built fences, and worked on cars together."

"I didn't realize how unique that was until high school," Kayleen says.

Kayleen says most of her classmates had no idea what they wanted to do after graduation.

Kayleen was different.

"I knew, even then, that I wanted to work in the construction trades," she says.

Trusting her instincts

Although knew she wanted a career in construction, Kayleen didn't enroll in trade school after high school.

"I made good grades," she says, "and I felt pressure to do what the other 'good students' did: go to college."

One year and two schools (Red Rocks Community College and Colorado State University) later, Kayleen called her parents with some news that ultimately wasn't a surprise to them: college wasn't for her.

"I could've saved a lot of tuition money by following that instinct earlier," Kayleen says.

"I am so grateful that when I eventually did, my parents were supportive."

The first foray into television

Shortly after graduating from high school, Kayleen says, her cousin called her with a proposition.

"She was a producer on the TV show 'Trading Spaces.""

"She knew I liked working with my hands, and she said she could help me get a production assistant job."

From her very first day on the set, Kayleen says she was hooked.

"I would bounce of out of bed at 5 am, vibrating with excitement about whatever we got to build next."

"It was the first time I fell in love."

The mentor of all mentors

On the set of "Trading Spaces," Kayleen met a master craftsman named Frank.

"He was this grumpy-looking older guy with a big bushy mustache that was permanently stained from tobacco," Kayleen says.

"But he taught me more than I could ever explain."

"I could ask him anything, and he encouraged me to learn, to try, and most importantly, to fail," Kayleen says.

"Being in an environment where I felt so safe to do that was the best gift I ever received."

"Learning the way that I did—on the job—was more of an education than I could ever have gotten from going to college."

"Rescue Renovation"

"Rescue Renovation" is currently in its fifth season on TV.

Kayleen says she is immensely grateful for her continued success—especially in a field that is traditionally dominated by men.

"When the show first started, I was one of the only female hosts on our channel—or any other one."

"It's different now, and I cannot wait for that to keep changing."

When she travels for her show, Kayleen says, she is often able to help drive that change.

"I like to leverage a plane ticket as much as possible."

"I'll find out what schools are close to the airport and call them up. I say, 'Hi, I'm a woman in the trades, can I come talk to your kids about career opportunities in my field?""

"To the best of my ability," Kayleen says, "I will continue to leverage what fame I've garnered to help recruit more and more young women into the construction trades."

Connecting with audiences on smaller screens, too

In her spare time, Kayleen produces short, instructional videos for her followers and fans. She hosts them on her personal web page.

Topics range from cabinet building, to clamps and fasteners, to drill skills.

"I want to get them into the hands of middle and high school teachers so they can show their kids what working in the trades is really like."

"Growing up, my teachers had nothing like that. In terms of recruitment, I think it could be gamechanging."

Something to strive for

Kayleen says she is constantly thinking about the future—for herself and for construction trades overall.

"I want to double the number of students I talk to every year ... until that becomes impossible."

Already this year, Kayleen has made incredible progress towards her goal. She has trips planned to Indiana, Ontario, Nebraska, Arizona, Kentucky, Nevada, Abu Dhabi, and Mississippi—all in the next few months.

"Someday, I hope I am able to travel full-time, speaking to students and giving them scholarships to study the trades."

"I want to be the Bill Gates of power tools," Kayleen says.

"And my passport has a lot of room in it."
