Green Line Extension Project Seeks DBEs

The 4.3 miles of extended light rail service in the Greater Boston area have been frequently under discussion and haltingly in the works for decades. Today, the \$2.3 billion Green Line Extension Project of the commonwealth's Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority (MBTA) is rolling forward toward its scheduled completion in December 2021 as the design-build project progresses into more visible aspects of construction work.

The Green Line Extension will expand light rail service from Cambridge through Somerville to Medford on the Green Line, which originates in downtown Boston. The busy Green Line retains tunnel sections from its opening days in 1897 and is recognized as America's oldest subway system.

GLX Constructors is the joint venture selected in late 2017 to execute the project. The primary partners in the joint venture are Fluor Enterprises, Inc. (Fluor), The Middlesex Corporation (Middlesex), Herzog Contracting Corp. (Herzog), and Balfour Beatty Infrastructure, Inc. (Balfour Beatty), teaming with the lead designer, STV Incorporated (STV). They are actively seeking certified Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) subcontractors and suppliers to participate in the project. See their project advertisement below. 


