# **SBA Introduces New Mobile Application for Small Business Owners, Entrepreneurs**



New SBA mobile application brings enhanced access to information and resources

Smart phone users interested in starting or growing a small business can now find helpful resources at their fingertips via a new SBA mobile application from the U.S. Small Business Administration.

"Increasingly, smart phones are the vehicle through which Americans access information. This is certainly true of many entrepreneurs and small business owners and this new application ensures they will have

#### access to SBA's resources and programs - literally at their fingertips," said SBA Administrator Karen G. Mills. "Greater mobility fits with the new userfocused SBA.gov launched recently, and is another example of the steps we are taking to do a better job of connecting entrepreneurs and small business owners with the tools to help them start or grow their businesses and create jobs.

Developed and donated as a gift by Palo Alto Software, Inc., the SBA mobile app will make the search for extensive resources more efficient, whether users are starting a new business or taking an existing business to a new level. The app will first be available for the Apple iPhone®, with future versions for other smart phone platforms.

"Palo Alto Software's mission is to help small businesses succeed. We've developed this mobile application for the SBA because we understand the

importance of having the right tools and resources when starting or growing a business," said Sabrina Parsons, CEO of Palo Alto Software. "Ideas can strike entrepreneurs at any moment, and having useful resources available through mobile devices could be the impetus that begins the next big company.

# Lucasey Manufacturing is SBA's Family-Owned Small Business of the Year

Oakland firm in the same family since 1954

An Oakland manufacturing plant that started in 1954 making television mounting systems has been named the Jeffrey Butland Family-Owned Small Business of the Year by SBA's San Francisco district office which covers 13 counties in Northern California. Lucasey Manufacturing Corporation was founded by Italian immigrant Joe Lucasey when he first made a television table in his Alameda garage.

An electronics technician by trade with connections to the television industry, Lucasey heard stories of hotels complaining about unsavory guests stealing the new entertainment medium and came up with the idea of a lock and mount system to prevent the theft of TVs. Since then, the company has been the leader in the TV mounting industry and has expanded its product line to wall, ceiling and pedestal mounts, audio-visual carts and truss display systems. In the past few years, Lucasey Manufacturing has also obtained federal contracts for custom-built airport screening tables.

Joe Lucasey died in 2008, with company ownership passed on to his wife, Teresa, and their children and grandchildren. When Teresa Lucasey died last year, company ownership and management was passed to Lucasey's two daughters and two grandsons. Today, Chuck Lucasey serves as chief executive officer, his mother Janet is vice president, and his brother Chris is head of sales. The company employs more than 50 machinists, welders, powder coaters, glass molders, technical writers, packers and administrative staff.

Though the Lucasey family had numerous opportunities to sell the company to buyers who would have moved operations overseas, the family declined. With an SBA governmentguaranteed \$2 million loan last year through Community Bank of the Bay, the company refinanced two high interest loans into one lowerinterest loan, allowing Lucasey Manufacturing to remain in Oakland for the foreseeable future

"No doubt about it, the loan played a key role in saving our business," said Chuck Lucasey. "And to bounce back a year later and win the SBA award is quite an honor. We're optimistic about sales growth and expect to remain in Oakland manufacturing reliable products for our customers."

The SBA honored Lucasey Manufacturing Corporation with an awards ceremony at company headquarters on May 26.

Oakland Mayor Jean Quan and Councilman Ignacio De La Fuente participated. Lucasey Manufacturing Corporation is located at 2744 E. 11th St., Oakland.

# **Tips for Working From Home**

#### Treat your work as a real job

Surely, one of the things that attract people to home-based jobs or businesses is the idea that they can get-up from bed and start making money in their pajamas. Well, forget it. If you want to earn a living from home, you have to stay sharp and be professional. You do not have to wear a tie and a suit, but at least maintain your hygiene and wear something comfortable. It is important that you "feel" like you are at work. If you feel like you are lounging then you will not be as focused on work.

