Federal Grants

As part of their quest for funding, the first choice for minority business owners is to seek out grants. The belief that there are federal grants available for the start up and growth phases for small businesses is

a myth. The federal government does not provide grants to businesses for start up, expansion, to cover operational expenses, or to pay off debts. However, there are federal grants available in the areas of research in the fields of medicine, scientific research, education, and technology development. Below are a few such grants.
