As a small business owner, you know that being forced to close your doors, even for a day, is a costly setback. Typically, it's often the seemingly isolated incident, not the mega-disaster, that causes power outages and the interconnected fallout affecting your clients, employees, and your bottom line.

Between 2003 and 2012, roughly 679 power outages, each affecting at least 50,000 customers, occurred due to weather events, according to the U.S. Department of Energy. The number of outages caused by severe weather is expected to rise as climate change increases the frequency and intensity of hurricanes, blizzards, floods and other extreme weather events.

September is National Preparedness Month and the SBA wants to help business owners take charge of the well-being of their companies, the safety of their employees, and the health of their local economies by being prepared to rebound quickly from any kind of disaster.

#### Here are a few tips to get you started:

1. Establish your power needs: Have an electrician determine your power needs. Know what kind of back-up generator will work for you, but first

find out if you have the landlord's permission to bring in a generator.

2. Create a communications plan. Establish an e-mail alert system to keep your employees and key stakeholders in the loop. Use phone, texting and social media to provide updates on your recovery process and to let everyone know you're still in business.
3. Prepare your supply chain. Develop relationships with alternative vendors, in case your primary contractor isn't available. It's also a good idea to find out if your key suppliers have a recovery plan in place. Create a contact list for important business contractors and vendors you plan to use in an emergency.
4. Make sure you have enough insurance to recover. Contact your insurance agent to find out if your policy is adequate. Consider Business Interruption Insurance, which compensates you for lost income if you have to close your doors when disaster strikes.
5. Educate your employees. Your staff should be aware of your company's disaster plan, and understand their roles in implementing the plan. Find out if your employees have a family disaster preparedness plan. It's a good idea to put the preparedness plan on an internal company website, on a paper, and share it with your staff.

6. Test the plan. Doing annual drills with your staff will show you what's effective and where your preparedness plans need fine-tuning.

You can get help with your own disaster preparedness planning through a series of free webinars in September hosted by the U.S. Small Business Administration and Agility Recovery. The series is presented in collaboration with FEMA's Ready Campaign. The 2015 National Preparedness Month theme is "Don't Wait. Communicate. Make your emergency plan today".

The 30-minute webinars will be held at 2 p.m. EDT each Wednesday in September. Here's the schedule:

- September 16: "Recover from the Most Likely Disaster: Power Outage"
- September 23: "Protect Your Most Valuable Asset: Prepare Your Employees"

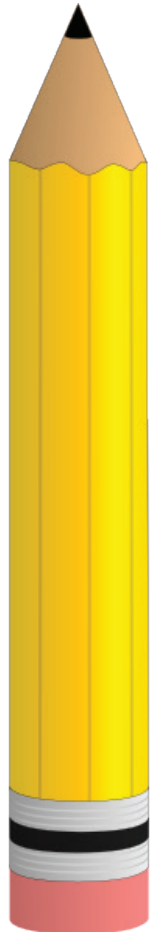

## Architect Deborah Berke to talk about Cummins, 21c hotel projects in Indy

Deborah Berke, the internationally renowned architect who designed a new divisional headquarters for Cummins Inc. in Downtown Indianapolis, will speak in town later this month about her work.

The event, sponsored by The American Institute of Architects' Indianapolis chapter, is meant to highlight how Berke's work connects with Indianapolis and is an example of functional design, said Jason Shelley, executive director of the institute.

"It's just another way to kind of raise the design bar for our community," he said. "It further emphasizes why design matters. Design matters for health reasons, economic development reasons and productivity reasons.

"The more we can promote it and raise the level, it benefits our entire community."

Berke, who is based in New York, also is revamping Indianapolis' old City Hall, which is slated to become part of a new 21c Museum Hotel. The hotel company seeks to incorporate contemporary art into everyday life.

The \$30 million Cummins project is one of many feathers in Berke's cap, Shelley said. Her design for Cummins' global distribution business headquarters connects the building with the nearby neighborhood.

"I like Indianapolis because I've been coming for a while and I know the city and Indiana. I see an emerging revitalization of Indianapolis, that having known the city for 20 years, I find very exciting," said Berke, who founded Deborah Berke Partners. "There are new restaurants, neighborhoods are being revitalized, people are walking around and riding the yellow bikes."

Cummins' divisional headquarters is on schedule to be finished by the end of 2016, said Jon Mills, a spokesman for the company.

The project includes a 10-story structure that emphasizes glass, sunlight and greenery, alongside a parking garage. The tower is being erected where Market Square Arena once sat. Cummins, whose worldwide headquarters is in Columbus, Ind., hired Berke to work on the global distribution business headquarters project with locally based RATIO Architects.

The development allows up to 30,000 square feet of retail space on the first floor of the building and parking garage. The American Institute of Architects Indianapolis said it is "one of the most notable works of architecture the city has seen in many years."

"We are excited to further contribute to the local economy and the community, including helping revitalize the Near Eastside of Indianapolis," Mills said.

"I'm going to be showing lots and lots of pictures," she said. "If people like looking at bright pictures of architecture they should definitely come." The overhaul of the old City Hall and the construction of the 21c Museum Hotel, which will be next door, is expected to cost \$55 million and to be finished by late 2017 or early 2018. It's still in the very early design stages, Berke said.