If you have a room in your house that no one occupies, use that space as your office. Do not set up shop on your kitchen table or in your bedroom. Having your own dedicated space at home creates a more psychologically conducive environment for accomplishing work-related tasks. You need some segregation, a place where you can close the door when you have to. This is especially true if other people are in the house doing other things that might distract you.

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### Plagued with Poor Performance?: Seek Out the Hidden Causes

Poor employee performance is caused by many factors. It is not uncommon for a supervisor to blame poor performance on lack of motivation or on an initial error in hiring selection by the company. Without taking the time to identify the true causes of unacceptable work, the manager risks making a costly mistake. The simple way to solve the problem is to fire the employee and rehire. On the surface, this simple solution is actually very costly, often unfair, and a great drain on time, energy, and resources for the organization. Often performance problems are caused by poor management or inadequate systems, not bad employees. Consider the following nonperformance issues.

#### They Are Confused About What to Do

Very few people thrive in ambiguous situations. Employees who must guess what you wish them to do or are confused by unclear direction can feel as frustrated as the manager who is not getting back satisfactory work.

#### Try This

Create accurate job descriptions and update frequently. Supplementary charts and lists that explain the cycles of the work flow, i.e., certain tasks are daily, weekly, or monthly, are helpful particularly for new staff. Identify the specific behaviors you expect.

#### They Do Not Know Why They Should Do It

Many employees are unsure of the relevance of the work they do.

#### Try This

Explain the purpose of their position, and outline how it fits in with the goals of the organization. Be sure to demonstrate how their specific tasks interrelate with other departments.

# They Do Not Think You Will Check on Progress

This is often the case with a new manager taking over from another. If the past manager rarely checked that assignments were completed or suggestions carried out, employees learned to wait before doing new things. "If no one checks, does the work really need to be done?" Try This

Always assign due dates, and be sure to check on progress. No matter how busy you may be, the employee needs to know that assigned tasks are not frivolous, transitory or unimportant.

## They Believe Something Else is More Important

Priorities shift continually. Employees' priorities may be different from the managers'.

#### Try This

Set priorities on projects when they are assigned. A weekly review of their task lists is helpful. When your priorities shift, remember to relay that information so staff can make adjustments.

# They Believe They Are Doing What You Requested

Performance feedback is always important. If employees hear nothing, they are likely to believe that all is fine. This is an instance where a less than glowing review at evaluation time comes as such a shock.

#### Try This

Rather than waiting for formal review times for feedback, give employees performance information regularly.

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### Take Notice of Trends Before They Become Apparent

The adept marketer can normally anticipate forthcoming trends. It's simply a matter of interpreting the research and reading the tealeaves with studied interest. Everything from political positions to lifestyle issues are sliced and diced ad nauseam in order to divine consumer intent. But, sometimes a natural confluence of elements results in a trend that percolates quietly under the water line. Nobody pays much attention until the trend grows to tsunami strength.

One such instance is a growing desire on the part of the more discerning American consumer to regain the quality and taste of food as they used to be. One must freely acknowledge the dominance of fast food in the time-deprived environment in which most Americans live. It's cheap, quick, requires little thought in the ordering process and fills the belly with relative ease. It is to gastronomy what the Lethal Weapon movies are to the cinema.

But a countervailing force is at play, a stirring and a reaction to the Philistinism of fast food and bad taste. Why so? For one thing, there is growing concern about the safety and composition of the nation's food supply. Eric Schlossar, in his recent best-selling book, Fast Food Nation, aptly put his finger on the issues from unfit meat processing plants to cholesterol-clogging hamburgers to antibiotic-drenched meats and poultry. Tie that together with a growing fear of pesticides, and it becomes understandable that purer foods, like organic produce, are being scarfed up at an unheard of rate. Notice also, the growing interest in local food markets. And don't ignore a gnawing hunger on the part of many Americans to revisit the times when the basic commodities, a tomato, banana, apple or head of lettuce, actually bore an identifiable taste. Nowadays most of the food that hasn't been processed has been chilled, frozen, gassed or genetically altered to deliver the consistency of a bowling ball and a taste to match. Great for shipping but lousy on the taste buds.

