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Construction Management Success Stories So, what are they doing that you're not?

In your career as a construction manager, you're bound to hit a rut. You feel as though you've done everything you possibly can to maximize profitability—from

improving your bidding process to boosting efficiency through new construction management software—and you've reached a plateau. As a construction manager, you have to keep learning new ways to achieve success.

One of the biggest dangers small businesses

face is getting sucked into doing things the same way they've always done them. This leads to stagnation and even decline as your competitors find better ways of doing things and lure customers away.

From 2011 to 2017, the construction industry ranked ninth among all industries in terms of the number of firms that were considered "high growth;" 1,170 construction businesses met that definition, according to the Brookings Institution. There are a lot of companies that seem to have things figured out.

Take a deep breath, and get ready to step outside your comfort zone. That step is what separates the five percent of incredibly successful companies from the ninety-five percent that simply do what everyone else is doing. The trick to identifying the limitations of your comfort zone is getting outside of your own head

The problem: "My firm needs to find (and win) more projects."

1. Never run out of work