#### Introducing Slow Food

It's a fast-growing international organization with 65,000 members in 50 countries and 5,000 scattered among 62 chapters in the US where membership has grown twenty times in the last three years alone, and most of it, incidentally, the quiet way through public relations and word-of-mouth. Like the early Christians hiding in the Catacombs, Slow Foodies find each other through mutual disenchantment with supermarket produce aisles and fast food strips. Chapters exist in every major market and the smaller ones too, from Chattanooga, Tennessee to Bozeman, Montana. One thing about the desire for good tast-ing food, unlike politics and religion, it always manages to transcend region, race and class. Slow Food USA professes not to be an elitist organization for the wine and cheese crowd, populated by pompous gourmands, insufferable food snobs and chefs to the affluent. Although the demographics skew upscale, membership is drawn equally from the ranks of the common people--students, farmers, and good middle-class stock, myself included.

Slow Food USA bills itself "as a nonprofit organization dedicated to supporting and celebrating the food traditions of North America. From the spice of Cajun cooking to the purity of the organic movement; from animal breeds and heirloom varieties of fruit and vegetables to handcrafted wine and beer, farmhouse cheeses and other artisanal products." The organization believes that many of these foods, relics of small farm America, are at growing risk of succumbing to the effects of the fast life which is evident in the industrialization and homogenization of the nation's food supply.

Local chapters carry out the mission with organized educational tastings, cooking courses, trips, visits to restaurants and lectures. Inspired by Noah's Ark, the organization's ArkUSA seeks to identify, promote and protect foods in danger of extinction, such as the Delaware Bay Oyster, the Bourbon Red Turkey first bred in Tennessee, Aged Dry Jack Cheese, and naturally grown, handparched wild rice from the lake regions of Minnesota and Wisconsin. Members are kept current with publications including Slow, a quarterly journal devoted to food culture around the world and Snail, a newsletter dealing specifically with the US marketplace.

Ironically, as Patricia Unterman notes in the San Francisco Chronicle, "Slow Food started years ago as a response to the arrival of the first McDonald's on the Spanish steps in Rome by Carlo Petrini, a northern Italian food journalist lamenting the erosion of civilized dining." Continues Unterman, "the growth of Slow Food is a cry against the indignities of modernization – the irresponsible use of technology, the homogenization and standardization of food and the abandonment of the dinner table."

According to spokesman Patrick Martins, Slow Food USA "is not a protest organization." Its mission, he states, is to "celebrate American food heritage and, in doing so, document and save the food

They Fear to Fall Short of Impossibly High Standards

Working for a perfectionist often erodes people's self-confidence and morale. When standards are too high, no amount of work or accomplishment is ever good enough. When staff are faced with this situation, high performers can actually begin to fail.

#### Try This

Identify the acceptable level of performance for specific tasks. Everything cannot be done perfectly. Time and resource limitations impact how often an internal memo can be rewritten for style versus substance.

#### They Think Their Way is Better

Some employees believe that their assignment is to reinvent their jobs. Try This

#### Be clear about expectations. Request that people work a couple of months using the existing systems. Then request input about procedures. Accept changes that are improvements, but when their idea will not work, sell them on yours.

#### They Get Rewarded for Not Doing It

Poor performers can often skate by because the manager only gives them easy assignments.

#### Try This

Hold all staff accountable to a work standard. When assigning difficult tasks, monitor progress more often.

Don't be surprised if it takes up arms against the mega-supermarket and the fast food chain.

#### **Small Business Administration**

This is some background on the SBA. FUNCTION: The program is to help competent owners secure funding. While they may not be eligible for financing by typical loaning means, they are also the SBA's most promising commercial loan platform, because business loans under these programs could constitute security for an assortment of ecumenical business enterprise aims. SBA Loans made could be applied to nearly any sensible business aims including working capital, machinery and equipment, pieces of furniture and fixtures, ground and construction (including purchase, refurbishment and fresh building), leasehold advances, and debt refinancing (under particular circumstances).
